GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 38

COMMISSION appointing Major-General Edward Northey C B., to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the East Africa Protectorate.

GEORGE R I

George the Fifth, by the Grace of God of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland and of the British Dominions beyond the Seas King, Defender of the Faith, Emperor of India To Our Trusty and Well-beloved Edward Northey, Esquire, Major-General of Our Forces, Companion of Our Most Honourable Order of the Bath, Greeting

Dated 15th July, 1918

WE do, by this Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet, appoint you, the said Edward Northey, to be, during Our pleasure, Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over Our East Africa Protectorate, with all the powers, rights, privileges, and advantages to the said office belonging or appertaining

Appointment of Major General E Northey, C B., to be Governor

II And We do hereby authorise, empower, and command you to exercise and perform all and singular the powers and directions contained in the Order in Council (Constituting the Office of Governor), bearing date the Twenty-second day of October 1906, the Order in Council bearing date the Second day of November 1907, and known as "The East Africa Order in Council, 1907," and the Order in Council bearing date the Second day of March 1915, and known as "The East Africa Order in Council, 1915," or in any other Order or Orders in Council adding to, amending, or substituted for the same, according to such Orders and Instructions as Our Governor and Commander-in-Chief for the time being hath already received or as you may hereafter receive from Us

Duties under Orders in Council, 22nd October 1906, 2nd November 1907 and 2nd March 1915

III And We do hereby appoint that so soon as you shall have taken the prescribed Oaths and have entered upon the duties of your Office, this Our present Commission shall supersede Our Commission under Our Sign Manual and Signet bearing date the Ninth day of August 1912, appointing Our Trusty and Well-beloved Henry Conway Belfield, Esquire, Companion of Our Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George (now Sir Henry Conway Belfield, Knight Commander of Our said Most Distinguished Order), to be Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and for Our said Protectorate

Commission of 9th August 1912 superseded

IV And We do hereby command all and singular Our Officers and loving Officers and others subjects in Our said Protectorate, and all others whom it may concern, to take due to obey notice hereof, and to give then ready obedience accordingly

Given at Our Court at Saint James's, this Fifteenth day of July, 1918,  
in the Ninth Year of Our Reign
