A Bill to Amend the Public Holidays Ordinance

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the Colony of Kenya, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof, as follows —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Public Holidays (Amendment) Ordinance, 1938, and shall be read as one with the Public Holidays Ordinance (Chapter 30 of the Revised Edition), hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance

Short title

2 Section 2 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor —

Repeal and replacement of section 2 of the Principal Ordinance
Public holidays

“2 The several days in the Schedule to this Ordinance (which days are in this Ordinance referred to as public holidays) shall in every year be kept as public holidays by all public offices, all Government Departments and all banks in the Colony”

3 Section 3 of the Principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor —

Repeal and replacement of section 3 of the Principal Ordinance

“3 The Governor may at any time if he thinks fit, by proclamation, declare any day to be a public holiday in addition to the days mentioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance or in substitution for any of them and thereupon such day shall be a public holiday as if it were mentioned in the Schedule to this Ordinance”

Alteration or addition of public holiday

4 The Schedule to the Principal Ordinance is hereby amended—

Amendment of Schedule to the Principal Ordinance

(a) by deleting therefrom the words “The Anniversary of the Birthday of His Majesty” which occur in the fifth line thereof, and

(b) by adding immediately after the words “The First Monday in August” which occur in the sixth line thereof the words “King’s Day (the second Monday in October)”

OBJECTS AND REASONS

The object of this Bill is to give legislative effect in Kenya to the proposal that a public holiday should be held annually in Kenya, Tanganyika and Uganda on the second Monday in October, to be described as “King’s Day”, in substitution for the public holiday at present observed on the day of the official celebration of His Majesty’s Birthday

2 Opportunity has been taken to amend the Principal Ordinance in certain minor respects

3 No expenditure of public moneys will be involved if the provisions of this Bill become law

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR WATER RIGHT

IN terms of section 27 of the Water Ordinance, 1929, notice is hereby given that Messrs Kenya Tea Co., Ltd., of Kiambu, have filed an application, which was registered by the Water Board on 12th May, 1938, for a Water Sanction to divert from the Ruaraka River, at a point on L R No 152, 50 and 120,000 gallons per day (of which approximately 96,000 gallons per day will be returned to the Ruaraka River) for the purposes of domestic use and pulping and washing of coffee respectively, on L R Nos 152, 132/1 and 245.

The works consist of a canal 690 ft long.

A pre-existing Water Permit authorized the diversion of 50,000 gallons per day for domestic use and pulping and washing of coffee.
