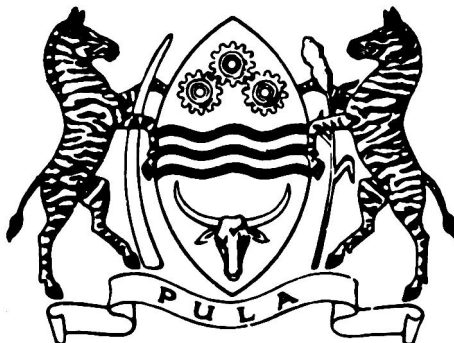

“(i) There shall be paid to employees in the Wholesale Distributive Trade a basic minimum wage of 43 thebe per hour except that persons employed by the undertaking to watch over any property of the industry shall be paid a basic minimum wage of 32t per hour.

(ii) Employees in the Retail Distributive Trade shall be paid a basic minimum wage of 42t per hour except that persons employed by the undertaking to watch over any property of the industry shall be paid a basic minimum wage of 32 thebe per hour:”
