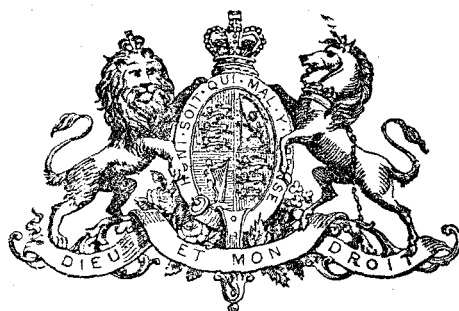

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## EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

### Proclamation.

#### Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906.

Whereas an outbreak of Swine Fever has occurred on the Molo and Njoro Estates of Lord Delamere and whereas certain pigs have been removed from the aforesaid estates to Mr. J. R. Wood's Farm at Kyambu. Now therefore in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906. I hereby declare the said Estates and Farm to be infected areas within the meaning of the aforesaid Ordinance.
