ON THE NORTH: - Dudinet Hil-Ndonogaria Hill-Eldalat Hill-Nolosegelli River.

ON THE WEST:—Morobusi Hill-Surangai Hill-thence following the edge of the Escarpment to Chabkaikak Hill. Thence to Chamagomwa Hill-Chepkirua Hill-Silumo Hill-Chapilat Hill.

ON THE SOUTH:—Following edge of the Escarpment to the Nandi-Kibigori road at Chibongwa Hillthence following the Nandi-Kibigori road to Kibigori Station, thence following the Railway to bridge over Kibigori River.

ON THE EAST:—Kibigori River, Chapchuri River, Kundos River, Kirondiu River to the Nandi Fort-Kapsikak road, following road to Kapsikak Hill-thence East to Chamin River, and following the Chamin River round salt lick to the eastern bend of the Sclater roadthence in a straight line to Dudinet Hill.
