Article 2

The logo for the ECOWAS Trade Fair shall present the following features:

A knotted cord around the flags of the sixteen Member States arranged in a circle within which is a white map of ECOWAS on a blue background. Within the circle formed by the flags of Member States and with the ECOWAS map as a background is a blue, white and black square crate tied up with a black rope and suspended from a hook of the same colour.

Article 3


The logo referred to in Article 2 of this Decision shall be permanent and is hereby designated as "the ECOWAS Trade Fair Logo".

Article 4

This Decision shall enter into force upon signature and shall be published in the Official Journal of the Community and in the National Gazette of each Member State.

DECISION C/DEC.13/12/93 ESTABLISHING A SUPPLEMENTARY LIST OF INDUSTRIAL ENTERPRISES AND PRODUCTS APPROVED FOR INCLUSION UNDER THE ECOWAS TRADE LIBERALISATION SCHEME

THE COUNCIL MINISTERS

Mindful of Article 6 of the ECOWAS Treaty establishing the Council of Ministers and defining its composition and functions,

Mindful of the Protocol defining the concept of products originating from ECOWAS Member States and its subsequent amending Acts and Decisions;

Mindful of Decision A/DEC.15/5/80 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government relating to the fixing of the desirable level of national participation in the equity capital of industrial enterprises whose products benefit from preferential duty under the intra-Community trade liberalisation scheme;

Mindful of Decision A/DEC.18/5/80 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government relating to trade liberalisation in industrial products;

Mindful of Decision A/DEC.1/5/83 dated 30 May, 1983 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government relating to the adoption and implementation of a single trade liberalisation scheme for industrial products originating from Member States of the Community;

Mindful of Decision C/DEC.3/5/80 dated 25 May, 1980 of the Council of Ministers relating to the proof and the verification of the Community origin of products and the procedures relating to the circulation of goods within the Community;

Mindful of Decisions C/DEC.3/6/88 dated 21 June, 1988 and C/DEC.4/7/92 dated 25 July, 1992 of the Council of Ministers defining the procedure for approval of industrial products and enterprises to benefit from the ECOWAS trade liberalisation scheme;

Mindful of Decision A/DEC.6/7/92 dated 29 July, 1992 of the Authority of Heads of State and Government amending Decision A/DEC.1/5/83 relating to the adoption and implementation of a single trade liberalisation scheme for industrial products originating from ECOWAS Member States;

Mindful of Decision C/DEC.4/7/93 dated 20 July, 1993 establishing the list of industrial enterprises and products approved to benefit under the ECOWAS trade liberalisation scheme;

Desiring to complement the existing list of industrial enterprises and products approved for inclusion under the ECOWAS trade liberalisation scheme as contained in the above-mentioned Decision of 20 July, 1993;

On the recommendation of the Trade, Customs, Immigration, Money and Payments Commission meeting held in Lagos from 24 to 27 November, 1993.

DECIDES

Article 1

The industrial enterprises and products which have satisfied the ECOWAS rules of origin criteria and which are contained in the attached list are hereby approved to benefit under the intra-community trade liberalisation scheme, in addition to those contained in Decision C/DEC.4/7/93 of 20 July, 1993.

Article 2

The Executive Secretariat shall assign to each enterprise a registration number which must feature on all the Certificates of Origin and on Customs Declaration Forms and shall inform Member States accordingly.

Article 3


Member States and the Executive Secretariat shall take appropriate measures for the implementation of this Decision.
