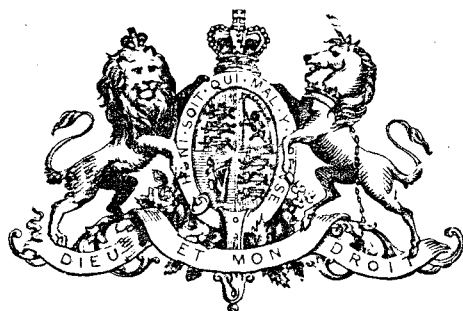

A Bill

Intituled.

An Ordinance to supply a further sum of money for the service of the year ended the 31st of March, 1910.

1. The Public Revenue for the year 1909-1910 and other funds of the East Africa Protectorate are hereby charged towards the service of the year ended 31st day of March, 1910, with a further sum of twenty three thousand eight hundred and eighty seven pounds two shillings and seven pence in addition to the sums provided by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1909. Public Revenue charged.

2. The money granted by this Ordinance shall be applied to the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule annexed hereto. Application of money granted.

3. The Protectorate Treasurer is hereby authorised and required, from time to time, upon warrant or order of the Governor, to pay out of the Revenue and other funds of the Protectorate, for the several services specified in the Schedule, the said sum of £23,887-2-7 which have come in course of payment during the year ended on the 31st day of March, 1910. Treasurer's authority for payment.

4. This Ordinance may be cited as "The Additional Appropriation 1909-1910 Ordinance, 1910." Short Title.

RULES.**Under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906.**

Rules issued by His Excellency the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906.

1. These Rules shall be read with the Rules under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, dated the 29th day of April, 1910.

2. The Quarantine Officer may order the owner or person in charge of any cattle the property of any Somali, and at any time being within either the European Area, or Native Area, to remove such cattle to such place and within such time as the Quarantine Officer shall direct, and may order the route by which the same shall be moved.

Whenever cattle, the removal of which has been ordered under this rule, shall not have been removed to the place, and within the time directed, by the Quarantine Officer, or, when the route by which the same shall be moved has been specified, shall be moved by any other route, such cattle may be seized and dealt with in the manner prescribed, and the owner or person in charge to whom such order shall have been given and every person who shall knowingly be concerned with the breach of or non-compliance with such order or any portion thereof shall, on conviction, be liable to the prescribed penalties.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in Rule 12 (2) of the above-mentioned Rules, the Quarantine Officer may, from time to time, issue permits to move cattle over land sold by, or leased from the Crown (not being a public road) if the owner of the land within the European Area is absent from the Protectorate or if in the opinion of the Quarantine Officer the occupier of the land is not easily accessible.

4. The Quarantine Officer may, at any time, call for a return of cattle from the owners of such cattle either in the European Area or Native Area.

Any person who shall fail to send in such return or make a false return to the Quarantine Officer shall be liable to the prescribed penalties.

RULES.**The East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903.**

Rules issued by His Excellency the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate under the provisions of the East Africa Townships Ordinance 1903.

1. These Rules shall be read together with the Rules under the East Africa Townships Ordinance 1903, dated the 2nd day of October 1906.

2. Rule III of the Rules last mentioned is hereby cancelled and there shall be substituted therefor the rule following:-

III. Every person driving or being in charge of any vehicle proceeding along any public road shall, when practicable, keep such vehicle to the left or near side of the road, and shall when passing any vehicle going in the same direction cause the vehicle which he is driving or of which he is in charge to pass on the right or off side of the vehicle he is passing, and shall permit a vehicle going in the opposite direction to pass on the right or off side of the vehicle which he is driving or of which he is in charge.

3. For the purposes of the preceding rule and of the rules directed to be read with these rules the term "person in charge of any vehicle" or "person being in charge of any vehicle" shall extend to and include any person propelling or drawing or assisting in propelling or drawing any vehicle, and the term "vehicle" shall include any conveyance for carriage of persons or goods however drawn, propelled or set or kept in motion, except a perambulator.

4. The definition of the word "vehicle" contained in Rule VI of the aforementioned rules of October 2nd, 1906 is hereby cancelled.
