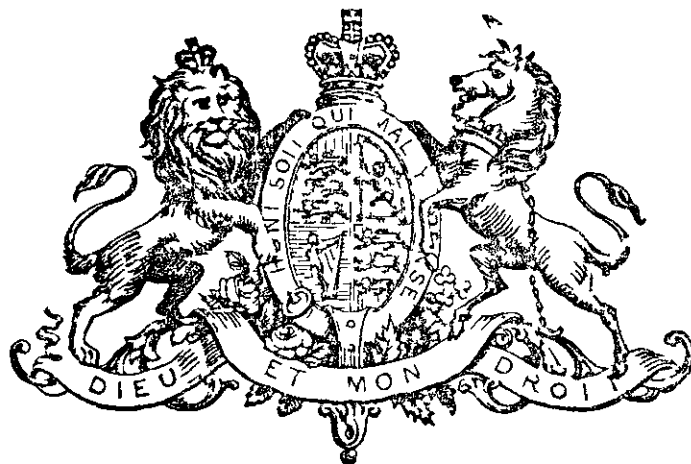

EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

CIRCULAR

DOWNING STREET,

10TH MAY, 1910,

Sir,

I have the honour to inform you that the Army Council have for some time had under consideration the question of modifying the rules affecting the service (so far as it reckons towards retired pay) of officers of the British Army employed under Colonial Governments, as changes have taken place in the conditions since the present rules were adopted.

2 It has been decided to discontinue the arrangements under which officers are earning by colonial service pensions which are paid entirely from Army Funds, and in future officers on the active list of the Army will not be allowed to take colonial employment except under conditions which shall limit the cost falling upon Army Funds to the due equivalent of the value to the Army of the service rendered.

3 Accordingly the Army Council have divided the various forms of colonial employment into the following three classes —

- A Officers on the active list seconded for purely military appointments. Subject to a contribution when the employing Colony is self-supporting, the whole of the service will count as army service. An officer retiring from the army will thereby vacate his colonial appointment.
- B Officers seconded for what may be called quasi-military employment, such as those employed in unsettled districts (*e.g.*, with the police or as Residents or Commissioners in such districts). In such cases a soldier may at times be more useful than a civilian and the experience gained may be of military value if he afterwards returns to the Army. These cases will be dealt with as follows —
 - (1) A contribution will be paid by the employing Colony, if self-supporting, towards the officer's retired pay concurrently with his employment. This will be refunded if the officer should retire on retired pay without counting the service for retired pay.
 - (2) In order that the colonial service may count towards retired pay, an officer must return to the Army and give three years' subsequent service at least before retiring, so that the Army may reap the advantage which alone justifies the Army Council in allowing the service to count for military pension.
 - (3) If the officer retires from the Army while holding the colonial employment, or before completing three years' service in the Army after his return to it, his service in the Colony will not count towards his retired pay, which will be that (if any) to which his Army service by itself entitles him, he will draw it from the date of retirement.
- C Officers in purely civil appointments. An officer taking up what will be classified as a civil appointment will, for a period not exceeding three years, be placed on the half-pay list without drawing half-pay and without counting time on it towards retired pay. At any time he will be allowed to retire from the Army and draw the retired pay (if any) to which his service in the Army entitles him, and no deduction will be made under Article 485 of the Pay Warrant in respect of the period of civil employment.

on the half-pay list, or, if he prefers it, he will be allowed at any time during the period above mentioned to return to Army service. If he remains permanently in the service of the Colonial Government his time while on the half pay list will, subject to the provisions of local law, count with his subsequent service towards pension from the Colony or Protectorate. If the employment is 'civil' within the meaning of No 1 of the Rules made by the Treasury under Section 6 of the Superannuation Act, 1887, he will be subject to a deduction from the emoluments of his post in respect of any retired pay which he draws.

4 Posts will only be admitted into Class B if they are regarded as being "of a nature to afford practical experience likely to be afterwards of advantage in military service" (Article 74 (h) and (i) of the Pay Warrant), and a strict interpretation of these words will be required in future. If the appointment is not considered of a sufficiently military character to come under Class B, it will be classified as civil (Class C).

5 Certain cases which appeared to call for special consideration were those of military officers serving as Governors or as Aides-de-Camp to Governors. All military officers serving as Governors of Colonies and Protectorates will be placed in Class B, but no contribution towards retired pay will be required in respect of them. The Army Council have also consented to regard Aides-de-Camp to Governors as in the same category, but they are unable to accord similar treatment to extra Aides-de-Camp, whose position under existing rules is clearly distinguished from that of Aides-de-Camp. Those rules require a deduction from the retired pay of extra Aides-de-Camp in respect of each year of service in that capacity, and in future these officers will come under the rules for civil employment (C).

6 It has not been possible to define all the appointments which should be placed in the different classes, as in many cases the classes in which appointments will be placed can only be decided as cases arise. It may be stated generally, however, that, unless the employment is of a distinctly military character the appointment will come in Class C, Residents and District Commissioners will come in this Class except in the rare cases where their duties may be considered of a military character, when they will be regarded as coming in Class B. In the case of police appointments also the employment would be included in Class C except where the force to which an officer is attached is of a distinctly military character. On the other hand, officers employed on survey work would be placed in Class B.

7 On the advice of their actuaries the Army Council have fixed the rate of contribution towards the future non-effective pay of a seconded officer at £70 per annum. They consider that this sum should be adopted generally for those officers lent for colonial service who are dealt with in Articles 495 to 524 of the Pay Warrant, it may be necessary to modify the annual contribution in the case of other officers.

8 I have concurred in the arrangements proposed by the Army Council, which will come into force as regards all Army officers selected for service in the Colonies as from the 1st of July next. No change will be made in the conditions of service of officers at present seconded within the period for which their seconding has been approved by the Army Council but if this period is extended, or if a seconded officer should change his status, *e.g.*, by transfer to a civil post (Class C) from a military post, he would at once come under the new rules.

RULES.

Issued by His Excellency the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate under the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903

- 1 These Rules shall apply to the Township of Nairobi
- 2 For the purposes of these Rules, “Petroleum” includes both ordinary kerosene and petrol, and generally any of the following liquids — *i e*, (a) liquid petroleum, (b) oil or spirit obtained wholly or in part from any liquid petroleum or from any shale, schist, coal, peat, or bitumen, or from any similar substance (c) any liquid mixture of any of the above named liquids with any other substance, but shall not include any heavy oil, that is to say, any liquid above described which (a) has a specific gravity as determined by the hydrometer at a temperature of 60 degrees Fahrenheit, exceeding one thousand, or (b) having a specific gravity as determined in the manner aforesaid of not less than eight hundred and forty, has a true flashing point of one hundred and fifty “Petroleum Oil” (which includes ordinary kerosene) shall mean any such petroleum as above mentioned, which has a true flashing point of not less than one hundred degrees of Fahrenheit’s thermometer “Petroleum Spirit” (which includes ordinary petrol) shall mean any such petroleum which has a true flashing point of less than one hundred degrees of Fahrenheit’s thermometer
- “True flashing point” of petroleum shall be the observed flashing point of that liquid corrected, if necessary, for atmospheric pressure “Observed flashing point” shall be the number of the lowest degree of Fahrenheit’s thermometer at which a flash is obtained when the liquid is tested by means of any test apparatus in use at the Government Laboratory
- The Town Clerk may in his discretion and subject to such conditions as he may prescribe register any building specially built or adapted for the purpose for the storage of petroleum.

- 4 Any person desiring to have any premises registered for the storage of petroleum shall send to the Town Clerk a notice stating (1) his name, address and profession or trade
- (2) the situation of the premises
 - (3) the quantity and description of the petroleum proposed to be kept
 - (4) the proposed place and method of storage
 - (5) the purpose for which the petroleum is to be kept

Together with a plan of the premises showing the proposed store or tank depôt, and its elevation and position with respect to adjacent buildings

5 The registration of any premises under these Rules may on breach of any condition imposed under Rule 3 hereof or of any of the provisions of these Rules be cancelled by the Town Clerk provided that it shall be competent for the party in whose name such premises are registered, within 3 days of notification of cancellation by the Town Clerk to appeal to the Chairman of the Municipal Committee, whose decision shall be final and cancellation shall in that case not take effect until the decision of the Chairman shall have been notified to such party

6 No premises will be registered for the keeping of petroleum unless and until they shall have been passed by an officer appointed by the Municipal Committee for the purpose as in accordance with the approved plans thereof and approval of plans shall not be held as equivalent to registration

7 Registration under these Rules shall only be available until the 31st day of December in the year of registration and shall be renewable annually

8 No person shall keep petroleum on any unregistered premises except in the place or places provided by the Municipal Committee for the purpose unless the quantity of either, so kept, does not exceed —

of Petroleum oil	40 gallons
of Petroleum spirit	10 gallons

or if both together are kept—

of Petroleum oil	10 gallons
of Petroleum spirit	10 gallons

9 Where petroleum is kept on any unregistered premises the following provisions shall be observed that is to say

All petroleum spirit shall be kept in substantial closed metal vessels

A quantity of petroleum oil exceeding 4 gallons shall not be kept otherwise than in a substantial closed metal vessel

No petroleum shall be stored under any staircase or in such a situation as in case of fire to prevent the escape of persons from the building

10 Any person contravening any of the conditions under which any premises are registered for the keeping of petroleum, or any of the provisions of Rules 8 & 9 hereof shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs 200 or to a period of imprisonment for a term not exceeding 2 months

11 Rule 2 of Township Rules dated 27th January, 1910, is hereby repealed
