TRADE DISPUTES (AMENDMENT) BILL, 1995

MEMORANDUM

A draft of the above Bill, which it is proposed to present to the National Assembly, is set out below.

The purpose of the Bill is to enable the Industrial Court Judge to deal with and determine disputes originating or remaining unresolved prior to the date when the Industrial Court commenced to operate.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

1. This Act may be cited as the Trade Disputes (Amendment) Act, 1995, and shall be deemed to have come into operation on the 1st April, 1994.

Short title and commencement

2. Section 1 of the Trade Disputes (Amendment) Act, 1992 is amended by adding at the end thereof the following new proviso —

Amendment of section 1 of Act No. 23 of 1992

"Provided that, notwithstanding such date of commencement, in relation to the Industrial Court established under and in accordance with section 8 of this Act, any dispute originating or remaining unresolved prior to the date of commencement may be referred to the Industrial Court for determination."
