Uganda Railway.

TENDERS are invited for the supply of the following Rations required for the Uganda Railway for a period of one year commencing from 1st January 1907, under the following conditions:—

(1). The rations required, and the approximate quantities to be supplied *monthly*, are as follows:—

Flour	21 tons per month.
Dhall	3½ " " "
Rice Halwa	35 " " "

(2). The quantities may be varied within the limits stated and notice of the actual quantities required in any month will be given six weeks in advance. It shall be open to the Manager, should he so desire, to take 2 months supply of flour and rice at a time and on receipt of six weeks' notice to this effect the Contractor shall supply the same.

(3). The rations are to be in good condition in quantities as required, and delivered in gunny bags at Kilindini Ration Sheds, or elsewhere at Kilindini or Mombasa as may be desired by the Manager, at the sole risk and expense of the Contractor.

(4). The rations must be of good and approved quality and payment will be made upon the actual net weight or quantity received.

(5). In the event of the Contractor failing to supply the required quantity of rations within six weeks of receiving notice to supply or if the quality is unsatisfactory the Manager shall be at liberty to procure the rations elsewhere and the Contractor shall bear all extra expense, if any, incurred by his so doing.

(6). All orders for rations shall be made out on printed forms and signed by the Assistant Loco Superintendent (Stores). A priced invoice must be sent with each delivery and the signature of a responsible employé of the Railway must be obtained before the delivery is considered as complete.

(7). The Manager reserves to himself the right to accept a tender for the whole or any part of the rations required and does not bind himself to accept the lowest or any tender.

(8). The Contractor shall be required to enter into a bond, to the value of three months' supply of the articles to be provided by him, for the due and proper completion of his contract.

(9). Tenders should reach the Manager at Nairobi not later than the 10th October 1906. The rates should be exclusive of Customs duty.
