GOVERNMENT NOTICE NO 13]

NOTICE

AT THE COURT AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE,

THE 29TH DAY OF OCTOBER, 1914

PRESENT,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL

WHEREAS by an Order in Council dated the 20th day of August, 1914, His Majesty was pleased to declare that during the present hostilities the Convention known as the Declaration of London should, subject to certain additions and modifications therein specified, be adopted and put in force by His Majesty's Government, and

Whereas the said additions and modifications were rendered necessary by the special conditions of the present war, and

Whereas it is desirable and possible now to re-enact the said Order in Council with amendments in order to minimise, so far as possible, the interference with innocent neutral trade occasioned by the war

NOW THEREFORE, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows —

1 During the present hostilities the provisions of the Convention known as the Declaration of London shall, subject to the exclusion of the lists of contraband and non-contraband, and to the modifications hereinafter set out, be adopted and put in force by His Majesty's Government

The modifications are as follows —

- (1) A neutral vessel, with papers indicating a neutral destination, which, notwithstanding the destination shown on the papers, proceeds to an enemy port, shall be liable to capture and condemnation if she is encountered before the end of her next voyage
- (ii) The destination referred to in Article 33 of the said Declaration shall (in addition to the presumptions laid down in Article 34) be presumed to exist if the goods are consigned to or for an agent of the enemy State
- (111) Notwithstanding the provisions of Article 35 of the said Declaration, conditional contraband shall be liable to capture on board a vessel bound for a neutral port if the goods are consigned "to order," or if the ship's papers do not show who is the consignee of the goods or if they show a consignee of the goods in territory belonging to or occupied by the enemy
- (iv) In the cases covered by the preceding paragraph (iii) it shall be upon the owners of the goods to prove that their destination was innocent
- Where it is shown to the satisfaction of one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State that the enemy Government is drawing supplies for its aimed forces from or through a neutral country, he may direct that in respect of ships bound for a port in that country, Article 35 of the said Declaration shall not apply. Such direction shall be notified in the "London Gazette" and shall operate until the same is withdrawn. So long as such direction is in force, a vessl which is carrying conditional contraband to a port in that country shall not be immune from capture
- 3 The Order in Council of the 20th August, 1914, directing the adoption and enforcement during the present hostilities of the Convention known as the Declaration of London, subject to the additions and modifications therein specified, is hereby 1-pealed
 - 4 This Order may be cited as "the Declaration of London Order in Council, No. 2, 1914"

And the Loids Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, the Loids Commissioners of the Admiralty, and each of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the President of the Probate, Divoice and Admiralty Division of the High Court of Justice, all other Judges of His Majesty's Prize Courts and all Governors, Officers and Authorities whom it may concern, are to give the necessary directions herein as to them may respectively appertain

January 20th

Official News —French Government reports snow storms along front, no special incidents, Russian Government reports continued pursuit of Turkish army in Caucasus Enemy made an raid on Norfolk Coast last night about five persons killed, slight damage to property

January 21st

Official News—French Government reports artillery duels from sea to Somme and Thann, in Argonne violent enemy attack temporarily succeeded but ground regained after counter attacks, enemy attacks at other points repulsed. Over hundred prisoners taken Russian Government reports no important changes along whole front, German attempt to resume offensive Rawa and on Bzura defeated in western Galicia Germans repulsed suffering heavy losses, Russian advancing in Bukowina occupied village of Johaneschte, taking prisoners, Pursuit of Turks in Caucasus continues, numerous prisoners and a camp taken, Russians occupied Ardanutsch

January 22nd

Official news—French Government reports progress in Champagne, enemy's ammunition depot exploded in Argonne, important German attack repulsed, German trenches carried near Saint Mihiel Russian Government reports enemy evacuating Stempe, 34 miles east of Thorn in face of Russian offensive, also further successes in Bukowina

January 23rd

Official News —French Government reports artillery successes against enemy's works, batteries and infantity between Ypres and Oise, in Alsace fierce infantity engagement continues. No special news from Poland or Caucasus
