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SUPPLEMENT

KENYA PROCLAMATIONS, RULES AND REGULATIONS (No 20)

Section 60 of the Principal Ordinance which it is proposed to amend —

Banker paying demand draft whereon indorsement is forged on a banker, and the banker on whom it is drawn pays the bill in good faith and in the ordinary course of business, it is not incumbent on the banker to show that the indorsement of the payee or any subsequent indorsement was made by or under the authority of the person whose indorsement it purports to be, and the banker is deemed to have paid the bill in due course, although such indorsement has been forged or made without authority

A Bill to Amend the Bills of Exchange Ordinance, 1927

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

This Ordinance may be cited as the Bills of Exchange Short title (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Bills of Exchange Ordinance, 1927, hereinafter referred to No 7 of 1927 as the Principal Ordinance

Section 60 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby Amendment of amended by renumbering the section as "60 (1)" and by adding Principal thereto the following new sub-section —

section 60 of the Ordinance

"(2) Any draft or order (other than a bill or a cheque) drawn upon a banker for a sum of money payable to order on demand which shall, when presented for payment, purport to be indorsed by the person to whom the same shall be drawn payable, shall be a sufficient authority to such banker to pay the amount of such draft or order to the bearer thereof, and it shall not be incumbent upon such banker to prove that such indorsement, or any subsequent indorsement, was made by or under the direction or authority of the person to whom the said draft or order was or is made payable either by the drawer or indorser thereof"

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to afford to bankers in the Colony the same protection in regard to drafts as is afforded to them in England by section 19 of the Stamp Act 1853

The proposed new sub-section (2) follows section 19 of the English Stamp Act, 1853, except that the words "other than a bill or cheque" have been inserted with a view to making it clear that section 60 (1) applies to cheques and bills while other drafts are covered by section 60 (2)

No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law


