No elephant tusk weighing less than 30lbs., and no piece of ivory which in the opinion of an Officer engaged in the Civil Administration of the East Africa Protectorate formed part of a tusk under 30lbs., in weight shall be introduced into the East Africa Protectorate from the Uganda Protectorate unless it shall have been stamped with an official stamp and a registered number by a Customs Officer or Officer engaged in the Civil Administration of the Uganda Protectorate.

2. The fact that an elephant tusk or piece of ivory bears an Official stamp and registered number as required by the preceding rule shall be prima facie evidence that the tusk or piece of ivory was lawfully collected and possessed in the Uganda Protectorate and such tusk

or piece of ivory may be imported from the East Africa Protectorate.
