AN ORDINANCE

No 1 of 1915

An Ordinance to supply a further Sum of Money for the Service of the year ended the 31st of March, 1914

[January 20th, 1915]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

1 The Public Revenue for the year 1913-14, and other funds of the East Africa Protectorate are hereby charged towards the service of the year ended 31st day of March 1914, with a further sum of one hundred and thirty-one thousand one hundred and ninety-eight pounds, eighteen shillings and four pence, in addition to the sums provided by the Appropriation Ordinance, 1913

Public Revenue charged

2 The money granted by this Ordinance shall be applied to the purposes and services expressed in the Schedule annexed hereto

Application of money granted

3 The Treasurer of the Protectorate is hereby authorised and required, from time to time, upon warrant or order of the Governor, to pay out of the Revenue and other Funds of the Protectorate, for the several services specified in the Schedule, the said sum of one hundred and thirty-one thousand one hundred and ninety-eight pounds, eighteen shillings and four pence, which have come in course of payment during the year ended on the 31st day of March, 1914

4 This Ordinance may be cited as "The Supplementary Appropriation Ordinance, 1915"

AN ORDINANCE

No 2 of 1915

An Ordinance to amend the Customs
Tariff Ordinance, 1909.

[January 20th, 1915]

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

1 This Ordinance may be cited as “ The Customs Tariff Amendment Ordinance, 1915,” and shall be read as one with the Customs Tariff Ordinance, 1909 (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Ordinance) and all Ordinances amending the same

2 On and after the coming into operation of this Ordinance the Table of Exemptions from Import Duties, set out in the Principal Ordinance, shall be and is hereby amended by adding thereto the following —

Amendment
of Table of
Exemptions
from Import
Duties

34 All goods imported on or after 1st December, 1914, as gifts to troops and consigned for distribution to Officers in Command of such troops or to Government Departments

This exemption shall cease to have effect immediately on the cessation of the present war, provided however that if, on the date of such cessation any gifts have been already shipped or despatched, such gifts shall be exempt notwithstanding they arrive in the Protectorate after the cessation of the present war

PROCLAMATION No 3]

PROCLAMATION**Under the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act 1914.**

AT THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, WHITEHALL

THE 11TH DAY OF DECEMBER, 1914

BY THE LORDS OF HIS MAJESTY'S MOST HONOURABLE PRIVY COUNCIL

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of November, 1914, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section one of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain Warlike Stores was prohibited

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect —

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of November, 1914, should be amended by making the following additions to and alterations in the same —

- (1) That the heading 'Picric Acid and its components' should be deleted from the list of articles prohibited to be exported to all foreign ports in Europe and on the Mediterranean and Black Seas, other than those of France, Russia (except Baltic ports), Belgium, Spain, and Portugal
- (2) That the export of the following articles be prohibited to all destinations —
Aniline Oil
Aniline Salt
Picric Acid and its components

Now therefore, Their Lordships having taken the said recommendation into consideration are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly

Costs in Summary Proceedings on Negotiable Instruments.

1 These Rules may be cited as Rules of Court (Costs in Summary Proceedings on Negotiable Instruments) No 1 of 1915

2 Where proceedings have been taken in the High Court under Chapter XXXIX of the Civil Procedure Code or any law substituted therefor, and the Defendant has failed to obtain leave to appear and defend the suit the sum allowed for Advocate's costs shall be Rupees 50/- which shall be in addition to the sum disbursed for Court costs in accordance with the Scale of Court Fees for the time being in force prescribing the fees leviable in Civil Suits

3 Where proceedings have been taken in a Subordinate Court under Chapter XXXIX of the Civil Procedure Code or any law substituted therefor, and the Defendant has failed to obtain leave to appear and defend the suit the sum allowed for Advocate's costs shall be where the instrument on which the suit is framed does not exceed in value Rupees 300/- Rupees 15/-, in other cases a sum reckoned at 4% on the value of instrument sued on, such costs shall be in addition to the sum disbursed for Court costs in accordance with the Scale of Court Fees for the time being in force prescribing the fees leviable in Civil Suits

Official News —Admiralty announce that all British ships and destroyers engaged Sunday's action have returned safely to Port "Lion," which had some of forward compartments flooded by shell below water line, was taken in tow by "Indomitable" Destroyer "Meteor" also disabled taken in tow by destroyer "Liberty" Both vessels guarded by strong escorts destroyers Repairs can be speedily effected Total casualties reported one officer, thirteen men killed, three officers twenty six men wounded These occurred "Lion," "Tiger" "Meteor" Believed no other casualties occurred Naval General Staff Petrograd announces that on Monday morning Zeppelin appeared Libau, dropped nine bombs on undefended port town and after being fired at by forts fell into water Small craft went out, destroyed Zeppelin, took crew prisoners

January 26th

Official News —French Government announces surprise and capture of Bavarian detachment in Lorraine, otherwise nothing special In Galicia, Austrians show some activity in Dukla and eastern Carpathian passes

January 27th,

Official News —Several violent German attacks against our first division near Labassee, Monday, repulsed with severe losses, at one place on Labassee road three hundred Germans killed, fifty five captured French Government reports similar attack east of Ypres, Germans left three hundred dead west Craonne, violent German attacks captured some French trenches, part of lost ground regained

January 28th

Official News —Following is preliminary telegraphic report from Vice Admiral respecting Naval action Enemy first sighted and attacked by destroyer Flotilla 7 30 a m about fourteen miles east south-east of our battle squadron, our battle cruisers steered south-east and situation developed into stern chase, speed worked up to twenty-eight or twenty-nine knots, enemy being gradually overhauled, fire opened at about eighteen thousand yards we began to hit at about seventeen thousand yards enemy returning fire, "Lion" and "Tiger" having drawn ahead were in action alone for some time receiving enemy's concentrated fire, other vessels engaged enemy as they drew up, attack by German destroyer flotilla was driven off At about eleven "Lion" had a fuel tank damaged by lucky shot causing

stoppage port engine, at same time enemy's submarines observed and avoided "Blucher's" position now critical and "Indomitable" was directed complete her destruction, rest of squadron being instructed attack enemy's rear, "Lion" was escorted north-west, Vice Admiral's flag being transferred to a destroyer and then to "Princess Royal," damage to "Lion" undoubtedly deprived us of greater victory, presence of enemy's submarines necessitated action being broken off, result of action "Blucher" sunk two other battle cruisers very heavily on fire and seriously damaged, prisoners report light cruiser "Kalberg" of "Kohn" class also sunk by over salvoes from our squadron, "Lion's" starboard engines subsequently also developed trouble "Indomitable" towed her into port, damage to "Lion" and "Tiger" not serious, can shortly be repaired, remainder of squadron not hit, behavior of officers and men only what was expected, great credit due engine room staff for fine steaming French Government reports German losses in fighting near Ypres and Labassee at least two battalions In fighting west of Craonne when French lost some ground since partly recovered, German left thousand dead Russian Government reports enemy driven back at many points East Prussia and left bank Vistula In Galicia hostile offensive repulsed, three hundred prisoners taken In Egypt, British patrol engaged hostile force east of Elkantara, our casualties one officer, four men slightly wounded, enemy's casualties apparently heavier

January 29th

Official News —French Government reports satisfactory day along whole front south of Lys, British artillery swept, routed and concentrated points of German troops In region Craonne, French have recaptured whole disputed ground their total losses about eight hundred, German attacks in Argonne and near St Mihiel completely defeated, progress made in Vosges and Alsace, enemy's losses between Ypres and Vosges 25th to 27th appear exceed twenty thousand, Russian Government reports successful offensive north of Tilsit and in Carpathians especially south west of Dukla, where enemy abandoned ammunition and stores

January 30th

Official News —French Government reports progress region Neuport and positions won on 27th consolidated, enemy's attempts cross Aisne, east of Soissons, repulsed French airmen dropped bombs on enemy's camps near Laon, Lafere, Soissons
