The area extending Eastward from the River Nile comprised within a circle having a radius of three miles with the Collector's present office as

centre.

GONDOKORO.

The area extending from the River Nile comprised within a circle having a radius of one and half miles with the Collector's present office

as centre.

FATIKO.

The area comprised within a circle having a radius of two miles with the Collector's present office as centre.
