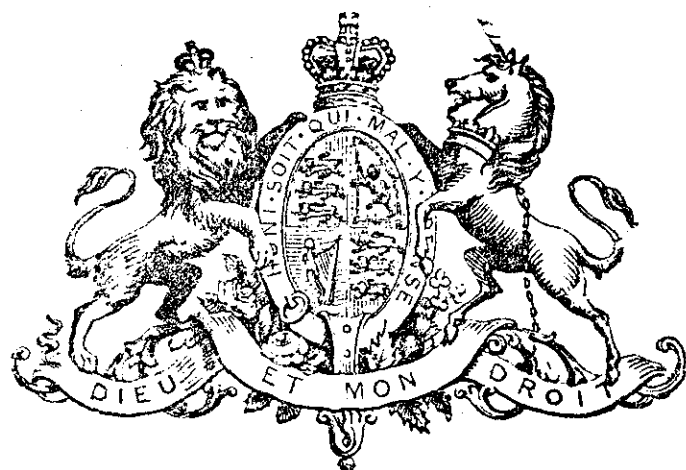

# EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

## H. M. HIGH COURT OF EAST AFRICA.

Rules made by the High Court with the approval of the Governor under Article 22 of the East Africa Order in Council 1902 and Article 11 of the East Africa Order in Council 1906.

### Rules of Court No. 2 of 1908.

(1.) These Rules may be cited as Rules of Court (attachment and sale of property) No. 2 of 1908.

(2.) These Rules shall apply to attachments and sales under warrants and orders issued by Civil Courts in the East Africa Protectorate.

(3.) (a.) Fees for the execution of warrants and orders of attachment and sale shall be chargeable in accordance with the Schedule hereto annexed, provided that outside the limits of such places as have been declared to be Municipalities or Townships under any law constituting such Municipalities or Townships, and in special cases special terms may be arranged in each case and agreed beforehand by the Court issuing the warrant or order and the person to whom it is addressed.

(b.) The Officer by whom such terms may be arranged on behalf of the High Court shall be the Registrar, Deputy Registrar or District Registrar as the case may be.

(4.) Any Court shall be at liberty to employ such person to execute its warrants or orders for attachment as it may deem advisable, but in the absence of any special reason it shall employ licensed brokers and where there are more licensed brokers than one available a list shall be kept of such brokers who shall be called on in rotation.

(5.) In the event of any broker refusing a warrant or order, his name shall go to the bottom of the list and may at the discretion of the Court employing him be removed entirely from the list.

(6.) Where a sum for which execution has been issued is tendered to a broker entrusted with the execution before or at the time of or within half an hour after attaching the property together with his legally recoverable fees and expenses to that time he shall not be entitled to charge possession fees.

(7.) All expenses of advertisements, inventories, catalogues, insurance and all necessary charges for safe guarding property under attachment shall be payable by brokers out of their fees and shall not be charged for additionally.

(8.) Fee No. 13 in the Schedule to Rules of Court 3 of 1906 is hereby amended to read as follow :—

“On every warrant of attachment or sale of property.....  
such sum as the Court may certify under Rules of Court 2 of 1908”.

7. (1) The provisions of the Code of Civil Procedure and Rules of Court for the time being in force in the East Africa Protectorate relating to the summoning attendance and examination of witnesses and to the remuneration of and penalties to be imposed upon witnesses shall apply to persons required to give evidence or to produce documents under these rules and for the purposes of this rule an examiner appointed under these rules shall be deemed to be a Civil Court.
- (2) An examiner appointed under these rules may apply to any Court within the local limits of whose jurisdiction a witness resides for the issue of any process which he may find it necessary to issue to or against such witness and such Court may in its discretion issue such process as it considers reasonable and proper.

8. Rules 2 to 7 of this order shall apply, as far as may be, to applications under the Evidence by Commission Act, 1859 (22 Vict. c. 20), for the purpose of giving effect to any Commission or Letter of Request from any British Tribunal out of the jurisdiction, except that in such cases the depositions certified as above provided and Letter of Request, if any, shall be forwarded by the Registrar of the High Court to His Majesty's Secretary of State for the Colonies, or, in the case of a Letter of Request from a Judge of an Indian Court, to His Majesty's Secretary of State for India.

9. Where a Commission Rogatoire, or Letter of Request, as mentioned in Rule 2 of this Order, is transmitted to the High Court by His Majesty's Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs with an intimation that it is desirable that effect should be given to the same without requiring an application to be made to the Court by the agents in the East Africa Protectorate of any of the parties to the action or matter in the foreign country, the Registrar of the High Court shall transmit the same to the Crown Advocate, who may thereupon, make such applications and take such steps as may be necessary to give effect to such Commission Rogatoire, or Letter of Request, in accordance with Rules 2 to 7 of this Order.

## PROCLAMATION.

**Under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906.**

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, I hereby declare the area described in the Schedule below to be an infected area and I prohibit the movement of cattle from this area into any other district or area of the British East Africa Protectorate.

### Schedule.

Owing to the prevalence of Rinderpest in Abyssinia and the Boran Country no cattle from either of these places are allowed to enter the Provinces of Jubaland, Tanaland, Seyidie, Ukambani, Kenya, Naivasha or Kisumu, nor are any cattle from Jubaland or Tanaland allowed to enter the last named five Provinces.

The Proclamation under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1907, which appeared in the "Official Gazette" of May 1st 1908 page 269 is hereby cancelled.

**( Under the Land Acquisition Act, 1894. )**
