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## UGANDA PROTECTORATE

### Proclamation.

(Under the Uganda Townships Ordinance 1903.)

By virtue of the powers conferred upon me by the Uganda Townships Ordinance 1903 I hereby declare the following places within the limits hereinafter set forth to be townships for the purposes of the aforesaid Ordinance.

KAMPALA.	The area comprised within a circle having a radius of three miles with the present Nakasero Fort as centre.
MASAKA.	The area comprised within a circle having a radius of one and half miles with the Collector's present office as centre.
JINJA.	The area extending Northward from the River Nile and the Victoria lake comprised within a circle having a radius of one and half miles with the present market place as centre.
MBALE.	The area comprised within a circle having a radius of two miles with the Collector's present office as centre.
HOIMA.	The area comprised within a circle having a radius of two and half miles with the present Collector's residence as centre.
MASINDI.	The area comprised within a circle having a radius of one and half miles with the Collector's present office as centre.
MBARARA.	The area extending Northward from the River RUIZI (Ruwezi) comprised within a circle having a radius of one mile with the Collector's present Office as centre.
FORT PORTAL.	An area comprised within a circle having a radius of 2 miles with the Collector's present office as centre.
NIMULE.	The area extending Eastward from the River Nile comprised within a circle having a radius of three miles with the Collector's present office as centre.
GONDOKORO.	The area extending from the River Nile comprised within a circle having a radius of one and half miles with the Collector's present office as centre.
FATIKO.	The area comprised within a circle having a radius of two miles with the Collector's present office as centre.

And I hereby apply Rules 1-5, 21, 24-63, 65, 66, 69-75, 77-79, 81-84, 86-104, 107-109, 113, and 117-127 of the Townships Rules 1903 to the said Townships.
