WILDLIFE CONSERVATION AND NATIONAL PARKS (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1993

(Published on 12th November, 1993)

MEMORANDUM

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

The object of the Bill is to amend section 46 of the Act, firstly to ensure that trophies of animals killed under the provisions of the section become Government trophies, and that certificates of ownership will not be issued to the persons presenting the trophies. Secondly, the provisions with regard to the payment of compensation to persons who have suffered damage or loss as a result of the actions of animals have been simplified.

- 1. This Act may be cited as the Wildlife Conservation and National Parks (Amendment) Act, 1993.
- **2.** Section 46 of the Wildlife Conservation and National Parks Act, 1992 is amended
 - (a) by substituting for subsections (3) and (4) thereof the following new subsections
 - "(3) The trophies and meat of any animal killed in accordance with the provisions of subsection (1) shall be Government trophies, but where the report required under subsection (2) has been made, and it is established that the killing was in accordance with those provisions, the Director or the licensing officer may issue a permit for the sale of the meat by the person concerned:

Provided that no such permit shall be issued for the sale or other disposal of the meat of any elephant, rhinoceros or cheetah, or the meat of any animal that was killed because it was merely threatening to cause damage. Short title
