1 TITLE

The Scheme shall be called the Apprenticeship Training Scheme for the Motor Engineering Trades, hereinafter referred to as the "Scheme", and shall come into operation on 1st October 1967

2 APPLICATION

The Scheme shall apply in respect of all apprentices in the Motor Engineering Trades

3 APPRENTICESHIP COMMITTEE

(i) An Apprenticeship Committee shall be established for the purpose of advising the Controller of Apprenticeship in the operation of the Scheme

(ii) The Committee shall be appointed by the Labour Commissioner after consultation with the Apprenticeship Board and shall be composed of three representatives of the Motor Trade and Allied Industries Employers' Association, of whom at least two shall be actively engaged in the trade, three representatives of the Kenya Motor Engineering and Allied Workers' Union of whom at least two shall hold a Trade Test Certificate in a relevant trade, one member nominated by the Ministry of Education, one member nominated by the Kenya Polytechnic, and one member nominated by the Ministry of Works

(iii) The Controller of Apprenticeship or his representative shall be Secretary to the Committee

(iv) The Committee shall appoint from within its membership a Chairman and Vice-Chairman and shall regulate its own procedure

(v) The Chairman and members of the Board shall hold office for such period, not exceeding three years, as shall be specified at the time of their appointment, and on the expiration of such period shall be eligible for reappointment

4 QUALIFICATIONS FOR ENTRY INTO APPRENTICESHIP

(a) The minimum educational standard for entry into Apprenticeship shall be two years' secondary education

(b) The minimum age for entry shall be 16 years

5 PERIOD OF APPRENTICESHIP

The period of apprenticeship shall be five years. A person who has successfully completed a three year Technical School course or has reached School Certificate or equivalent standard approved by the Controller of Apprenticeship, may be admitted into the second year of the Apprenticeship

6 PRACTICAL TRAINING

The practical training which the Employer shall provide for the apprentice shall include the use of tools, machine shop practice, general fitting, welding, engine, transmission, suspension, body and electrical repairs, and vehicle testing

7 THEORETICAL TRAINING

The minimum theoretical training which shall be provided shall consist of a course leading to City and Guilds Examination in Motor Vehicle Mechanics Work (168 New Scheme) or equivalent course comprising the following subjects: Motor Vehicle Technology, Motor Vehicle Practice, Motor Vehicle Science, Sketching and Drawing, Motor Vehicle Calculation and General Studies

8 PROFICIENCY TESTS

Apprentices shall undergo a trade test of a standard set by the Controller of Apprenticeship in consultation with the Apprenticeship Committee after the completion of two years' training and before completion of three years' training. The Grade I National Trade Test shall be taken at the completion of the apprenticeship

9 CONTRACTS OF APPRENTICESHIP

A contract of apprenticeship in the form set out hereunder shall be entered into by every apprentice
