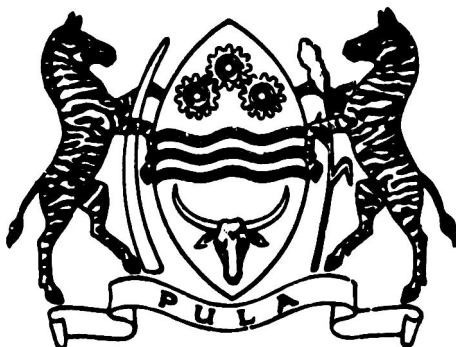

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 31st day of July, 1985, One Thousand, Nine Hundred and Eighty Five **BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF BOTSWANA** (hereinafter called "the Government") of the first part, **BCL Limited** (hereinafter called "BCL" whose registered office is the Administrative Block BCL Mine Site Selebi-Phikwe in the Republic of Botswana, of the second part, **Botswana RST Limited** (hereinafter called "BRST") a company incorporated in the Republic of Botswana and having its registered office at the Administrative Block BCL Mine Site aforesaid of the third part and **BCL (SALES) LIMITED** (hereinafter called "BCL" (SALES)) a company incorporated in the Republic of Botswana having its

registered office at the Administrative Block BCL Mine Site aforesaid of the fourth part.

WHEREAS THE Government, BCL and BRST on March 5, 1970 entered into an Agreement relating to certain tax matters which was subsequently amended by an Agreement dated June 22, 1971, between the said parties and by an Agreement dated March 1, 1972, between the said parties and BCL (SALES) and by an Agreement dated March, 15, 1978 among the Government, BCL, BRST and BCL (SALES) and by an Agreement dated 25th June, 1982 between the Government, BCL, BRST, BCL (SALES) which Agreement, as so amended, is hereinafter called "the principal Agreement;

AND WHEREAS the Government, BCL, BRST and BCL (SALES) desire further to amend the principal Agreement the better to express their common intentions,

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED as follows:

1. The Government will introduce legislation for this Agreement to be ratified by Parliament.

2. The principal Agreement shall be read and construed as amended by the deletion of the second sentence of clause 11(A) in its entirety and the substitution thereof of —

"The expression 'interest' where hereinafter used in this Part of this Agreement means interest payable by BCL or BCL (SALES) or BRST on monies borrowed by BCL, BCL (SALES) or BRST and applied for the purposes of the operations, and in the case of BCL shall include interest payable on any outstanding amount of the Amax Nickel Inc. Indemnification Amount in terms of the Restructuring Agreement (BCL Limited) among the Republic of Botswana, Kreditanstalt Fuer Wiederaufbau, Industrial Development Corporation of South Africa Limited, Tusitala (Proprietary Limited, The Chase Manhattan Bank N.A., Amax Inc., Anglo American Corporation of South Africa Limited, Botswana RST Limited, Charter Consolidated P.L.C., De Beers Consolidated Mines Limited, RST International Inc., and BCL Limited, dated as of July 31st, 1985 as read with the Termination Agreement (Matte Purchase Agreement) between BCL Limited and Amax Nickel Inc., dated as of July 31st, 1985, and on notes issued by BCL, under the Note Agreement dated 15th day of March, 1978, between the Government, BCL, Amax Inc., and Anglo American Corporation of South Africa Limited, in respect of monies so applied and shall also include interest accrued on Subordinated Notes and Emergency Funding referred to in Section 4.02 of the Agreement and Plan of Reorganization (BCL Limited) among BCL and its creditors dated as of June 15, 1982."

3. The principal Agreement is amended by the insertion after clause (F) thereof of a new clause (G) as follows:—

"In the event of a change in the Income Tax Act having the effect of making the principal amount of the Amax Nickel Inc. Indemnification Amount liable to income tax, such amount shall be exempt from such income tax."

PRISONS (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) BILL, 1985

MEMORANDUM

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

2. Section 73 of the Prisons Act provides for the establishment of parole boards whilst section 81 provides for the establishment of a Prison Advisory Committee. The functions of the two statutory bodies as spelt out in the Act are, in many respects, similar and overlapping.

3. The object of this Bill is, therefore, to amend the Prisons Act by transferring the functions of the Prison Advisory Committee to a parole board where such functions are not overlapping and repeal the provisions of the Act relating to the Prison Advisory Committee. This is to avoid unnecessary duplication of the functions of the two statutory bodies.

- (iii) that special circumstances exist which, in the opinion of the parole board, warrant such remission,

or

(b) any prisoner serving a term of imprisonment for life or confined during the President’s pleasure be released on any ground specified in paragraph (a).

(5) The Minister shall consider every recommendation made to him under subsection (4) and then submit it to the President together with his own recommendation.”

CUSTOMS AND EXCISE DUTY (AMENDMENT) (NO. 2) BILL, 1985

(Published on 18th October, 1985)

MEMORANDUM

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

2. The object of the Bill, like the one which was enacted into law on 3rd April, 1985 is to amend the Customs and Excise Duty Act (Cap. 50:01) in accordance with our treaty obligations under Article 10 of the Customs Union Agreement in order to bring the Customs and Excise Duty Act in line with the proposed amendments to the Customs and Excise Act, 1964 of the Republic of South Africa.

3. Clause 1 provides that the insertion in section 79 (19) of paragraph (bB) to be effected by clause 12 should have a retrospective effect to 1st July, 1983, in order to allow for a rebate of duty on losses in respect of goods removed and stored for export since that date.

4. Clause 2 amends section 7 to delete the requirement that passenger lists should be included in the reports of aircrafts arriving from foreign countries. Such lists no longer serve any useful purpose. The necessary information is obtained from other sources.

5. Clause 3 amends section 9 to abolish the prescribed form previously required in respect of sealable stores and goods which must be declared by pilots and crew of aircraft on arrival in Botswana. This measure is adopted to facilitate air traffic, airlines having already put alternative, acceptable control measures into force.

6. Clause 4 amends section 13 to provide for the changed circumstances in which it is no longer necessary to draw a distinction between goods imported by parcel post or otherwise by post. In terms of the proposed amendment goods imported by post are now to be treated uniformly as postal items.

7. Clause 5 amends section 14 to provide as follows —

- (i) subsection (1) now includes the obligation that the person who made the declaration on entering or leaving Botswana must pay the duty assessed by an officer to the officer appointed to collect such duty; and
- (ii) a new subsection (1A) is inserted to provide that the declaration made in terms of subsection (1) shall be deemed to be entry for home consumption or export as the case may be for the purposes of the Act.

8. Clause 6 inserts a new section 40A to provide for the sale in transit of imported goods. Such sales usually take place at higher prices and accordingly influence the value for customs duty purposes and it is therefore necessary to clarify the matter in respect of such imports.

9. Clause 7 amends section 46 to delete certain words in subsection (1) which have occasionally created problems of interpretation in the past. The amended subsection (1) has been numbered to read paragraph (a) and a new paragraph (b) inserted in which it is stated that if goods are removed, taken or delivered without entry for home consumption such goods are liable to the

duties leviable at the time of such removal, taking or delivery or assessment by an officer whichever yields the greater amount of duty.

10. Clause 8 inserts a new section 49A —

- (i) subsection (1) of which introduces a specific prohibition directed against any person removing or receiving or taking or delivering or dealing with or in any imported or excisable goods unless such goods have been duly entered for home consumption; and
- (ii) subsection (2) of which specifically provides for the enforcement of the provision of the Act in respect of goods alleged to have been entered for home consumption in terms of any agreement in any territory with which Botswana has concluded such agreement in terms of section 53. Although inherent in the provisions and intention of the Act, it is considered necessary to make a specific provision of this nature in order to avoid any dispute regarding jurisdiction when goods allegedly entered for home consumption in a country with which Botswana has concluded a customs agreement are moved across the borders of such country to Botswana for consumption and are found by an officer not to have been duly entered for customs purposes.

11. Clause 9 amends section 69 to redefine the value of goods liable to ad valorem fiscal excise duty, the previous wording of which has been considered by certain countries as infringing the GATT Valuation Code, and also to identify the goods concerned by reference to the relevant Tariff Rebate Item.

12. Clause 10 amends section 72 and is consequential of the amendment of section 69 (8), vide clause 9 above, and relates to the excise duty on similar goods.

13. Clause 11 amends subsections (1) and (2) of section 78 to insert references to Case Studies and Studies in subsection (1) and paragraph (a) of subsection (2) and to insert a new paragraph (b) in subsection (2) to make provision for evidential purposes that copies or, if amended, such amended copies of the Agreement, Interpretative Notes, Advisory Opinions, Commentaries and Explanatory Notes, Case Studies and Studies kept up to date by the Director shall be sufficient evidence of the contents thereof.

14. Clause 12 amends section 79 to provide as follows —

- (i) to insert a new paragraph (cA) to subsection (5) to clarify the position regarding the liability for the payment of duty by a supplier or reseller of distillate fuel oil obtained under a rebate of duty and who supplied such fuel or fuel oil to a reseller or user without obtaining the forms and issuing the invoices required by regulation. The furnishing of the said forms and issuing of invoices is a prerequisite to obtain such fuel or fuel oil under rebate of duty. It is further provided that such duty will be paid on demand to the Director;
- (ii) in subsection (19) to —
 - (a) delete the reference to aviation spirits and kerosine in paragraph (a) as the customs and excise duties thereon have been abolished;

- (b) differentiate in paragraphs (b) and (bA) between wine and spirits entered for storage and other spirits entered for use in making spirituous beverages; and
- (c) provide in paragraph (bB) for a rebate in respect of losses incurred while unpacked excisable spirits destined for export are removed and stored.

15. Clause 13 amends subsection (4) of section 107 to provide for the presumption in a dispute or prosecution that the forms or invoices required by regulation to be completed and kept, do not exist or have not been duly completed and signed or have not been furnished to an officer, as the case may be, unless the contrary is proved. This amendment with regard to the burden of proof is inserted in consequence of the amendment of section 79 (5) (cA) and is introduced for the purpose of effective administration of the said section.

16. Clause 14 amends section 119 to provide for —

- (a) liens to secure debts to the State arising from underpayments of duty, interest, fines, penalties or forfeitures to be placed on any goods imported in the possession or control of the person by whom the debt is due or on any premises in the possession or control of such person to bring the provisions in connection with imported goods in line with the provisions for excisable goods; and
- (b) liens to be placed on any vehicles, plant or equipment in the possession or under the control of the person by whom the debt is due in which dutiable fuel is used, stored or transported.

These new powers and wider range of goods on which liens can be placed are necessary due to the increasing evasion of customs and excise duties throughout the Common Customs Area and the inadequacy of the existing powers to protect revenue effectively.

17. Clause 15 provides that an amendment effected by Statutory Instrument No. 47 of 1985 to Schedule No. 4 of Customs and Excise Duty Act should have a retrospective effect and stipulates the effective date of such amendment.

18. Clause 16 provides for panel vans cleared during the period 12th June, 1984 and 2nd August, 1984 to be entered under rebate of duty in terms of item 460.17 of Schedule No. 4 to the principal Act.

2. Section 7 of the principal Act is hereby amended by the deletion of paragraph (a) of subsection (2) thereof.

(a) by substituting for subsection (1) thereof the following new subsection —

"(1) For the purposes of entry and collection of duty on goods imported into Botswana by post, any form or label completed by the sender in respect of the postal item in question and on which the particulars necessary for the assessment of duty are set forth, shall be deemed to be an entry made under the provisions of this Act, and the particulars on any such form or label shall, for the

purposes of this Act, be taken as the declaration to be made by the importer under section 39:
