#### 1. STENOGRAPHER

We regret to announce the death of Mr. S. K. QUARTEY, former Principal Secretary, Establishment Secretariat.

MR. SAMUEL KWATUKWEI QUARTEY was born on 1st March, 1922 by the late Mr. R. K. Quartey and Mrs. Abigail Quartey.

Mr. S. K. Quartey was educated at Accra Methodist School and Accra High School where he obtained the School Certificate with exemption from London Matriculation. He then entered the Gold Coast Civil Service as a Second Division Clerk on 1st March, 1942 and worked at the Supreme Court. He later won a Government Scholarship in 1947 to study in Britain where he obtained his B.A. Degree in 1951 at the London University.

On his return to Ghana, he was appointed Assistant Administrative Officer and rose through the Administrative hierarchy to the top post of Principal Secretary in May, 1964.

In the course of his career, he worked in many Government establishments. These included the Department of Public Relations, The Regional Organizations—Western, Eastern, Ashanti and Greater Accra Regions; the Ministries of Lands and Mineral Resources, State Enterprises Secretariat, Education and Culture, Housing, Justice, Office of N.R.C. and Establishment Secretariat.

He was married and left behind three children.
