EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

The following Bill was read a first time at the meeting of the Legislative Council held on December 9th 1907.

A Bill

To make provision for the appointment of an Official Administrator of Intestate Estate and to define the power and duties of such Officer:—

Short title.

1. This Ordinance may be cited as “the Administrator General’s Ordinance 1908.”

Interpretation.

2. In the interpretation of this Ordinance the following terms shall unless the context otherwise indicates have the meanings set against them respectively, that is to say:—

“Estate” shall mean all freehold and leasehold land, and chattels real, and all goods, chattels, moneys, choses in action and other property whatsoever:

“Administrator General” shall mean the Administrator of Intestate Estates appointed under this Ordinance.

“Agent” shall mean an agent of the Administrator General duly appointed as provided in Section 3 of this Ordinance:

“Prescribed” means prescribed by any Rules and Regulations to be made under this Ordinance.

“Court” shall mean the High Court of the East Africa Protectorate:

“European Officer” shall mean person of European or American origin in the public service of the Protectorate:

Administrator General of Intestate Estate.

3. (1) It shall be lawful for the Governor to appoint some fit and proper person to be Administrator General

(2) The Administrator General shall appoint such person or persons as he shall think fit to act as his agents in the managing, collecting and getting in of property belonging to the deceased person whose estates are in course of administration by him. Such agents shall in all respects act in the management collection and getting in of such property under the direction of the Administrator General, who shall not be answerable for any act or omission of any agent not in conformity with such direction or which shall not have happened by the Administrator General’s own fault or neglect. Every agent shall find security to the satisfaction of the Administrator General for the performance of his duty. Agents shall be remunerated either by salary or by such fees or portion thereof chargeable under this Ordinance as the Governor in Council shall fix.

Suits by or against Administrator General.

(3) In all proceedings under this Ordinance and in all proceedings at law the Administrator General shall sue and be sued by the name of “the Administrator General” and it shall be necessary to state and to prove his authority and title in the specific Estate to which the proceedings may relate, but not his general authority or appointment.

(4) Whenever the Office of Administrator General shall become vacant by the death or removal or absence from the Protectorate of the Administrator General for the time being and another officer shall be appointed to that office during the pendency of any petition, action, suit or other proceeding, such petition, action, suit or other proceeding shall not abate or become defective, but shall be continued by or against the officer newly appointed.

Office of Administrator General falling vacant.

(5) Neither the Administrator General nor any agent shall be personally liable to any person in respect of goods or chattels in the possession at the time of his death of any person whose Estate shall be administered by the Administrator General, which shall be sold by the Administrator General or such agents unless the Administrator General or agent shall know or have actual notice before the sale that such goods or chattels were not in fact the property of the person whose Estate is being administered by him, and generally neither the Administrator General nor any agent shall be liable for any act done by him *bonâ fide* in the supposed and the intended performance of their duties unless it shall be shown that such act was done not only illegally, but wilfully or with gross negligence. Provided always that in case of any sale by the Administrator General or any Agent of goods or chattels belonging in fact to any third person the amount realized by such sale thereof shall be paid over to the owner upon proof by him of such ownership, unless the same shall have already been applied in payment of the debts of the deceased or shall have been distributed according to any will of the deceased in the ordinary course of administration whilst the Administrator General or Agent was in ignorance and without actual notice of the claim of such person to the goods or chattels sold.

Administrator General or his agents not liable for acts done in performance of their duties

4. The Administrator General shall cause inquiry to be made as to the Estates of all deceased persons possessed of or entitled to any property, real or personal within this Protectorate; and after receiving information

- (a) that any such person died intestate, or
- (b) that the deceased having made a will devising or bequeathing his estate has omitted to appoint an executor, or
- (c) that the person or persons named as executor or executors in the will have renounced probate thereof; or
- (d) that probate or letters of administration with the will annexed has not been obtained within six months from the death of the testator; or

Intestacy.

No executor.

Renunciation by executors.

Probate not obtained within six months.

Administrator General appointed sole executor.

Fourteen days notice to be given of application.

Where estate will probably be lost or damaged by delay.

Probate and administration may be granted to other person.

Duties and liabilities of Administrator General to cease.

Administrator General to take charge of property on death of agent.

(e) that the deceased has named the Administrator General as sole executor of his will,

he may apply to the High Court for an order authorising him to administer the Estate of such deceased person.

5. The Administrator General shall serve a notice of his intention to apply for such order upon all executors and next of kin of the deceased known to him to be resident in the Protectorate and shall cause such notice to be published in the Official Gazette and to be posted in a conspicuous place at the High Court and after the expiration of fourteen days from the date of such publication and posting he shall apply to the High Court for an order to administer the estate of such deceased person; and the said Court shall, if satisfied by affidavit that the case is within the provisions of this Ordinance, make such order upon the petition of the Administrator General accordingly; which order when made, shall give to the Administrator General the same power over all the estate wheresoever situate or left of the deceased person, except as hereby enacted, as he would have had, if letters of administration of such Estate had been granted to him, subject nevertheless to any order or orders which may from time to time be made by the Court on petition as hereinafter mentioned touching the same or the administration thereof; provided always that the Court may order such further notice as it may think fit to be given before making such order.

6. The Administrator General may at any time after the death of any deceased person without any previous notice obtain an order to administer the estate of such person, where the High Court shall be satisfied by affidavit that the estate or any portion thereof will otherwise probably be purloined, lost, destroyed or damaged or that great expense will be incurred by delay in the matter.

7. Notwithstanding any order which shall have been made authorising the Administrator General to administer under this Ordinance the High Court may grant probate of the will or letters of administration of the Estate of any deceased person to any person in such manner and subject to such limitations and conditions as such Court shall think proper; but no application for such grant shall be made until seven days after notice in writing of intention to make such application shall have been left at the Office of the Administrator General. Whenever any such grant shall have been obtained, then immediately all the interest, powers, rights and duties of the Administrator General in regard to the estate affected by such grant, and all liabilities of the Administrator General under any contract or agreement entered into by him in relation to such estate or any part thereof, shall cease; and such portion of the estate as shall be left unadministered by the Administrator General shall vest in the executor or administrator obtaining such grant, subject nevertheless to all lawful contracts theretofore made relating to such estate and to the allowance and payment of all outlays, disbursements, costs, fees, charges and expenses, reasonably incurred in the administration thereof.

8. Should at any time the agent or agents in charge of any estate belonging to a merchant not residing in the Protectorate die leaving estate, without any responsible person in charge thereof, the Administrator

General shall, on such fact coming to his notice, apply to the Court for an order to take charge of such property and the Court shall make such order in the case as it shall think fit.

9. In all cases where an order to administer shall have been made under this Ordinance, it shall be lawful, except as hereinafter provided, for the Court on the petition on the Administrator General or any person interested in the estate to decide all disputes, matters, claims and demands in respect thereof and to make such orders as it shall think fit touching the collection, sale, investment, disposal or administration of such estate.

Provided nevertheless that in any case in which it shall appear to be not desirable that the matter in question should be so decided, the Court may direct such proceedings to be instituted as shall appear proper for the due decision thereof.

10. In the case of deceased persons leaving estate in the Protectorate the District Commissioner of the District may when he shall deem it advisable for the protection of the estate take possession thereof; and in such case he shall forthwith report his action to the Administrator General who shall give such directions and take such proceedings in the matter as he shall think fit.

11. (1) The Administrator General shall, except as hereinafter provided in respect to the estates of deceased European Officers, convert into money all the estate which he is ordered to administer, unless order be made to the contrary by the Court, and shall pay all moneys received by him from time to time in the course of administration into the Protectorate Treasury to the account of such estate.

(2) He shall cause advertisements to be published in the Official Gazette, and in such other manner as he shall deem expedient calling upon the creditors of the persons whose estates he shall have been ordered to administer to come in and prove their debts before him within the space of two months from the date of publication. He shall, after the expiration of such months, pay the debts proved, and if the whole thereof cannot be paid he shall pay a dividend thereon; if he shall collect any further assets after making such payment, he shall, in case any part of the debts proved remain unpaid, pay the same, and any debts subsequently proved before him, or a dividend thereon; but such debts as shall be subsequently proved, shall first be paid a dividend in proportion to their amount equal to the dividend paid to creditors having previously proved their debts. After payment of all debts, fees and expenses incident to the collection, management, and administration of such estate, he shall pay over the residue to the persons beneficially entitled thereto. Where such persons are resident outside the Protectorate payment may

be made to any agent or representative duly authorised to receive the same; or remittances made by registered letter shall be deemed equivalent to payment.

- (3) Estates shall be distributed by the Administrator General according to the ordinary rules of law within any period not exceeding 12 years: on the expiry of that period all estates or portions thereof in respect of which no claim shall have been lodged with the Administrator General shall lapse or be escheat to the Crown: provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor to dispose of and distribute the same, or any part thereof to or among any kindred of the deceased or other person having or seeming likely to have a claim thereto, in such shares or manner as he may think fit.

Accounts to be kept.

12. The Administrator General shall make a complete inventory of every estate which he is ordered to administer, and shall keep an account of all receipts, payments and dealings with every such estate, he shall retain all letters received and copies of all letters written by him, and all deeds, writings and papers of or relating to such estate and shall permit all persons interested to inspect and take copies of the same.

Court may order partition of land.

13. Any person beneficially interested in any land vested in the Administrator General may apply by petition to the Court for a partition thereof; and the Court, if satisfied that such partition would be beneficial to all persons interested may appoint one or more arbitrators to effect the same. The report and final award of such arbitrators, setting forth the particulars of the land allotted to each of the parties interested, shall, when signed by them and confirmed by order of the Court, be effectual without any further conveyance, to vest in each allottee the land so allotted; and if such allotment be made subject to the charge of any money payable to any other party interested for equalizing the partition such charge shall take effect according to the terms and conditions in regard to time and mode of payment and otherwise which shall be expressed in such award.

Estates of deceased European Officers.

14. The Administrator General shall apply for an order to administer the estate of any European Officer leaving estate within the jurisdiction of the Court, without a widow or next of kin within such jurisdiction. The administration of such estate shall be limited to getting in and realizing the assets of the deceased within the jurisdiction, paying liabilities and remitting the balance to the legal personal representative of the deceased. Such remittances shall be made by the Protectorate Treasurer at the request of the Administrator General instructing the Crown Agents to pay the same. Provided that the Administrator General shall cause any watch, jewellery, letters or other property of such deceased which in his opinion ought not to be sold, to be securely packed and forwarded to the Crown Agents for the Colonies. The Administrator General shall give notice to the Governor that this has been done and request him to notify the Crown Agents that such articles have been despatched for delivery to the legal personal representative of the deceased.

When the accounts of the administrator shall have been passed by the High Court the administrator shall forthwith transmit to the Governor an office copy of the accounts filed in the Court, of the vouchers relating thereto, of the affidavit in verification, and of the certificate of the passing thereof. In the event of an administration not being completed within the period of three months from the date of the death of such officer the Administrator General shall report the same to the Governor stating the cause of delay in the completion of such administration and the Governor shall forward such report to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

15. The District Commissioner of any district in the Protectorate in which any deceased European officer has left any goods shall of his own motion forthwith on the death of such deceased take steps to secure such goods. The Administrator General may request such District Commissioner to get in and realize the assets and pay the debts of such deceased in such district and in other respects to assist in the administration and may if necessary apply for and obtain a direction of the Court to such District Commissioner to such effect.

District Commissioner to secure property and assist administration in Protectorate.

16. On the completion of the Administration of an estate the Administrator General shall file in Court his accounts and vouchers relating to the same, together with an affidavit in verification; and after fourteen clear days' notice has been given by the Administrator General to all persons interested who are resident in the Protectorate setting forth a day and hour to be appointed by the taxing officer for the passing of such accounts, the same may be examined and taxed by the taxing officer in the presence of any person who may attend upon such notice; and objection may be taken to the account or to any item or parts thereof, and the taxation thereof brought under review by the High Court in the same manner, as near as may be, as in the case of any proceeding in Court.

Accounts to be passed in Court.

A certificate under the hand of the taxing officer or of a judge of the High Court to the effect that the accounts have been examined and found correct shall be a valid and effectual discharge in favour of the Administrator General as against all persons whatsoever.

17. The Administrator General may by leave of the Court on giving such notice as in the last preceding section mentioned, and subject to such terms as to the future administration of the estate as the Court may deem just, pass any account prior to the completion of the administration.

18. (1) There shall be paid to the Administrator General or his agents out of every estate administered by him five per cent on the amount or gross value of the estate administered.

Commission to be paid to Administrator.

(2) The Administrator General shall be entitled to reimburse himself for any payments made by him or his agents in respect of any estate in his or their charge which a private administrator of such estate might have lawfully made; but save as aforesaid, the commission to which the Administrator General shall be entitled is intended to cover, not merely the trouble of collecting the estate,

but all his trouble and responsibility in distributing them in due course of administration.

- (3) The whole of the commission received by the Administrator General shall be paid by him into the Protectorate Treasury and shall form part of the public revenue of the Protectorate.

Annual report of the Administrator General.

19. The Administrator General shall furnish to the Treasurer in the month of April in each year a statement showing the amount of money received, paid and expended in each case, of the estates being administered and administered by him during the previous financial year.

Rules and Regulations.

20. It shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to make and, as he shall think fit to revoke, amend and vary regulations for

- (a) fixing the remuneration to be allowed to the Administrator General whether by fee or salary.
- (b) defining the duties of the Administrator General and making provisions for the better performance thereof.
- (c) defining the power and liabilities of agents, appointing such persons as may be thought advisable to be *ex-officio* agents, fixing the amount of security to be given by agents, and generally regulating their duties.
- (d) making Rules prescribing forms and otherwise making provisions for the better carrying out of the purposes of this Ordinance.

This Ordinance not to affect the provisions of the Native Estates Administration Rules orders 1899.

31. Nothing in this Ordinance contained shall affect the provisions of the Native Estates Administration Rules and Orders 1899 save that the High Court or a Court subordinate thereto other than a Native Subordinate Court may appoint the Administrator General to administer the estate of any deceased native dying within its jurisdiction.

1. The following fees shall be payable by the owner of any animal impounded in the Township of Nairobi under rule 186 of the Township Rules 1904:—

On cattle per head per day or part of a day	... Cents 50
On horses, mares, foals, mules, zebras, camels per head per day or part of a day	... Cents 50
On donkeys, sheep, goats, swine per head per day or part of a day	... Cents 25

2. The fees payable under these rules shall be paid to the Pound Master or at the Office of the Town Clerk by the owner of any animal impounded prior to its release from the pound.

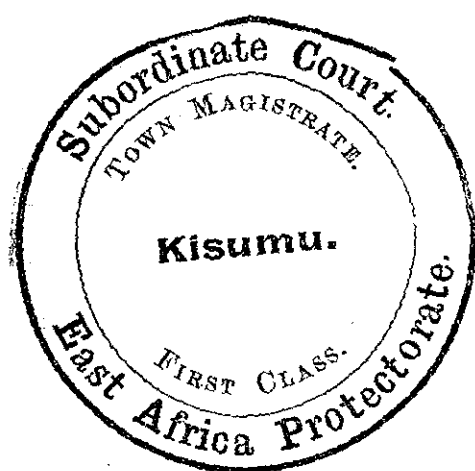

ISSUE OF YOUNG TREES AND TREE SEEDS BY THE FOREST DEPARTMENT.

To encourage tree planting, young trees and tree seeds are issued by Government at cost price. The price is the same whatever the quantity taken. Applications for young trees must be accompanied by a *remittance in cash or by postal order* made payable to the Chief Conservator of Forests, Nairobi. Cheques cannot be accepted.

The prices for plants include the cost of pots or planting pans. If these are returned they will be paid for in cash or other young trees. Larger plants in separate tins or pots, plants not up to standard size, as well as surplus stock, seed, or plants, will be charged for at special rates which will be furnished upon application at the nurseries. For very remote localities the cost of transport can be reduced by taking out the seedlings and packing them in moss, but there is some risk in so doing. When such seedlings are received they should be pricked out at once into pots or pans. They will then become transplants ready for planting out in three or four months.

Seed. Every precaution is taken to ensure the genuineness and good quality of the seed supplied, but it cannot be guaranteed, particularly as most of it has to be imported. In Eucalypt seed the fertile and barren seed are supplied mixed; it is often impossible to separate or distinguish them.
