

# PROCLAMATION

#### BY THE KING

A Proclamation prohibiting under Section 8 of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," and Section one of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," and Section one of "The Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914," the Exportation from the United Kingdom of Warlike Stores

#### $GLORGE \ {f R} \ {f I}$

WHEREAS by Section 8 of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," it is enacted that the exportation of arms, ammunition, and gunpowder, military and naval stores, and any articles which We shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of military or naval stores, provisions, or any sort of victual which may be used as food tor man may be prohibited by Proclamation

And whereas by Section one of 'The Exportation of Aims Act, 1900, 'it is enacted that We may by Proclamation prohibit the exportation of all or any of the following articles, ramely, aims, ammunition, military and naval stores, and any article which We shall judge capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of arms, ammunition, or military or naval stores, to any country or place therein named whenever We shall judge such prohibition to be expedient in order to prevent such aims, ammunition, military or naval stores, being used against Our subjects or forces or igainst any forces engaged or which may be engaged in military or naval operations in co-operation with our forces

And whereas by Section one of "The Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914," it is enacted that Section 8 of the aforesaid Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, shall have effect whilst a state of war in which We are engaged exists as if in addition to the articles therein mentioned there were included all other articles of every description

And whereas it is further enacted by Section 2 of "The Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914," that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8, as so amended, of "The Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879," may whilst a state of war exists be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas it is enacted by Section 2 of "The Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914," that any Proclamation made under Section one of "The Exportation of Arms Act, 1900," may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas a Proclamation dated the 10th November, 1914, and various Orders dated respectively the 20th November the 5th, the 11th and 23rd December 1914 and the 4th and 8th January, 1915, prohibiting the exportation of certain articles therein referred to from the United Kingdom to certain or all destinations, have been issued in pursuance of the aforesaid powers

And whereas it is expedient that the said Proclamation and Orders should be consolidated, with amendments and additions, and that such Proclamation and Orders should be revoked

And whereas the articles, other than arms, ammunition, or military or naval stores by the latter of the latter of the latter of the latter of made useful in increasing the quantity of arms, ammunition, or military or naval stores

And whereas in order to prevent such arms, ammunition, or military or naval stores being used against Our subjects or forces or against any forces engaged or which may be engaged in military or naval operations in co operation with Our torces. We have deemed it expedient to prohibit the exportation of the articles hereinafter enumerated

Now, Therefore, We have thought fit, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, to issue this Our Royal Proclamation, declaring, and it is hereby declared, that the above-mentioned Proclamation and Orders be and the same are hereby revoked

And We have further thought fit, by and with the advice aforesaid, and in virtue and in exercise of the powers aforesaid, further to declare, and it is hereby declared, as follows —

(A) That the exportation of the following goods be prohibited to all destinations —

Aeroplanes, suships, balloons and ur craft, of all kinds and their component parts, together with accessories and articles recognisable as intended for use in connection with aeroplanes, airships, balloons, and ancraft, including —gold beaters' skin, shantung silk in the piece, flax fabric suit able  $_{
m fol}$ aeroplanes, non-inflammable celluloid " sheet (or similar transparent material non soluble in lubricating oil, petrol or water), aeroplane dope, high tensile steel tubes, aeroplane instruments (aneroids, barographs, revolution indicators), aeroplane turnbuckles, steel stampings, mag netos, aeroplane engines and parts, fusel oil (amyl alcohol), amyl acetate, aceto celluloses, trephenyl phosphate,

Animals, pack, saddle and draught, suit-

able for use in war,

Cannon and other ordnance and machine guns, and parts thereof,

Carbons, suitable for searchlights,

Carriages and mountings for cannon and other ordnance, and for machine guns and parts thereof,

Cartudges, charges of all kinds, and their

component parts,

Chemicals, drugs, dyes and dye stuffs, medicinal and phaimaceutical preparations, and tanning extracts, namely —

having followed mine explosion Additional waiships "Queen" and "Implacable" to replace losses, due immediately Operations continuing, ample naval and military forces present. On 16th March Rear-Admiral John Michael De Robeck succeeded to command, Vice-Admiral Carden being ill
