IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Education by section 29 of the Education Act, the following Regulations are hereby made -

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Teacher Training Colleges Citation (Amendment) Regulations, 1990.

2. Regulation 3 of the Teacher Training Colleges (hereinafter referred to as Amendment "the principal Regulations") is amended by inserting immediately after subregulation (4) thereof the following new subregulation ----

"(5) Any application for the re-enrolment at a college or for the re-admission to a hostel, of a student who has ceased to be so enrolled or admitted, as the case may be, shall be made by the student in writing to the principal and shall be subject to such conditions as the Permanent Secretary may direct."

3. Regulation 4 of the principal Regulations is amended by substituting for Amendment subregulation (1) thereof the following subregulation —

"(1) The principal shall consider every application for the enrolment or re-enrolment of a student at a college or for the admission or re-admission of a student to a hostel, as the case may be, and shall, subject to the provisions of these Regulations or any other relevant regulations and to any conditions as may be imposed by the Permanent Secretary, determine whether the student shall be enrolled or re-enrolled or admitted or re-admitted, as the case may be."

4. Regulation 13 of the principal Regulations is amended in subregulation Amendment of (3) thereof by substituting for the numerals "200" which appear therein, the numerals "150".

5. Regulation 16 (1) of the principal Regulations is amended by inserting Amendment of immediately after paragraph (c) thereof the following new paragraph -

> "(d) any student who incites, promotes or participates in any strike, boycott or other act of serious indiscipline prejudicial to Regulations the maintenance of a proper standard of conduct in the college."
