## At the Court at Buckingham Palace,

The 30th day of June, 1906.

PRESENT,

### THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty has power and jurisdiction within the East Africa and Uganda Protectorates:

And whereas by the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order in Council, 1905, provision is made with respect to the currency of the two Protectorates, and it is expedient to make further provision with respect thereto:

NOW THEREFORE His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order in Council, 1905, shall be read and have effect as if—

(a) The following article were substituted for Article 8 of that Order—

“8. In the making of any existing subsidiary coin or new subsidiary coin a remedy, or variation from the standard weight, and, in the case of silver coins, from the standard fineness, required by this Order, shall be allowed of an amount not exceeding that specified as respects weight and fineness respectively in the Third Schedule to this Order”; and

(b) the Schedule to this Order were substituted for the Third Schedule to that Order.

2. This Order shall come into operation in each Protectorate on such day as may be fixed by the Commissioner by proclamation.

3. This Order shall be read as one with the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order in Council, 1905, and may be cited as the East Africa and Uganda (Currency) Order in Council, 1906.

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and the Right Honourable the Earl of Elgin, K.G., one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein.

**Notice.****THE EXPORTATION OF THE HORNS SKINS ETC., OF GAME.**

Whereas it appears that certain persons have introduced into this Protectorate from adjacent territories the horns skins etc of game in the belief that such horns skins etc may be lawfully exported from this Protectorate for sale, and whereas the exportation from this Protectorate for sale of the horns skins etc of game within the meaning of the East Africa Game Ordinance 1906 is prohibited. Notice is hereby given that after the 31st day of October 1906, no horn, skin, bone, feather or flesh or any other part of any animal mentioned in any of the Schedules of the aforesaid Ordinance, other than elephant tusks, hippopotamus teeth and the horns skins etc of animals which have been kept in a domesticated state, shall be permitted to be exported from this Protectorate whether such horn skin etc shall have been imported into this Protectorate from adjacent territories or not, and any person who shall export or attempt to export the same will be liable to the penalties which may be imposed under the aforesaid Ordinance.

## The following Notice is published for general information.

No. 434. In consequence of representations which have been made to me by the Governor of the District of Lourenço Marques as to the necessity of taking precaution to prevent the introduction into this Province of the disease called "Surra"; and by virtue of the Ministerial Authority granted to this Government in a telegram dated May 23rd in the terms of Section 1 of Article 5 of the Regulations approved by Decree of December 28th 1905:—

I do hereby decree as follows:—

1. The importation is prohibited into any part of the Province of camels, dromedaries, horses, asses, oxen, sheep and goats which come from the Ports of East Africa comprised between Rovuma and Port Said or which may have passed through them.

2. The transport of animals actually in the Province to the North of the Save River is prohibited to the Ports to the south of that river.

The authorities and other persons whom these Regulations concern shall duly carry out and execute them.
