CAUSE NO. 120 OF 1982

Parties:

Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers' Union
and
Kenya Coffee Growers' Association

Issues in dispute:

Subject matter wages, hours of work subclause (a) (b) (c), overtime (*nyaparas* and clerks), housing subclause (b) and (e), service pay, picking rates, employment policy subclause (b) and shift allowance.

THE Kenya Plantation and Agricultural Workers' Union shall hereinafter be referred to as the claimants and Kenya Coffee Growers' Association shall hereinafter be referred to as the respondents.

2. The parties were heard in Nairobi on 2nd, 3rd and 4th March, 1983, and relied on their written and verbal submissions.

AWARD

3. The Notification of Dispute Form "A" dated 15th September, 1982, duly signed by the parties was received by the court on 8th December, together with the statutory certificate signed by the Labour Commissioner.

The parties' latest collective agreement which is the subject matter of revision and has given rise to this dispute was effective from 1st January, 1980, and was to remain in force for a period of two years from that date, i.e. up to December, 1981.

The court notes with regret that the parties have delayed the matter so much before it could reach Industrial Court on 8th December, 1982, despite the fact that the claimants had forwarded their proposals to the respondents on 21st October, 1981. The court has carefully studied the history of negotiations in the pre-Industrial Court procedures and is satisfied that the respondents are clearly to blame for this extraordinary delay. Fortunately the effective date and duration are not in dispute which means that the new collective agreement will be effective from 1st January, 1982, and will remain in force till the end of 1983.

At the outset the court would like to emphasize that coffee industry plays a very crucial role in earning precious foreign exchange for Kenya. Approximately 25,000 workers are employed by the respondents' 220 members and an unknown number are employed from time to time on casual and task contracts. It is common knowledge that the frost that occurred in Brazil strongly affected the coffee prices between 1975 and 1978. From the respondents' submissions it appears that the price of coffee per ton has moved as follows:

The claimants' main complaint has been, and they are very bitter about it that during the coffee boom period when the owners enjoyed unprecedented rise in the price of coffee the workers did not get their fair share and continued to suffer under conditions of exploitation or near exploitation. It should, however, be noted that the last time the parties appeared before the Industrial Court in cause No. 37/69 and since then the parties have had three collective agreements freely negotiated by them at their own level—in 1975, 1977 and 1979. So the claimants largely due to their own previous leadership have themselves contributed to their complaint now that they did not get a fair share of the coffee boom. The claimants have now pushed the whole burden on this court to rectify the situation of their own making by asking the court to grant high wage increases to the workers because of the boom that has now unfortunately considerably diminished if not altogether disappeared since 1979 and at a time when the coffee industry is once again in a very precarious position.

During the boom period some of the respondents' members sold their coffee plantations at prices of about K£4,000 per acre and the new owners are the Kenyans who having paid such high prices now find that coffee certainly is not any more the black gold that they thought it was at the time they purchased the plantations.

The respondents have as they always do whenever there is a dispute with the workers in the coffee industry presented their latest production costs per ton according to estate yield which they have worked out at KSh. 20,196 per ton. They claimed that the labour costs accounted for 38 per cent of total production costs.

There is one rather good point which the claimants made during the hearing in reply to the claimants' contention that the coffee plantations changed hands during the boom period by referring the court to clause 22 of the existing collective agreement which reads:

"If the employer intends to sell his estate he shall inform the union of his intention thirty (30) days before the sale of his estate becomes effective, unless circumstances force immediate sale when the union will be informed at once."

The claimants alleged that they had not received a single notification from any member of the respondents in accordance with the aforesaid clause. The respondents could not counter this argument. For these reasons the claimants maintained that it was not true that most of the respondents' members were new owners who had not benefited from the coffee boom.

The court has carefully applied its mind to the letter written by the managing director of the Kenya Planters' Co-operative Union Ltd. to the Minister for Agriculture dated 22nd July, 1982, particularly the following paragraph:

"It is of course extremely difficult to predict the future course of Kenya's coffee industry. The three major factors of productions, disposals and prices depend on:

The incentives and economic environment to some extent created by the government; world coffee prices and ICO restrictions; Kenya's bargaining power at ICO meetings; and many other factors.

The well-being of Kenya's whole economy depends to a major degree on the health of its coffee industry. We are worried in KPCU that there are ominous signs in the industry. In the estates sector farmers are becoming increasingly worried by the high costs of coffee farming. On top of this there has always been a time lag of up to 18 months between initial expenditure by a farmer on a crop and the final payment to the farmer for that coffee. It would seem as if large scale estate coffee farmers are finding the financial strains of coffee farming increasingly burdensome.

In the co-operative sector the level of input has been drastically reduced other crops have frequently been mixed in with coffee bushes. Yields, already very low in the co-operative sector, are declining further.

We feel that there is a major danger of disenchantment with coffee farming, consequent reduction of inputs, and the possibility of a drastic reduction of coffee production in Kenya over the next two to three years. This would have a damaging effect on Kenya's foreign exchange earnings and employment."

The court will now proceed to deal with the specific issues in dispute.

Subject matter:

Under this item the claimants' demand is that the collective agreement which negotiate with the respondents should apply to union members only. The court has every sympathy with the claimants on this issue because it appears that at least half, if not more, of the 25,000 monthly employees in the coffee industry are free riders, i.e. they do not subscribe to the claimants by way of entrance fees and subscriptions but benefit fully from their efforts as the matters stand at present. The fact, however, is that because of the current legal position and the quite clear provision on the subject in the Kenya Constitution there is little that the court can do to help the claimants in this regard. The court would like to strongly advise both COTU and F.K.E. and the Ministry of Labour to examine this problem with a view to getting some sort of contribution from these free riders to the trade unions even if they do not want to join the trade unions in exercise of their freedom of association.

With the aforesaid recommendation the court must reject the claimants' demand.

Wages:

The wage progression in the coffee industry going back to 1975, has been as follows:

The respondents have offered a 10 per cent wage increase for the first year and 15 per cent for the second year.

The claimants maintained that the monthly income of a rural agriculture worker should be around KSh. 1,000 and although the rural workers supported a greater number of persons as compared to the urban wage earners it was substantially below the urban wage rate. They referred to the various cost of living indices and asked for a daily rate of KSh. 30 for the first year and KSh. 39 for the second year and submitted that the monthly wage should be worked out from the daily rate. This is in respect of employees as defined in clause 1. For all other employees they produced a job classification and asked for wages ranging from KSh. 1,200 to KSh. 2,600 p.m. for the first year and wages ranging from KSh. 1,560 to KSh. 3,380 p.m. for the second year.

The Division of Manpower Planning and Development report shows that the claimants would be entitled to an average wage hike of 26.0 per cent for lower income and 28.4 per cent for the middle income for the two-year period. On the whole this wage increase entitlement amounts to an average of 27.2 per cent for the entire period under consideration.

The court notes that in the collective agreement which is being revised there seems to be no categories for the various jobs which are being performed by the unionizable employees. As against this the claimants have formulated their own job classification coupled with fairly high basic rates for the jobs contained therein. The court feels that it is not proper to accept one party's job classification. Keeping this in mind the court directs that both the parties should embark jointly on a job classification exercise in the coffee industry, if need be, with the assistance of an outside expert whose fees should be borne equally by them.

After carefully considering all the parties' submissions and having taken into account the movement in cost of living indices the court has decided that in the coffee industry which is one of the major sources of earning foreign exchange in the country the court should use its powers under guideline (v) to determine their basic minimum standards of living. It is up to the court to decide what that minimum should be from time to time in each occupation. While exercising these powers the court has taken into consideration the standard of living of people who are not in wage employment particularly the standards of the average small farmers in the rural areas. The court awards as follows:

In making the above award the court has also taken into consideration that the coffee industry is known to have complained of labour shortages.

Hours of work (a) (b) (c):

At present the normal hours per week are 46 spread over six days—8 hrs. from Monday to Friday and 6 hrs. on Saturday. The security workers do 60 hrs. spread over a period of six days of the week. Workers are entitled to at least one rest day in every period of seven days.

The claimants' demand is that the working hours should be reduced to 40 hrs. per week spread over six days—7 hrs. from Monday to Friday and 5 hrs. on Saturday. They also want the working hours for security workers to be reduced from 60 to 46. They further complained that the workers in the coffee industry were paid on 26 days basis and they did not get the weekly rest day with full pay.

After carefully considering the parties' submissions the court rejects the claimants' demand for reducing the working hours from 46 to 40 and of security staff from 60 to 46.

On the weekly rest day the court awards that every employee shall be entitled to one rest day in every period of seven days with pay.

The court has taken into consideration the employers' contention that at present weekly rest day is paid for and have argued that it is only a matter of interpretation which has caused this dispute. The court hopes that the addition of the words "with full pay" will eliminate this argument on whether or not they are being paid during the weekly rest day. The parties should ensure that the workers shall not get less than the monthly rate which includes the rest days.

Overtime (nyaparas and clerks):

The claimants have pleaded that the 56 hrs. per week required to be worked by *nyaparas* and clerks which was first introduced in 1962, had outlived its usefulness as it was a colonial legacy when these employees had to work extra time to supervise the supply of free *posho* to labourers. The respondents rejected this argument and stated that any change in their working hours would completely upset the current system.

The court has carefully considered this matter and finds that there is no justification why two categories of workers other than security staff should be required to work more than the normal working hours per week. The court accordingly accepts the claimants' demands and awards that *nyaparas* and clerks should also work 46 hrs. per week like other workers. It will be up to the respondents if need be to organize new work schedules for them in order to meet their requirements and to fit in with 46 hrs. The court rules that this part of the court award shall be effective from 1st January, 1983.

Service pay:

At present this benefit extended to workers up to the implementation of the National Social Security Fund. The claimants want that all employees should be entitled to service pay for all their services if their employment is terminated for reasons other than gross misconduct or are unable to continue employment due to ill health or if after 20 years they decide to resign. They demand 21 days' pay for every completed year of service for those with two to four years of service and 30 days for every completed year of service for those with more than four years.

The court has carefully considered this demand and has decided to reject it.

Picking rates:

The claimants have demanded that picking rates should be increased to KSh. 7 per tin for the first year and KSh. 10.50 for the second year. They vigorously submitted that it was undesirable that juveniles should be employed on picking coffee which they stated was the practice all over the country on coffee estates. The claimants argued that these new rates will:

- "(a) Encourage very high productivity in coffee picking.
- (b) Attract more adults to coffee picking jobs during these seasons.
- (c) Employers will be inclined to employ productive adults rather than the juveniles."

The respondents have submitted that whereas in the past permanent workers on the estate were assigned generally a task of three tins during the flush of the picking season at present due to the drop in the picking standards the crop is now almost entirely picked by outside workers who are paid for each tin picked. They argued that this item could not therefore fall within the terms and conditions of employment in the coffee industry.

The court must overrule the respondents' submission on this point and finds that picking rates is a legitimate item to be included in the collective agreement. The court awards that the picking rate per tin from the date of the court award will be KSh. 5 per tin.

As far as the employment of juveniles is concerned the claimants are at liberty to take up the matter and report the estates concerned to the Ministry of Labour for appropriate action.

Employment policy (b):

The claimants' demand under this item is that every employer shall employ one permanent employee for every acre of planted coffee.

The respondents have strongly objected to this demand as it is totally unreasonable and in any case would not be enforceable.

The court finds this demand by the claimants to be ingenious but in a free labour market economy it is not feasible to make an award as requested by the claimants. The court accordingly rejects this demand.

Shift allowance:

The claimants' demand that workers in the irrigation and spraying section should get an additional allowance of KSh. 62.40 per month as they were victims of occupational disease from chemical side-effects. In irrigation section a worker is subjected to work under difficult conditions during night shifts and had to carry heavy water pipes and always works under wet conditions. The respondents submitted that the claimants were misguided in their demand as occupational hazards where they existed could only be minimized by appropriate protective clothing and equipment and not with mandatory allowances over and above the rate for the job.

The court felt that the claimants really could not explain what they were after under this item and the court accordingly has decided to reject this item for the time.

Housing (b) (e):

The current clause on housing negotiated by the parties themselves and contained in the 1979 collective agreement reads:

- "(a) Every employer shall at all times at his own expense provide reasonable housing accommodation for his employees at or near the place of employment or shall pay the employee such sufficient sum as rental in addition to his/her wages as will enable such employee to obtain reasonable accommodation.
- (b) Permanent employees who are required by the employer to live in their own houses shall be entitled to a housing allowance of not less than KSh. 80 per month.
- (c) Where an employee is housed by his/her employer no rent shall be paid by the employee and no allowance shall be paid to him by the employer.
- (d) Wherever possible every married male employee who has his family permanently residing on the estate with him shall be allocated one house. It is agreed that the allocation of housing and their occupancy is at the discretion of the employer."

The claimants made a scathing attack on the respondents' members for having provided what the claimants called sub-human accommodation for their workers in complete violation of having agreed to provide them with reasonable housing accommodation. They demanded that every employee should be provided with a reasonable house by their employers and those who are not housed should be given house allowance. They stated that in many cases four employees are in a 10' x 10' room and in such cases they asked the court to award that the three extra occupants of the room should be entitled to be paid house allowance. The claimants pointed out that 10' x 10' room was certainly not adequate for an employee and his family.

The claimants have also demanded that the house allowance should be increased to KSh. 200 per month in respect of those employees who are not housed by the employers and that every employee should be allocated with a two-roomed house with kitchen and bathroom. Further if an employee is housed he should not be charged any rent and he will not be entitled to a house allowance either.

The respondents pleaded that the economic circumstances of the industry have made it difficult for them to make any offer on house allowance considering that the majority of workers not housed stay in their own houses. The respondents stated that at least one of their members had spent 1.8 million shillings on providing houses for the workers. They also pointed out that about half of their employees lived off the estates.

The court finds that the real issue in dispute on housing is the application and implementation of the existing clause on housing: do the respondents' members provide reasonable housing accommodation to their employees who are housed by them? The court has no reason to doubt that the claimants' allegations on this subject to a large extent are probably true

and the workers are not enjoying reasonable housing accommodation. There is, however, no evidence before the court that the claimants have reported the pathetic living conditions of the workers in the coffee estates to the Ministry of Labour and the medical authorities to enable the government to take appropriate action as laid down in the relevant Acts against the defaulting employers. The court appreciates that the coffee estates are spread all over the country and therefore it involves more than one provincial labour officer and his staff the provincial medical officer and his staff. The court, however, feels very strongly that these workers who are making such an immense contribution in earning so much foreign exchange for the country should live decently. It is obvious that unless regular checks are made by the labour officers and medical officers and drastic action is taken against the defaulting employers the workers have no hope of living in reasonable housing accommodation.

The Division of Manpower Planning and Development report has this to say on housing:

"The respondents have made great strides in building permanent and semi-permanent houses hitherto but there appears to be an acute shortage of human habitable houses. For instance, the DMPD found that 25.0 per cent of total housing units were temporary (i.e. rondavels) leaking, rodent infested and above all, units unsuitable for human habitation. The issue of reasonable housing units remains the prerogative of public health officers to determine even though this is passed to the Hon. Court for general information."

The court is determined to ensure that the workers in coffee industry are properly housed and with this in mind the court has decided that it will keep the issue of housing in hand and monitor the inspections and the action taken by the labour and medical officers concerned. For this purpose the court directs the D.M.P.D. and the Chief Industrial Relations Officer in conjunction with representatives of the claimants and the respondents and officials from the Ministry of Health to embark upon inspections of the housing facilities provided by the various members of the respondents and to feed back to the court with action reports at, to begin with, six monthly intervals. The court has given this period keeping in mind the financial constraints being faced by the government just now which it is hoped will ease off in a few months' time.

In the meantime the court awards that those employees who are not housed by the respondents shall be entitled to a house allowance of not less than KSh. 120 per month. Further the employers should not house more than two single employees in one room and one family only in one room. This is an interim measure and depending on the feed-back that the court will get from the aforesaid committee of investigation and action the court will review this matter during the next round of negotiations between the parties.

The court would like to emphasize that it is always very cautious in making awards which will require the employers to embark on millions of shillings of investment on such issues as houses but the court would like to sound a warning that if the employers do not improve the housing facilities in order to provide reasonable accommodation to their employees then the court may be forced to take such steps as it may deem necessary.

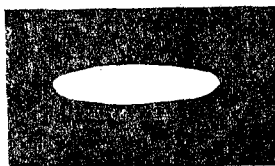
