#### SCHEDULE

**An Act to authorise the payment out of the Consolidated Fund and the Development Fund of sums of money for the year ending 31st March, 1999.**

*Date of Assent:* 31.03.98

*Date of Commencement:* 1.04.98

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

1. This Act may be cited as the Appropriation (1998/99) Act, 1998.
2. The Minister of Finance and Development Planning may issue a warrant for the payment from the Consolidated Fund for the year ending 31st March, 1999, of the sum of P8 538 370 600 (Eight Thousand Five Hundred and Thirty Eight Million Three Hundred and Seventy Thousand Six Hundred Pula).
3. The sum authorised by section 2 is appropriated to, and shall be applied for, purposes of the Heads of Expenditure set out in the first and second columns of the Schedule, in the amounts set out in the corresponding entries in the third column of the said Schedule
4. The Minister of Finance and Development Planning may issue a warrant for the payment from the Development Fund for the year ending 31st March, 1999, of the sum of P3 086 495 000 (Three Thousand and Eighty Six Million Four Hundred and Ninety Five Thousand Pula).
5. The sum authorised by section 4 is appropriated, and shall be applied to meet, the total amount of expenditure necessary for development projects during the financial year ending 31st March, 1999.

1. This Act may be cited as the Supplementary Appropriation (1996/97) Act, 1998. Short title

The Consolidated Fund is hereby charged with a further sum of P95 630 887 (Ninety Five Million, Six Hundred and Thirty Thousand and Eight Hundred and Eighty Seven Pula) to meet expenditure incurred during the financial year ending on 31st March, 1997, in excess of the amount already appropriated for the services for that year, according to the particulars set forth in the Schedule. Development Fund is hereby charged with a further sum of P391 912 663 (Three Hundred and Ninety One Million, Nine Hundred and Twelve Thousand and Six Hundred and Sixty Three Pula) to meet expenditure incurred during the financial year which ended on 31st March, 1997, in excess of the amount already appropriated for development projects for that year. (Cap 43:07)**CONTROL OF GOODS, PRICES AND OTHER CHARGES  
(PETROLEUM PRICES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 1998**  
(Published on 31st March, 1998)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Commerce and Industry by section 3 of the Control of Goods, Prices and Other Charges Act, the following Regulations are hereby made:

1. (1) These Regulations may be cited as the Control of Goods, Prices and Other Charges (Petroleum Prices) (Amendment) Regulations, 1998. Citation and commencement  
(2) The Control of Goods, Prices and Other Charges (Petroleum Prices) (Amendment) Regulations, 1998, shall come into operation on the 1st of April, 1998.
2. The Control of Goods, Prices and Other Charges (Petroleum Prices) Regulations, 1997, is hereby amended by substituting for regulations 3 (c) thereto the following new regulation 3 (c) — Amendment of S.I. No 69 of 1997  
“(c) at any place not specified in the first column of the said Schedule, the petroleum products at the head of the four columns thereto, at a price exceeding by more than 14.5 thebe per litre.”
3. The Control of Goods, Prices and Other Charges (Petroleum Prices) Regulations, 1997, are hereby amended by substituting for the Schedule thereto the following new Schedule — Amendment of Schedule to S.I. No 69 of 1997
