It was with the profoundest regret that intelligence was received on Saturday the 7th May of the death of his late MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTY KING EDWARD VII, EMPEROR OF INDIA. HIS MAJESTY expired at Buckingham Palace at 11-45 on the evening of the sixth instant to the great affliction of the ROYAL FAMILY and of all classes of HIS MAJESTY'S subjects.

The deep sense of loyalty and affectionate sympathy evinced by BRITISH subjects in every part of the EMPIRE, is shared to the fullest extent by all classes in the PROTECTORATE, and has been more particularly expressed by the various representative bodies of the community. These expressions of sorrow and sympathy will be duly forwarded to HIS MOST GRACIOUS MAJESTY THE KING.

PROCLAMATION.

The East Africa Outlying Districts Ordinance 1902.

In exercise of the powers conferred upon me under the East Africa Outlying Districts Ordinance 1902, I, Sir Edouard Percy Cranwill Girouard, K.C.M.G., D.S.O., R.E., Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, do hereby declare that the area and road mentioned in the Schedule hereto attached, and which are located in the Nyanza Province, are excluded from the provisions of the above noted Ordinance.

(1) Asembo Trading Site, Kisumu District.

Commencing at a point on the Lake shore Beacon No. 1, 33 yards North East of the Government Pier, thence bounded by a line in a North Westerly direction (parallel to the road to Kisumu) for 1,000 yards through beacons 2, 3, 4 and 5 to beacon No. 6, thence in a North Easterly direction for 114 yards to beacon No. 7, thence in a North Westerly direction for 150 yards to beacon No. 8, thence by a line in a Westerly direction (on the East side of the road) to cut the road at beacon Nos. 9 and 10 and on to beacon No. 11, a distance of 300 yards, thence in a South Easterly direction for 150 yards to beacon No. 12, thence in a North Easterly direction for 114 yards to beacon No. 13, thence in a South Easterly direction (parallel to the road to Kisumu) passing through beacons Nos. 14, 15, 16, 17 to beacon No. 18 on the Lake shore and thence by Lake shore to beacon No. 1 the point of commencement.

(2) Asembo Trading Station Road.

Commencing from Asembo Trading Station, thence in a Northerly direction until it joins the Kisumu-Kadimu bridle path. Thence along the bridle path in an Easterly direction through Seminear the villages of Headman Odongo and Kolo, and through Kisumu sub-district near the village of Headman Ogola to a point where it cuts the present Kisumu Yala Road about 200 yards South of the Okeo River crossing.

RULES.**The East Africa Townships Ordinance 1903.**

Rules issued by H. E. The Governor under the East Africa Townships Ordinance 1903.

Nairobi,

Dated this 4th day of May, 1910.

1. These Rules shall apply to the Township of Kismayu.

2. The fee specified in the Schedule hereto shall be paid by the occupier of every house within the Township of Kismayu, and such fee shall be paid to the District Commissioner at his office, or to such person as the Provincial Commissioner may appoint. Provided, however, that in the case of premises subdivided and let to lodgers or various tenants the person receiving the rent payable by the lodgers or tenants whether on his own account or as an agent for any person entitled thereto or entrusted therein, shall pay the prescribed fee.

3. The fees prescribed in the Schedule hereto shall become due on the first day of April, the first day of July, the first day of October and the first day of January in each year, provided that the first payment under these Rules shall become due on the first day of July, 1910.

4. When any house shall remain unoccupied for not less than one calendar month, the District Commissioner shall, on application, make a rebate or refund of the proportionate amount of the fee payable in respect of such house or hut, provided that no such refund shall be made unless the application is made within three months from the date on which the house became unoccupied.

5. The term "house" shall include any building of whatsoever material constructed used as a place of residence or as a shop or warehouse or as business premises.

6. Classification of houses for the purposes of these Rules shall, from time to time, be made by the District Commissioner or by such person as the Provincial Commissioner shall appoint and shall be publicly notified in such manner as the Provincial Commissioner shall direct.

RULES.**Crown Lands Ordinance 1902.**

Rules made by His Excellency the Governor in pursuance of the powers conferred by Section 33 of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1902.

1. Every applicant for a conveyance, or lease or a licence for the occupation of Crown Land shall, subject to the provisions of these rules, at the time of making his application, deposit with the Land Officer the sum of Rupees seventy five, and such deposit or any other sum deposited in pursuance of these rules shall be dealt with in the manner following:—

- (a) If the application is refused, the sum deposited shall be refunded to the applicant.
- (b) If the conveyance, lease or licence applied for at the time of making the deposit is granted, the sum deposited shall be placed to the credit of the applicant on account of Survey or other fees payable by the applicant in respect of the conveyance, lease or licence.
- (c) If the applicant shall withdraw his application, or shall refuse or neglect to execute the conveyance or lease or accept the licence when called upon to do so, and in every other case not hereinbefore provided for the sum deposited shall be forfeited to the Crown and applied to the revenues of the Protectorate.

2. Save as in these rules otherwise provided the Land Officer shall not register any application for a conveyance, lease or licence until the sum required by these rules has been deposited with him. Provided, however, the Land Officer may, in the case of an application for a licence for the Temporary Occupation of land provided for by Section 20 of the Crown Lands Ordinance 1902, at his discretion, register such application without requiring any sum to be deposited by the applicant, or may require such sum, being less than Rupess seventy five, to be deposited with him as he considers proper having regard to the circumstances of the case.
