CONTROL OF GOODS, PRICES AND OTHER CHARGES ACT (Cap. 43:07)

CONTROL OF GOODS, PRICES AND OTHER CHARGES (PETROLEUM PRICES) (AMENDMENT)(NO.2) REGULATIONS, 1990

(Published on 19th October, 1990)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 3 of the Control of Goods, Prices and Other Charges Act, the Minister of Commerce and Industry hereby makes the following Regulations —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Control of Goods, Prices and Citation and Other Charges (Petroleum Prices) (Amendment) (No.2) Regulations, 1990, commence-and shall be deemed to have come into operation on 19th October, 1990.

2. The Control of Goods, Prices and Other Charges (Petroleum Prices)
Regulations, 1988 are amended by substituting for the Schedule thereto the following new Schedule—
