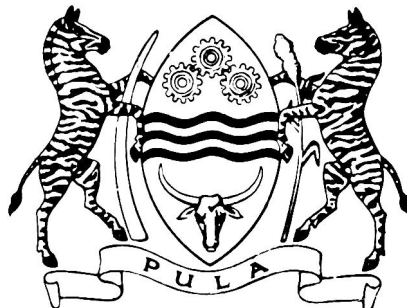

- (iv) "Articulated vehicles" — Articulated vehicles means a single operative motor vehicle consisting of a power unit (tractor) coupled with and partly bearing a detachable goods or passenger carrying unit or combination thereof having no front axle (semi-trailer). Each unit of an articulated vehicle is rated and insured separately in respect of the tractor unit under group reference 8 and in respect of the semi-trailer unit according to the purpose for which such unit is designed or used, i.e. under group reference 2A, 2B, 2C, 2D, 3A, 3B, 3C or 3D, as the case may be.
