Arabuko—Sekoki Forest.

These Rules may be cited as "The Arabuko-Sekoki Forest Rules, 1914."

These Rules shall apply to that area of the Arabuko-Sekoki Forest proclaimed to be a Forest area

on the 4th day of April, 1914.

3. A member of the Mazrui tribe residing in the area declared by the Recorder of Titles to be the property of the Mazrui tribe and situated adjacent to the Arabuko-Sekoki Forest shall be entitled :to collect dead wood for firewood for his own use but not for sale or exchange.

to fell trees for his own purposes for domestic use or for building his own house, that is to

say a house to be inhabited by him or by his wife, but not for sale or exchange.

4. No tree shall be felled under these Rules unless and until such tree has been marked for felling by a Forest Officer.

5. The rights exercised under these Rules shall be so exercised free of charge.

Issued under the provisions of the East Africa Railways Ordinance, 1910, section 47, with the sanction of the Governor in Council by the Administration of the Uganda Railway.

Acceptance of Goods.

1. 'The Administration will not undertake :-

to accept goods for transport if sufficient rolling stock is not available to transport them within a reasonable time, or in the case of traffic from or to any Port on Lake Victoria or Lake Kioga, either sufficient steamer accommodation or sufficient rolling stock is not available to transport them within a reasonable time.

to provide covered places, sheds, stores or warehouses to warehouse goods pending

transport.

to store goods offered too late for transport.

(d) to provide any particular description of truck for the conveyance of goods.

If senders bring on Railway premises goods which under Rule 1 (a) the Administration is unable to accept, the goods will lie there absolutely at the risk of the owner, the Administration accepting no responsibility whatsoever until such time as a printed Railway Receipt for the goods has been handed to the sender by the authorised representative of the Administration.

3. If the owner of goods deposited on Railway premises at the owner's risk in accordance with Rule (2) desires the Administration to provide tarpaulins to cover the said goods, the Administration, provided it has sufficient tarpaulins for the purpose, will supply such at a charge of Rs. 2/- per tarpaulin per week or part thereof. The Administration does not undertake to keep a supply of tarpaulins to meet the above demands.

These Rules may be cited as the Uganda Railway Acceptance of Goods Rules, 1914.
