PROCLAMATION

AT THE COURT AT BUCKINGHAM PALACE,

THE 3RD DAY OF FEBRUARY, 1915

PRESENT

LORD JUSTICE BANKES

WHEREAS by a Proclamation of the Piesident of the United States of America, dated the 9th April, 1910, the benefits of the United States Act of 1909, entitled "An Act to amend and consolidate the Acts respecting Copyright," were extended to the Subjects of Great Betain and her Possessions, but no provision was made therein for the protection of the musical works of British Subjects against reproduction by means of mechanical contrivances

And whereas His Majesty is advised that the Government of the United States of America has undertaken, upon the issue of this Order, to grant such protection to the musical works

of British Subjects

And whereas by reason of these premises His Majesty is satisfied that the Government of the United States of America has made, or has undertaken to make, such provision as it is expedient to require for the protection of works entitled to Copyright under the provisions of Part 1 of the Copyright Act, 1911

And whereas by the Copyright Act, 1911, authority is conferred upon His Majesty to extend, by Order-in-Council, the protection of the said Act to certain classes of foreign works within any part of His Majesty's Dominions, other than self-governing Dominions, to which the said Act, extends

And whereas it is desirable to provide protection within the said Dominions for the

unpublished works of Citizens of the United States of America

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conteried upon him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows —

- 1 The Copyright Act, 1911, including the provisions as to existing works, shall, subject to the provisions of the said Act and of this Order, apply—
 - (a) to literary, dramatic, musical and artistic works the authors whereof were at the time of the making of the works Citizens of the United States of America, in like manner as if the authors had been British Subjects
 - (b) in respect of residence in the United States of America, in like manner as if such residence had been residence in the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which the said Act extends

Provided that—

- (1) the term of Copyright within the parts of His Majesty's Dominions to which this Order applies shall not exceed that conferred by the law of the United States of America
- (ii) the enjoyment of the rights conferred by this Order shall be subject to the accomplishment of the conditions and formalities prescribed by the law of the United States of America
- (iii) in the application to existing works of the provisions of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the commencement of this Order shall be substituted for the 26th July, 1910, in subsection 1 (b)
- 2 This Order shall apply to all His Majesty's Deminions, Colonies and Possessions, with the exception of those hereinafter named, that is to say —

The Dominion of Canada

The Commonwealth of Australia

The Dominion of New Zealand

The Union of South Africa

Newfoundland

3 This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of January, 1915, which day is in this Order referred to as the commencement of this Order

And the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury are to give the necessary orders accordingly

PROCLAMATION.

AT THE COUNCIL CHAMBER, WHITEHALL,

THE 2ND DAY OF MARCH, 1915

BY THE LORDS OF HIS MAJESTY'S MOST HONOURABLE PRIVY COUNCIL

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order-in-Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Island Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may, whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 3rd day of February, 1915, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section one of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900 and Section one of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain Warlike Stores was prohibited

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of

Trade to the following effect —

That the Proclamation, dated the 3rd day of February, 1915, should be amended by

making the following amendments in and additions to the same —

(1) That the heading of 'Draw plates, jewelled, for drawing steel wire" in the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions and Protectorates should be deleted, and there be inserted in its place "Draw plates, jewelled, for drawing steel wire, and diamonds prepared for use therein"

(2) That the following articles should be added to the list of goods the exportation of which is prohibited to all destinations abroad other than British Possessions

and Protectorates -

Paraffin Wax, Prussiate of Soda

NOW, THEREFORE, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly,

Official News —French Government reports capture 300 metres trenches in Argonne and new line of trenches in Bois d'Ailly Russian Government reports capture of height 909 in Carpathians, East of Lupkow pass resulting in repulse of enemy along entire length of Carpathians in region of Russian offensive

Apul 13th

Official News —French Government reports German counter attack on Les Esparges repulsed during night Sunday and Monday Russian Government reports repulse of great enemy fortress direction of Rostoki on 10th and development of violent battle region of Uzsok Pass, which enemy still hold, Russian repulsed attacks on front Rosochrez-Orawezyk Kosziowa-Rozianka, enemy hold height 992 since 9th but Kosziowa and adjoining positions remain in Russian hands

April 14

Official News—Su John French reports situation unchanged throughout last week French Government reports positions where progress made during last eight days maintained and consolidated Russian Government reports progress north of Uzsok Pass, 2,700 prisoners and 20 machine guns captured in region Kosziowa, enemy attacks repulsed with enormous loss

April 15

Official News —Zeppelin passed over Tyneside last night, bombs dropped on various points, trifling damage, no lives lost. French Government reports trench captured Berry au Bac, counter attacks stopped on various points, some progress in Bois De Montmare, two German æroplanes captured. Russian Government reports slight further progress and continued fighting in Uszok Pass, attempted enemy offensive south of Koziowa, in Bukowina and Czernowitz failed.
