COMMISSION appointing Major-General Edward Northey CB., to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the East Africa Protectorate.

GEORGE RI

George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Dated 15th July, Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, 1918 Emperor of India To Our Trusty and Well-beloved Edward Northey, Esquire, Major-General of Our Forces, Companion of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Greeting

WE do, by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, appoint you, the Appointment of said Edward Northey, to be, during Our pleasure, Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief Major General E Northey, C B, to in and over Our East Africa Protectorate, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and be Governor advantages to the said office belonging or appertaining

II And We do hereby authorise, empower, and command you to exercise and perform Duties under Orders all and singular the powers and directions contained in the Order in Council (Constituting in Council, 22nd the Office of Governor), bearing date the Twenty-second day of October 1906, the Order November 1907 and in Council bearing date the Second day of November 1907, and known as "The East 2nd March 1915 Africa Order in Council, 1907," and the Order in Council bearing date the Second day of March 1915, and known as "The East Africa Order in Council, 1915," or in any other Order or Orders in Council adding to, amending, or substituted for the same, according to such Orders and Instructions as Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being hath already received or as you may hereafter receive from Us

III And We do hereby appoint that so soon as you shall have taken the prescribed Commission of 9th Oaths and have entered upon the duties of your Office, this Our present Commission shall August 1912 supersupersede Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the Ninth day of August 1912, appointing Our Trusty and Well-beloved Henry Conway Belfield, Esquire, Companion of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George (now Sir Henry Conway Belfield, Knight Commander of Our said Most Distinguished Order), to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and for Our said Protectorate

IV And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers and loving Officers and others subjects in Our said Protectorate, and all others whom it may concern, to take due to obey notice hereof, and to give their ready obedience accordingly

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this Fifteenth day of July, 1918, in the Ninth Year of Oui Reign
