

NOW THEREFORE in exercise of the powers conferred upon me by the hereinbefore mentioned section 2, I, Henry Conway Belfield, KCMG, do hereby apply the Land Titles Ordinance, 1908, and Amendments to all lands within the area known as the Sultanate of Witu in the Province of Tanaland, and I direct that the said Ordinance shall commence and take effect from the 1st day of June, 1915

Commencing at the South-east corner of L O 1022 on Lake Nakuru, thence bounded by the Lake shore Southerly to the Northern boundary of L O 459, thence by the Northern boundary of L O 459 Westerly to the North-western corner of L O 459, thence by Western boundary of L O 459 Southerly to the North-east corner of L O 1764, thence by the Northern boundary of L O 1764 South-westerly to the North-west corner of L O 1764, thence by the Western boundaries of L O 1764 and L O 1765 Southerly to the South-west corner of L O 1765, thence North-westerly to the South-western corner of L O 1517, thence by the Southern boundaries of L O Nos 1517 and 1519 North-easterly to the South-eastern corner of L O 1519, thence by the Eastern boundaries of L O 1519 and L O 1172 North-westerly to the North-east corner of L O 1172, thence by the Northern boundary of L O 1172 Westerly to the Olare Ol Imudiak River, thence by this river down stream to the South-westerly corner of L O 1516, thence by the Southern boundary of L O 1516 Easterly to the North-western corner of L O 1529, thence by the Western boundary of L O 1529 Southerly to the South-west corner of L O 1529, thence by the Southern boundaries of L O 1529 and 1022 Easterly to the point of commencement.

EUROPEAN WAR.

The following telegrams have been received from the Secretary of State during the week:—

May 4th

Official News —In Dardanelles, during nights 1st to 2nd and 2nd to 3rd May enemy launched strongly determined attacks in mass against our positions constantly bringing up fresh troops, allies repulsed every attack inflicting enormous losses, assumed offensive, drove enemy from their positions and now advancing into interior of Peninsula. French Government reports German attacks on British front on night of 2nd and evening of 3rd May repulsed, some ground gained in Argonne. Russian Government reports desperate battle developing in Galicia since Saturday on front from Lower Nida as far as Carpathians.

May 5th

Official News —General French reports line in front of Ypres, which required re-adjustment to loss of ground through enemy's use of asphyxiating gases, now successfully completed, new line runs west of Zonnebeke, halfhearted enemy attack north-east Ypres easily beaten off. French Government reports continued progress in region Steenstraete, three enemy attacks repulsed in Champagne, advance made in Argonne. Russian Government reports Black Sea fleet vigorously bombarded forts on Bosphorus, in Galicia enemy succeeded in crossing right bank of Dunajec where Russian fire prevented further advance, in direction Stry fiercest battle continues, Russians capturing 1,200 prisoners.

May 6th

Official News —General French reports fighting on hill 60, where Germans obtained footing under cover of poisonous gases, East of Ypres enemy easily repulsed, our artillery inflicting severe losses. French Government reports progress between Hetsas and Limerne which they now hold, near Perthes enemy completely defeated numerous prisoners taken, near Bois d'Ailly Germans gained footing in French front line, part of position re-occupied by counter attack, fighting still proceeding, further progress made in Alsace. Russian Government reports fighting between Vistula and Carpathians with unvarying stubbornness, Germans have brought up very strong fresh forces supported by numerous artillery, some Russian units have fallen back to second line of fortifications, near Stry enemy recovered

lost trenches, but were dislodged by counter attack, Russians capturing 1,200 prisoners. Particulars published to-day respecting poisoning of wells by enemy in German South West Africa.

May 7th

Official News —“Lusitania” was sunk off South Coast of Ireland this afternoon presumably by submarine. General French reports re-capture by us of further trenches on hill 60, little other news from France. Russian Government reports success East of Mlawa railway, Germans in counter attack leaving about 1,000 dead, battle between Vistula and Carpathians continues with great obstinacy covered by heavy artillery fire, enemy continues concentrating forces right bank Dunajec, enemy's main effort directed towards Diecz and Jaslo, Russians severely tried by enemy's heavy artillery, enemy also suffering heavily under Russian shrapnel, Russian success near Stry developed, 2,000 prisoners being captured.

May 8th

Official News —Reports state “Lusitania” struck by two torpedoes sank in 15 to 25 minutes, total number on board 2,160 about 680 survivors, statement in some newspapers that “Lusitania” was armed is wholly false.

French Government reports violent German attack on British lines near St Julien repulsed, enemy suffering heavy losses South of Ypres, on hill 60 British recaptured part of trenches lost on 4th May. Russian Government reports Russian offensive in direction Mlawa developing successfully, desperate battle continues between Vistula and Carpathians.
