RULES.

Under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906.

Rules issued by His Excellency the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate under the Powers conferred upon him by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906.

1. No hide or skin of any animal, within the meaning of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance 1906, shall be removed from any place within the Northern Masai Reserve to any place outside such reserve, until such skin shall have been examined at Rumuruti by such Officer as may be prescribed on this behalf by the Chief Veterinary Officer, and a pass for such removal shall have been obtained from such prescribed officer.

- (1). Any skin removed in breach of the foregoing rule shall be confiscated and thereafter destroyed or otherwise dealt with, as the Chief Veterinary Officer may direct.
- (2) Any person who shall remove or shall be a party to the removal of any skin in breach of the aforesaid rule, shall be liable to the penalties prescribed by the aforesaid Ordinance for a breach of a rule thereunder.

NOW THEREFORE by virtue of the provisions of Section 18 (1) of the said Crown Lands Ordinance 1902, I, Colonel Sir Edouard Percy Cranwill Girouard, K.C.M.G., D.S.O., R.E., Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, do hereby give notice to the said Lessee that I intend after one month from the publication of this notice to commence an action in the High Court for a declaration that the said lease be forfeited.
