Comments on the Statement of Assets and Liabilities of the Bank of Botswana as at 30th April, 1977

1. The level of the international reserve rose from P60,5 million at the end of March 1977 to P68,9 million at the ind of April. This increase reflected the combination of two events. The first was the receipt during April of a large sum from the Customs Union revenue pool, which substantially increased the foreign exchange reserves. The second was the revaluation of the Pula by 5°_{\circ} on 30th April, 1977, which lowered the reserves to the end month figure of P68,9 million in terms of the newly revalued Pula.

2. The revaluation of the Pula did not of itself alter the value of the international reserve, as expressed in the foreign currencies held by the Bank. However, in Pula terms the reserves suffered a 5°_{0} reduction. This "loss" was partially offset by the balance in the Special Reserve Account, representing the accumulation of revaluation profits which accrued to the Bank in 1976 from its holding of foreign currencies. Secondly, it was offset by a further revaluation profit between 1st January and 30th April, 1977. The resulting net deficit of about P2,7 million in the Special Reserve Account was then met by the Government as required under section 34 (2) of the Bank of Botswana Act. This was accomplished by Government issuing to the Bank a compared to that for March, is that the item "Special Reserve" was eliminated from the LIABILITIES side, and a new item "Non-Interest Bearing Note" was shown for the first time on the ASSETS side.

3. Under section 7 (2) of the Act, the Bank is required to apply a portion of its operating profit each year towards the redemption of the Note. Other things being equal, the value of the Note will accordingly be reduced on 31st December, 1977, by this portion of the Bank's profits in 1977.
