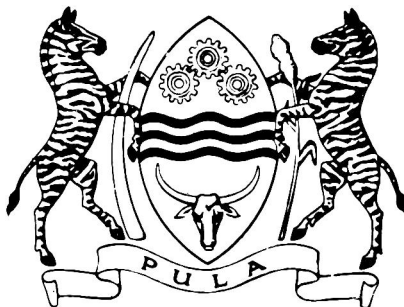

TREASURY BILLS REGULATIONS, 1976  
(S.I. 143 of 1976)

**Applications for Government of Botswana Treasury Bills**

The Minister of Finance and Development Planning hereby gives notice that applications will be received at the Bank of Botswana, Khama Crescent, Gaborone on Thursday, 11th May, 1978, at 12 noon, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Stock, Bonds and Treasury Bills Act, 1976, and in accordance with the Treasury Bills Regulations, 1976, to the amount of P1 000 000.

2. The price per cent at which the Bills will be offered will be published by the Bank of Botswana not later than 9 a.m. on Thursday, 11th May, 1978.

3. The Bills will be in amount of P1 000 or a multiple of P1 000. They will be dated 12th May, 1978 and will be due 91 days after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of Botswana.

5. Each application must be for a minimum of P1 000.

6. Applications must be made through a commercial bank in Botswana.

7. Notification will be sent, on the same day as applications are received, to the persons whose applications are accepted in whole or in part.

8. Payment in full of the amount due in respect of such accepted applications must be made to the Bank of Botswana by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of Botswana not later than noon on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

9. Applications must be made on the official printed forms which may be obtained from the commercial banks or the Accounts and Banking Office, Bank of Botswana.

10. The Minister of Finance and Development Planning reserves the right to reject any application in whole or in part.

**STATUTE LAW (MISCELLANEOUS AMENDMENTS)**

**MEMORANDUM**

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

2. The purpose of the Bill is to make a number of minor amendments to various written laws none of which is thought to be of sufficient importance to merit a separate Bill.

3. Clause 2 of the Bill proposes to replace section 222 of the Criminal Procedure and Evidence Act (Cap. 08:02). Section 222 governs the admission as evidence of reports made by a medical/or veterinary practitioner "in any trial or preliminary examination before a subordinate court". Doubts have arisen as to whether the words "before a subordinate court" govern not only "preliminary examination" but also the words "in any trial". It is considered desirable to put the matter beyond doubt and to provide that such reports may be admitted "in any proceedings before any court". It is also proposed to remove the necessity of proving the authenticity of the signature on such a report. It is proposed that such signature be accepted unless the contrary be proved.

4. Clause 3 of the Bill proposes an amendment to section 4 of the Public Order Act, (Cap. 22:02), to enable the Minister when declaring an area to be a controlled area, to specify who shall be the regulating officer for that area. The present law provides for the Chief, in the case of tribal territory, and/or District Commissioner in the case of any other area, to be regulating officer "ex officio".

5. Clause 4 proposes an amendment to the Deserted Wives and Children's Protection Act, (Cap. 28:03), to provide that complaints shall be made to a magistrate rather than to an administrative officer.

6. Clause 5 of the Bill proposes an amendment to the Companies Act, (Cap. 42:01), to the effect that the Registrar of Companies shall be appointed in the same manner as any other public officer, and not by the President as at present.

7. Clause 6 proposes an amendment to the Veterinary Surgeons Act (Cap. 61:04) to remove the necessity of publishing the name and address of a veterinary surgeon when he has been registered and of publishing annual lists of registered veterinary surgeons. This is not required of any other profession.

**INCOME TAX (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1978**

*(Published on 12th May, 1978)*

**MEMORANDUM**

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

2. The principal object of the Bill is to amend the Income Tax Act, Cap. 52:01, to accord with recent developments in the mining field and in public service salaries. The opportunity is also taken to effect a number of minor amendments to the Act, the reasons for which appear in this Memorandum.

3. Clause 2 proposes amendments to the definitions of "Mining Commissioner" and "mining prospecting right", appearing in section 2, so as to bring these definitions into line with the Mine and Minerals Act, 1976.

4. Clause 3 proposes amendments to section 28 (2) (c) of the Act to provide for the taxation of recoveries of bad and doubtful debts in respect of which deductions had been allowed under the Income Tax (Consolidation) Proclamation, 1959, which was repealed in 1973 and also to provide for the taxation of recoveries of expenditure on improvements to land and property similarly allowed as deductions.

5. Clause 4 proposes amendments to section 30 (1) of the Act to provide for taxation of —

- (a) any royalties which having been allowed as deductions are subsequently remitted, exempted or repaid; and
- (b) any part of the realization value of a mining asset which cannot be offset against mining capital expenditure.

6. With the abolition of housing allowance for public officers following on the recently published Salaries Commission Report, references in the Act to such allowance are no longer required. The necessary amendments are reflected in clauses 5, 7 and 9. Clause 5 also contains an amendment to section 31 (1) so as to include within the employment income of a person the value of any quarters or residence provided.

7. Clause 6 of the Bill proposes an amendment to permit the deduction from assessable income from mining operations of the amount of any liability for royalties even if the payment thereof is deferred under the Mines and Minerals Act, 1976.

8. Section 109 enables the Commissioner of Taxes to refund to any person any excess taxes paid. It is impossible to estimate the amount required in any one year and the amount provided in the annual Estimates frequently proves inadequate making a supplementary estimate necessary. This is a cumbersome procedure. Clause 8 proposes an amendment to make such refunds a charge on and payable out of the Consolidated Fund thus avoiding the necessity for estimates.

9. Part I of the Second Schedule sets out a list of persons who are exempt from tax. This list does not include local authorities, who, it is considered, should be included as any income receivable is utilized for the common good of the populace living within the areas of their jurisdiction. This amendment is reflected in clause 9 as is an amendment to Part II of that Schedule, which

lists classes of gross income exempt from tax. This amendment is to extend the Minister's powers to exempt interest from loans and dividends on non-voting shares held by foreign investors where such investment is utilised for the public benefit.

10. Clause 10 of the Bill proposes three amendments to the Third Schedule to the Act, concerned with mining capital allowances. These are —

- (a) to amend the definition of "residual capital expenditure" to ensure that the realization value of a mining asset, disposed of in a year, is offset against mining capital expenditure to the maximum extent, whether the asset was bought in that year or earlier;
- (b) to provide for the winding-up of mining capital allowances on all assets on termination of a mining lease as well as on the disposal of a mine; and
- (c) to amend the definition of "disposed of" to include compulsory acquisition, an event which may occur on termination of a mining lease.

(ii) in paragraph 8 thereof —

(aa) by inserting immediately after the words “disposed of” which appear therein, the words “or the mineral concession in respect thereof is terminated”; and

- (bb) by deleting the words "for previous tax years",  
which appear therein; and
- (b) in part VII thereof, by inserting immediately after the word  
"exchanged", which appears in the definition of "disposed  
of", the words, ", compulsorily acquired,".
