## EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

The following despatch received from His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies is published for general information.

June 18th 1907.

Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of Mr. Jackson's despatch of the 9th of April forwarding a report of the trial and conviction of Captain Grogan and Messrs Bowker, Gray, Fichat, and Low, on charges arising out of the flogging of natives in Nairobi on the 14th of March. I have also received Mr. Jackson's telegram of the 23rd of April transmitting a message from the Colonists' Association complaining of the action of the local administration and of a statement reported to have been made by me in the House of Lords and asking that a Commission might be appointed to enquire into these and other alleged grievances.

2. The report shows that the offenders had a fair and full trial, and that there was little dispute as to the facts. The contention of the defendants, with the exception of Low, who claimed that he was a mere spectator, was that the flogging was justified because the natives had been guilty of insulting white women; e.g., the defendant Bowker expressed himself as follows:—

“As it has always been the first principle with me to flog a nigger on sight who insults a white woman, I felt it my bounden duty to take the step I did, and that in a public place as a warning to the natives.”

3. I fully appreciate the importance attached by the white settlers to the protection of their wives and families from insult or assault. But I have to point out that the law provides most severe penalties for such offences. Under the 376th section of the Indian Penal Code, which is in force in the Protectorate, the crime of rape is punishable with transportation for life; under the 354th section indecent assault is punishable with two years hard labour; and under the 509th section an insult to the modesty of a woman, not amounting to assault, renders the offender liable to one year's imprisonment.

4. Natives charged with such offences would be tried by white magistrates and judges, who would not be inclined to be unduly lenient to offenders, particularly if the injured party were a white woman. But, as a matter of fact, it does not appear that any crimes of this nature have been brought before the Courts of the Protectorate, and it is accordingly impossible to plead delay or refusal of justice as a justification for the action of the defendants in the present case in taking the law into their own hands. Moreover, it appears from your telegram of the 3rd ultimo, that the insult alleged was of the most trivial character, and involved no indecency.

5. The place and the circumstances of the flogging, in front of the Court House and in spite of the protest of the Magistrate, make it clear that it was intended to be a deliberate defiance of settled order and government, and the offenders were fortunate in not being convicted on the more serious charges of riot and assault on a public officer. The conduct of the defendant Fichat, who appears from the evidence to have deliberately spread a report that white women had been indecently assaulted, well knowing it to be false, cannot be too strongly reprobated. No doubt many persons were thus led to take part in the assembly who would not have done so if the true facts had been known to them.

6. With regard to the telegraphic message from the Colonists' Association, I see no ground for saying that the prosecution of the offenders in this case was a political one, unless there is a party in Nairobi which advocates as a policy the indiscriminate flogging of natives for trivial offences without trial; and the question whether many of the Europeans present at the flogging were armed or not does not materially affect the gravity of the offence committed. I see no reason, therefore, for appointing a Commission to enquire into the circumstances of the flogging, which are in other respects sufficiently established by the evidence given at the trial.

7. The fears of a native rising which induced some of those who took part in the flogging to demand arms and ammunition for their protection do not appear to have had any foundation. I am bound to observe, however, that the commission of such flagrant acts of lawlessness and injustice as those of which the defendants in this case have been found guilty is the surest way to provoke an outbreak. In the interests not only of the natives (constituting as they do an immense majority of the population) but also of the innocent white inhabitants, it is the duty of the Government to restrain and punish those who commit such acts, and you will be able, if necessary, to make use of the provisions of the East Africa Order in Council, 1902, which authorise the deportation of any person who conducts himself so as to be dangerous to peace and good order in East Africa.

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## Proclamation.

### Under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section 4 of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906 I hereby prohibit the movement of cattle into or out of the District of Machakos with the exception of cattle intended for slaughter which may be removed from the district under the conditions following:—

(1) Any person desiring to remove bullocks for slaughter must obtain from the Office of the Chief Veterinary Officer a permit in which shall be specified the number of cattle which may be removed and the date on which they may be removed.

(2) No cattle will be permitted to leave the district until they have been inspected and branded by the inspector at Machakos and the permit authorising their removal has been countersigned by him.

Enacted by His Majesty's Commissioner for the Uganda Protectorate.

### No. 3 of 1907.

#### Authentication of Documents Executed out of the Protectorate.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Authentication of Signatures to Short title. Documents Ordinance, 1907".

2. In this Ordinance, unless inconsistent with the context : Interpretation  
"document" shall mean any deed, contract, power of attorney, affidavit or of Terms.  
other writing not of a public nature.

"authentication" shall mean when applied to a document the verification of  
any signature thereon.

3. Any document executed outside the Protectorate shall be deemed to be Authentication  
sufficiently authenticated for the purpose of use in the Protectorate if:— of Documents  
executed out-  
side the  
Protectorate  
for use in the  
Protectorate.

(a) In the case of a document executed in the United Kingdom it be  
duly authenticated by a Notary Public under his signature and seal of office ;

(b) In the case of a document executed in any part of His Majesty's  
Dominions outside Africa and the United Kingdom it be duly  
authenticated by the signature and seal of office of the Mayor of  
any town or of a Notary Public or of the Permanent Head of any  
Government Department in any such part of His Majesty's  
Dominions ;

(c) (i) In the case of a document executed in any of His Majesty's  
Colonies or Protectorates in Africa, it be duly authenticated by  
the signature and seal of office of any Notary Public, Resident  
Magistrate, Permanent Head of a Government Department, or  
Resident Commissioner or Assistant Commissioner in or of any  
such Colony or Protectorate.

(ii) and further, in the case of a document executed in the East Africa Protectorate, it be authenticated by any person holding a similar position in the East Africa Protectorate to any person who could authenticate such document in Uganda and in a manner which complies with the formalities necessary for the authentication of documents in Uganda.

(d) In the case of a document executed in any place outside His Majesty's Dominions (in this section described as a foreign place) it be duly authenticated by the signature and seal of office ;

(i) of a British Consul or Vice Consul of such foreign place ;

(ii) of any Secretary of State, Under Secretary of State, Governor, Colonial Secretary or any other person in such foreign place who shall be shown by the certificate of the Consul or Vice Consul in the Protectorate of such foreign place to be duly authorised under the law of such foreign place to authenticate such document.

When property

not exceed  
£200 in value.

4. Notwithstanding anything in the last preceding section contained it shall be sufficient authentication of a document executed outside the Protectorate in any part of His Majesty's Dominions for use in the Protectorate which affects or relates to property not exceeding in amount or value two hundred pounds sterling if there be appended to or endorsed on such document a statement signed by a Magistrate or a Justice of the Peace of the part of His Majesty's Dominions in which such document is executed :—

(a) that the person executing such document is a person known to him : or

(b) that two other persons (known to him) have severally testified before him that the person executing such document is a person known to each of them.

5. Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall affect the law of evidence in force in the Protectorate as to the proof of any document in legal proceedings nor shall affect the special provisions of any other law as to authentication of any document.
