- (3) The highest bidder will be declared the purchaser of the plot, but if any dispute arises as to any bid the plot will be re-offered at the last undisputed bid.
- (4) Each purchaser shall pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer 25 per cent of the amount of his bid. In default of such payment the plot may be immediately reoffered for sale and any subsequent bid by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.

(b) General

- 8. No assignment under lease or mortgage of the premises shall be permitted except with the prior approval in writing of the Commissioner of Lands first had and obtained.
- 9. The grantee will be required to pay the cost of construction of roads and drains to serve the plot, on demand therefor being made.
- 10. The grantee will be required to pay any rates which now are or may hereafter be imposed in respect of the premises including contribution by Government in lieu of rates assessed on the plot.
- 11. - 15. All outbuildings, offices, etc., shall be properly screened from view to the satisfaction of the Commissioner of Lands or such other person as he may appoint, and shall be kept so screened during the term of the lease.
- 16. Ample provision for car parking must be provided within the site to the satisfaction of the Township Authority.
- 17. No building may approach within a less distance than 25 feet of the boundary of the plot, buildings shall not exceed 25 per cent of the coverage of the site.
- 18. The grantee shall make adequate arrangements for the provision of housing for African staff in the employ of the hotel to the satisfaction of the Township Authority.
