AN ORDINANCE

Enacted by the Acting Commissioner for the Uganda Protectorate.

No. 2 of 1906.

Limitation of Liability of a Railway Administration in Respect of Carriage on Lake Victoria.

IT is hereby enacted as follows:-

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Railways (Amendment) Ordinance, 1906."

2. (1) When a Railway Administration contracts to carry passengers, animals or goods partly or wholly by conveyance on the waters of Lake Victoria, a condition exempting the Railway Administration from responsibility for any loss of life, personal injury or loss of or damage to animals or goods which may happen during the carriage on the waters of Lake Victoria from the King's enemies, fire, accidents from machinery boilers and steam, and all and every other dangers, accidents and perils of such Lake and navigation of whatsoever nature and kind shall, without being expressed, be deemed to be part of the contract, and, subject to that condition, and to any conditions expressed in the contract of carriage, the Railway Administration shall, irrespective of the nationality or ownership of the vessel used for carriage on Lake Victoria, be responsible for any loss of life, personal injury or loss of or damage to animals or goods which may happen during the carriage on Lake Victoria, to the extent to which it would be responsible under the Merchant Shipping Act 1894, if the ship were registered under that Act and the Railway Administration were owner of the ship, and not to any greater extent.

(2) The burden of proving that any such loss, injury or damage as is mentioned in subsection (1) happened during the carriage on Lake Victoria shall lie on the Railway

Administration.

Land Transfer.

IT is hereby enacted as follows:—

1. This Ordinance may be cited as the "Uganda Land Transfer Ordinance, Short title. 1906."

2. No Land in the occupation of, or held by, any native of the Protectorate, Transfer of land by or any right title or interest in or over any immoveable property so occupied or held, shall be transferred, either *inter vivos* or by will, either in perpetuity or for a term of years, to any person not a native of the Protectorate without the consent in writing of the Commissioner.

Bankruptcy and Lunacy.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Bankruptcy and Lunacy Ordinance, 1906."

2. The High Court shall have jurisdiction in Bankruptcy and Lunacy and shall exercise such jurisdiction in conformity with the substance of the law for the time being in force in England so far as circumstances admit.

Uganda Railway.

Wood Cutting Near Mackinnon Road Station.

The Manager of the Uganda Railway is prepared to receive tenders for cutting and stacking 600,000 cubic feet of wood fuel suitable for Locomotive purposes. The whole of the wood shall be cut between Mackinnon Road and Maungu stations and within one mile of the Railway; hard sound wood only will be accepted, none of the soft descriptions are useable and shall not be cut. The billets to be 2'-9" long by not less than 3" in diameter or more than 9 inches, if of larger diameter the wood must be split; on no account shall the trunks of trees be allowed to lie, all must be cut up and delivered.

The fuel shall be divested of branches and stacked within 100 feet of the line in stacks 100' length by 2'-9" width by 5' high. The first delivery should be within 2 months after signing the contract (the exact terms of which can be seen on application) and the entire quantity should if possible be supplied within six months.

Water will be supplied to the staff at site and labour will be carried at special concession

Any further information required can be obtained from the Locomotive Superintendent, Nairobi.

Tenders which must be submitted in writing in sealed covers before the 1st March 1906 should state the rate per 100 cubic feet and time of delivery.
