PROCLAMATION No 11]

PROCLAMATION

Prohibited Exports.

IN EXERCISE of the powers vested in me by the Customs Amendment Ordinance, 1915, I, Henry Conway Belfield, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, hereby declare that the exportation of the following articles be prohibited to all destinations other than the United Kingdom or British Possessions or British Protectorates —

Arms of all kinds, other than unmodified arms for sporting purposes, and their distinctive component parts

Projectiles, charges, cartridges of all kinds, and their distinctive component parts

Powder and explosives, especially prepared for use in war

Ingredients of explosives, *viz.*, nitric acid sulphuric acid, glycerine, acetone, calcium acetate and all other metallic acetates, sulphur, potassium nitrate, the fractions of the distillation products of coal tar between benzol and cresol inclusive, aniline, methylaniline, dimethylaniline, ammonium perchlorate, sodium perchlorate, sodium chlorate, barium chlorate, ammonium nitrate, cyanamide, potassium chlorate, calcium nitrate, mercury, and turpentine, (oil and spirit)

Gun mountings, limber boxes, limbers, military wagons, field forges, and their distinctive component parts

Range-finders and their distinctive component parts

Clothing and equipment of a distinctively military character

Saddle, draught, and pack animals suitable for use in war

All kinds of harness of a distinctively military character

Articles of camp equipment and their distinctive component parts

Ferro alloys, including ferro-tungsten, ferro-molybdenum, ferro-manganese, ferro-vanadium, ferro-chrome, ferro-nickel, ferro-silicon, ferro-titanium, spiegeleisen

The following metals — Tungsten molybdenum, vanadium, nickel, selenium, cobalt, manganese

The following ores — Wolframite, scheelite, molybdenite, manganese ore, nickel ore, chrome ore, zinc ore, lead ore, bauxite

Aluminium, alumina and salts of aluminium, alloys of aluminium

Antimony, together with the sulphides and oxides of antimony and alloys of antimony

Copper, unwrought and part wrought, all kinds including alloys of copper (such as brass, naval brass, and delta metal, phosphor copper and phosphor bronze) copper and brass sheets, circles, slabs, bars, pipes, ingots, scraps, rods plates, solid drawn tubes, condenser plates, copper wire B W G brass wire B W G, bronze wire, solder containing copper

Lead, pig, sheet or pipe

Barbed wire, and implements for fixing and cutting the same

Warships, including boats and their distinctive component parts of such a nature that they can only be used on a vessel of war

Submarine sound signalling apparatus

Aeroplanes, airships, balloons and aircraft of all kinds, and their component parts, together with accessories and articles recognisable as intended for use in connection with balloons and aircraft including gold beater's skin, shantung silk in the piece, flax fabric suitable for aeroplanes non-inflammable celluloid sheet (or similar transparent material non-soluble in lubricating oil, petrol or water) aeroplane dope high tensile steel tubes, aeroplane instruments (aneroids, barographs revolution indicators) aeroplane turnbuckles, steel stampings, magnetos, aeroplane engines and parts, fusel oil (amyl-alcohol) amyl-acetate, acetocelluloses, triphenyl phosphate

Tyres for motor vehicles and for cycles, together with articles, or materials especially adapted for use in the manufacture or repair of tyres

Rubber (including raw, waste, and reclaimed rubber, and goods made wholly of rubber

Mineral oils and motor spirit, except lubricating oils

Clothing, fabrics for clothing, and boots and shoes suitable for use in war

Vehicles of all kinds, other than motor vehicles available for use in war, and their component parts

Vessels, craft, and boats of all kinds, floating docks, parts of docks, and their component parts

Fuel, other than mineral oils and coal Lubricants

Powder and explosives not especially prepared for use in war

Horseshoes and shoeing materials

Harness and saddlery

Hides of all kinds, dry or wet, pigskins, raw or dressed, leather undressed or dressed, suitable for saddlery, harness or military boots

Field glasses, telescopes

AND THAT the exportation of the following goods be prohibited to all foreign ports in Europe and in the Mediterranean and Black Seas other than those of France, Russia (except Baltic Ports) Belgium, Spain and Portugal —

Armour plates
 Motor vehicles of all kinds and their component parts
 Iron pyrites
 Implements and apparatus designed exclusively for the manufacture of munitions of war, for the manufacture or repair of arms or war material for use on land and sea
 Fire arms unsuited for sporting purposes or,
 Rosin and camphor
 Haematite pig iron and haematite iron ore
 Foodstuffs, forage and feeding stuffs for animals and the raw materials thereof in so far as the exportation of such foodstuffs and forage and feeding stuffs and the raw materials thereof is not prohibited by the Proclamation dated the 29th day of January, 1915, as amended by the Proclamation dated the 9th day of February, 1915
 Railway material, both fixed and rolling stock, and materials for telegraphs, wireless telegraphs and telephones
 Chronometers and all kinds of nautical instruments
 Wool

AND THAT the Proclamation dated the 4th day of November, 1914, regarding the Prohibition of Exports be annulled

NOTICE**Under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906.****INSTRUCTIONS TO STOCK-OWNERS**

In view of Anthrax having recently occurred in such widely distant parts of the Protectorate as Nairobi Kyambu, Fort Hall, Nakuru, Lumbwa, Kericho and Kisumu, the attention of Stock-Owners is directed to the fact that this is a notifiable disease under the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906

As the disease is very fatal to man as well as to all classes of stock, great care should be exercised in the destruction of the carcass in every suspicious case. The entire body and all contaminated soil and litter should be cremated or buried deeply and the area fenced off to prevent access of other animals.

To enable a diagnosis of Anthrax to be made, the owner should forward an ear carefully packed in a secure tin box containing cotton wool or other efficient absorbent, or a swab made from the blood which escapes from a small cut into the animal's flesh as soon after death as possible, but the ear should not be removed, nor the cut made until the carcass has been taken to the place for destruction or burial.

Ears and swabs should be forwarded direct to the Veterinary Pathological Laboratory, Nairobi (Mile 333/11 Uganda Railway) and marked urgent. The necessary swabs and labels can be obtained from the above Laboratory on application.

The carcass should, with the above exception, be left unopened, as should blood be exposed to the air, the microbe assumes a highly resistant form which will contaminate a farm for many years.

NOTICE**Use of certain Prescribed Codes in the case of Telegrams destined for certain countries.**

With reference to General Notice No 120, relative to the above subject which appeared in the issue of the *Official Gazette*, dated the 3rd of March, 1915, it is hereby notified for general information that, with the exception indicated below, all of the seven Codes hitherto permitted in the case of the United Kingdom may now be employed in connection with telegrams destined for the other countries comprised in the scheme.

2 The following is a list of the countries, etc., with which telegrams in one or other of the seven prescribed Codes may now be exchanged.

United Kingdom, British Possessions, France and French Possessions, Japan and Japanese Possessions, and all Neutral Territories (excepting Italian Somaliland) outside Europe (Exceptionally as regards Argentine, Bolivia, Chili, Paraguay, Peru and Uruguay, Meyer's Code as shewn opposite may not be used)

CODES PERMITTED

A B C Code Fifth Edition, Scotts Code, Tenth Edition, Western Union Code, Liebers Code, Bentley's Complete Phrase Code (except Mining and Oil Supplements), Broomhall's Imperial Combination Code (except Special Rubber Edition), and Meyer's Atlantic Cotton Code, Thirtiyninth Edition

3 The conditions set out in paragraphs 2 to 7 inclusive of Government Notice No 247, of 1914, governing the acceptance and transmission of Code Telegrams are still in force save that, in the case of telegrams originating in this Protectorate or Uganda and destined for places in the countries, other than the United Kingdom, which are indicated above, the message will be decoded in Mombasa.

NOTICE

Formation of a Technical information Bureau at the Imperial Institute.

For some years past a steadily increasing stream of enquiries has been received by the Imperial Institute from manufacturers, merchants, and others, in Great Britain and the Colonies. These enquiries relate principally to new sources of supply of raw materials, methods of utilising new products from the Colonies and India, or to new or little-known processes and machinery for industrial purposes. The number of these enquiries has now become so great that the Secretary of State for the Colonies has authorised the formation of a Technical Information Bureau at the Institute for dealing with them.

This Bureau has already been at work for some time. It is a special branch of the Scientific and Technical Research Department, and is mainly staffed by experts who have had the advantage of experience in the work of that Department of the Imperial Institute, which is carried on in communication with producers in the Colonies, and with manufacturers and users of raw materials in this country.

The present is a specially opportune moment for the formation of such a Bureau, since the paralysis of German and Austrian trade and industry opens up opportunities for the development of many industries in this country and in the Colonies which have hitherto been monopolised by Germany. The new Bureau is already playing an active part in this work, and some examples of its activities may be given, to illustrate the kind of assistance it is prepared to render.

A very important question at the present moment is that of the supply of potash salts, which are essential in certain branches of glass and soap manufacture, and for the preparation of a large number of chemicals and manures. Germany has for many years had a practical monopoly of this industry, owing to her possession of the great potash mines of Stassfurt. The only country which has made any attempt to break this monopoly is the United States. The possible sources of supply of potash to England just now are small, being limited to imports of nitre from India, potash made from Irish and Scotch kelp, and a little obtained as by-products from wool and waste timber. Numerous enquiries have been received at the Imperial Institute from British manufacturers on this subject, and they have been placed in communication with firms who may be able to meet their requirements. It is quite certain, however, that the existing supplies are quite inadequate to meet all the demands, and the Bureau is preparing a statement as to sources of potash, which will include some hitherto almost untouched for industrial purposes. The necessary enquiries will occupy some time, but it is hoped to issue the statement early in 1915.

An equally important matter is that of finding markets in this country for the immense quantities of raw materials from India and the Colonies formerly exported to Germany. As examples of these, palm kernels and copra may be mentioned. These products have been exported on a very large scale to Germany, to be worked up into oil and feeding-cake, the former being then largely exported to England. There is no reason why this industry should not be transferred to such great oil-seed crushing centres as Hull and Liverpool. Statements giving full information regarding the German palm kernel industry are published in the "Bulletin of the Imperial Institute" (Nos 3 and 4 of 1914), and a similar statement regarding copra is published in Bulletin No 4 of 1914. The Bureau is prepared to place manufacturers interested in this industry in communication with merchants dealing in palm kernels, copra, or any other raw material.

One of the minor results of the European War is a great scarcity of thymol, a substance extensively used in medicine and pharmacy as an antiseptic. The reason for this scarcity is found in the fact that practically all the ajowan seeds, from which thymol is extracted, are exported from India to Germany. The preparation of thymol from these seeds is a simple chemical process, which can be carried on quite easily in this country. The necessary information for action on this subject has been supplied by the Bureau to various firms of British manufacturers, and a special statement on the subject is published in Bulletin No 4 of 1914. Similar statements, prepared in the Bureau, will be published in the Bulletin from time to time. In addition, short circulars will be issued gratis by the Bureau, to manufacturers and others, calling attention to Colonial and Indian raw materials likely to be of technical interest to them. The following circulars in this series have been distributed already —

1 —NEW MARKETS FOR BRITISH, COLONIAL, AND INDIAN COPRA.

This has been distributed to the principal produce merchants and dealers, and to the chief oil seed crushers in the United Kingdom.

2 —WATTLE OR MIMOSA BARK, FOR TANNING

This has been sent to tanners and dealers in tanning materials in the United Kingdom.

3 —THE PRODUCTION AND UTILISATION OF MOLYBDENITE.

This has been distributed to Geological and Mining Departments in the various countries of the Empire in which molybdenite occurs, the object being to call attention to the market for molybdenite now existing in the United Kingdom.

EUROPEAN WAR

The following telegrams have been received from the Secretary of State during the week:—

March 22nd

Official News —March 22nd, Pizemysl has fallen, news just received. Admiralty announces damage to Daidanelles forts not yet ascertained owing to unfavourable weather, no great expectations should be based on this as attack was not pressed to its conclusion, but power of fleet to dominate fortresses by superior fire seems established.

French Government reports progress at Eparges, in Argonne, German counter-attack repulsed with heavy loss, Soissons cathedral bombarded and seriously damaged in Vosges great and little Reichackerkopf captured by enemy, little Reichackerkopf since re-captured, battle continues.

Russian Government reports occupation of Memel, East Prussia, after short bombardment, Germans defeated near Myszyniec in Northern Poland. Austrians defeated in Carpathians, garrison Pizemysl attempted unsuccessful sortie, 3,000 taken prisoners, also 76 officers and 7 machine guns.

March 23rd

Official News —March 23rd, French Government reports two serious reverses inflicted on enemy in Argonne, enemy suffering very heavy losses, counterattacks completely frustrated.

Russian Government reports progress on Northern front, furious fighting in Carpathians 2,500 prisoners captured near Lupkow Pass. Near Munkacs German attacks repulsed.

March 24th

Official News —March 24th, French Government reports violent counterattacks in Argonne completely repulsed, some success at other points, at Vanquois in Champagne enemy sprayed one French trench with inflammable liquid causing French to retreat about fifteen metres.

Russian Government reports garrison which surrendered at Pizemysl consisted of 9 Generals about 2,600 Officers and 117,000 men.

About thousand Turks routed eight miles east of Suez now in full retreat.

Admiralty reports successful air attack on German submarines under construction at Hoboken near Antwerp, works set on fire and believed that both works and two submarines considerably damaged. Five submarines were seen on slips.

March 25th

Official News —March 25th, French Government reports progress by Belgian army on Yser, two German attacks completely defeated North of Arras, trenches captured and prisoners taken at Hartmansweilerkopf.

Russian Government reports slow progress being made in desperate fighting on right bank of Naew, in Carpathians. Russians advancing, over 4,000 prisoners and many machine guns captured.

March 26th

Official News —March 26th Admiralty has good reason believe German submarine U 29 has been sunk with all hands, Dutch steamer "Medea" sunk by gunfire by German submarine off Beachy Head.

French Government reports German attacks repulsed various points.

Russian Government reports decisive success near Lupkow pass, Carpathians, where important Austrian position on crest of Beskid mountain captured, nearly 6,000 prisoners and several machine guns taken.

March 27th

Official News —March 27th, French Government reports comparative quiet, continuous rainfall, a ship shed and station at Metz bombarded by French aviators.

Russian Government reports further progress Carpathians.
