EAST AFRICA PROTECTORATE.

AN ORDINANCE

No 11 of 1915

An Ordinance to make provision for borrowing the sum of £1,868,000 from the Imperial Treasury, and for the raising, appropriating, and applying the loan, and for the due repayment of the same as provided by the East African Protectorate (Loans) Act, 1914.

March 10th, 1915

BE it enacted by the Governor of the East Africa Protectorate with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council thereof —

- 1 This Ordinance may be cited as the "Imperial Short Title Loans Ordinance, 1915 "
- 2 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise Definition of requires, the expression "Treasury" means the terms Treasury Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury, and

the expression "Crown Agents" means the person "Crown or persons for the time being acting as Crown Agents for Agents the Colonies in England

3 The Governor may from time to time borrow from The Governor the Treasury sums not exceeding in the aggregate one £1,868,000 million eight hundred and sixty-eight thousand pounds for the purposes specified in the Schedule hereto, and bearing interest from the date on which each advance is made at such rate not being less than two and three quarters per centum per annum as the Treasury and the Secretary of State may fix as sufficient to enable the advance to be made without loss to the Local Loans Fund of the United Kingdom and repayable in such period (not exceeding forty years) from that date as the Treasury and the Secretary of State for the Colonies may determine in each case by means of an annuity of principal and interest combined commencing as hereinafter mentioned and calculated at such rate per annum for every £100 borrowed as may be necessary to pay off the whole of such principal and interest within the said period

Application of loan

may vary the allocation aggreg ite of £1,868,000

4 The money to be borrowed under the authority of this Ordinance shall be appropriated and applied to the purposes specified in the Schedule hereto up to the amounts therein allotted to each purpose, and to no other purposes The Governor Provided however that the Governor may with the approval of the Secretary of State vary the amounts so subject to the allotted without exceeding the aggregate amount to be bollowed

Loan to be a charge on general iovenue

5 The principal money to be borrowed under this Ordinance and the interest thereon are hereby charged upon and shall be payable out of the general revenue and assets of the Government of the Protectorate with priority over any charges thereon not existing at the date of the passing of this Ordinance

Provision to payment of interest and annuity

6 The following provisions shall have effect as regards payment of interest and repayment of principal

For the first three years from the date of an advance or, where several advances have been made in any one financial year, from the date of the earliest such advance interest only shall be paid Such interest shall be paid either from the General Revenue of the Protectorate or from the principal amount of the advance as the Governor may duect

Thereafter thirty-seven annuity payments of principal and interest combined shall be made from the General Revenue of the Protectorate such payments being made in each case on the fourth and each succeeding anniversary of the particular advance in respect of which the payment is mide or where such advance is one of several advances made in the same financial year on the fourth and each succeeding anniversary of the earliest of such advances

Remittances to be made through the Crown Agents

The Governor shall in each year remit to the Crown Agents the sums due in respect of the aforesaid interest or annuities, and shall make this remittance on such date as will enable the Crown Agents to pay over the amount to the Treasury on the date on which it falls due

Interest pay able on interest or aunuities overdue

7 In the event of any payment in respect of interest or annuity not being made at the date on which it falls due interest on such payment shall be charged and payable at the rate of interest payable under section three of this Ordinance during the period such payment is in arrear

Advances receivable by the Crown Agents

8 The Crown Agents are hereby authorised to receive the money so borrowed from the Treasury and to give such an acknowledgment on behalf of the Government of the Protectorate for the same as the Treasury may require and as may not be inconsistent with the terms of this Ordinance

Conditional power to redeem ad vances on notice

9 It shall be lawful for the Governor with the consent of the Treasury at any time after the expiration of five vears from the date on which the money shall have been advanced by the Treasury under the provisions of this Ordinance, to repay to the Treasury the amount of such advance then outstanding on giving six months' notice of his intention to do so

PROCLAMATION No 8]

PROCLAMATION

BY THE KING

A PLOCLAMATION REVISING THE LIST OF ARTICLES TO BE TREATED AS CONTPABAND OF WAR

GEORGERI

WHEREAS on the fourth day of August, 1914, We did issue Our Royal Proclamation specifying the articles which it was Our intention to treat as contraband of war during the war between Us and the German Emperor and

Whereas on the twelfth day of August, 1914, We did by Our Royal Proclamation of that date extend Our Proclamation aforementioned to the war between Us and the Emperor of Austria, King of Hungary, and

Whereas on the twenty-first day of September, 1914 We did by Our Royal Proclamation of that date make certain additions to the list of articles to be treated as contraband of war, and

Whereas on the twenty-ninth day of October, 1914, We did by Our Royal Proclamation of that date withdraw the said lists of contraband, and substitute therefor the lists contained in the schedules to the said Proclamation, and

Whereas it is expedient to make certain alterations in and additions to the said lists

Now, therefore, We do hereby declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that the lists of contraband contained in the schedules to Our Royal Proclamation of the twenty-ninth day of October aforementioned are hereby withdrawn, and that in lieu thereot during the continuance of the war, or until We do give further public notice, the articles enumerated in Schedule I hereto will be treated as absolute contraband, and the articles enumerated in Schedule II hereto will be treated as conditional contraband

SCHEDULE I

- 1 Arms of all kinds, including arms for sporting purposes, and their distinctive component parts
 - 2 Projectiles, charges, and cartridges of all kinds, and their distinctive component parts

3 Powder and explosives specially prepared for use in war

- 4 Ingredients of explosives, viz, nitric acid, sulphuic acid, glyceline, acetone, calcium acetate and all other metallic acetates, sulphui, potassium nitrate, the fractions of the distillation products of coal tar beween benzol and cresol inclusive, aniline, methylaniline, dimethylaniline, ammonium perchlorate, sodium perchlorate, sodium chlorate, barium chlorate, ammonium nitrate, cyanamide, potassium chlorate, calcium nitrate, mercury
- 6 Gun mountings, limber boxes, limbers, military wagons, field forges, and their distinctive component parts

- 8 Clothing and equipment of a distinctively military character
- 9 Saddle, draught, and pack animals suitable for use in war 10 All kinds of harness of a distinctively military character

5 Resinous products, camphor and turpentine (oil and spirit)

11 Articles of camp equipment and their distinctive component parts

12 Armour plates

- 13 Feiro alloys, including ferro tungsten, feiro-molybdenum, feiro manganese, feiro-vanadium, ferro-chrome
- 14 The following metals —Tungsten, molybdenum, vanadium, nickel, selenium, cobalt, hæmatite pig-iion, manganese
- 15 The following ores —Wolframite, scheelite, molybdenite, manganese ore, nickel ore, chrome ore hæmatite non ore, zinc ore, lead ore, bankite

16 Aluminium, alumina and salts of aluminium

PROCLAMATION

BY THE KING

A PROCLAMATION RELATING TO TRADING WITH THE ENEMY

GEORGER1

WHEREAS by Our Proclamation dated the 9th day of September, 1914, called the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation, No 2, certain prohibitions, as therein more specifically set forth, were imposed upon all persons therein referred to

And whereas by Our Proclamation dated the 8th day of October, 1914, the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No 2 was amended as therein more specifically set forth

And whereas by Our Proclamation dated the 5th day of November 1914, it was declared that the aforesaid Proclamations, amongst others, should apply to the state of war existing between Us and the Sultan of Turkey

And whereas it is desirable to extend the scope of the prohibitions contained in the aforestid Proclamations in the manner hereinafter appearing

Now, therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, declaring, and it is hereby declared, as follows —

1 Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph 6 of the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No 2 transactions hereafter entered into by persons firms or companies resident carrying on business or being in the United Kingdom

(a) in respect of banking business with a branch situated outside the United Kingdom of an enemy person firm or company, or

(b) in respect of any description of business with a branch situated outside the United Kingdom of an enemy bank,

shall be considered as transactions with an enemy

Provided that the acceptance payment or other dealing with any negotiable instrument which was drawn before the date of this Proclamation shall not, if otherwise lawful, be deemed to be a transaction hereafter entered into within the meaning of this paragraph

2 The power to grant licences on Our behalf vested by paragraph 8 of the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No 2 in a Secretary of State, or the Board of Trade, may also be

exercised by the Lords Commissioners of Our Treasury

- 3 It the Governor in Council of any British possession shall issue a Proclamation extending the provisions of this Proclamation to transactions by persons firms or companies resident carrying on business or being in that possession such first mentioned Proclamation shall have effect as if it were part of this Proclamation
- 4 This Proclamation shall be read as one with the Trading with the Enemy Proclamation No 2, and with Our Proclamation dated the 8th day of October amending the same
