THE CUSTOMS ORDINANCE, 1910.

NOTICE TO IMPORTERS

WITH a view to discovering and preventing breaches of the Proclamations with regard to trading with the Enemy published from time to time in the *Official Gazette* it is hereby notified as under —

- (a) *Certificates of Origin and Interest* will be required in the form of the 1st Schedule to this Notice in respect of all goods, wares or merchandise, except those mentioned in the 4th Schedule to this Notice imported into the East Africa Protectorate either as cargo or by Parcels Post from Norway, Denmark, Holland and Switzerland
- (b) *Certificates of Origin and Interest* will be required in the form of the 2nd Schedule to this Notice in respect of all goods, wares or merchandise, except those mentioned in the 4th Schedule to this Notice imported into the East Africa Protectorate either as cargo or by Parcels Post from Sweden
- (c) *Certificates of Interest* will be required in the form of the 3rd Schedule to this Notice in respect of all goods, wares or merchandise imported into the East Africa Protectorate either as cargo or by Parcels Post from *all the Foreign Countries* enumerated below —

Abyssinia, Argentina, Azores, Bolivia, Brazil, Canary Islands, Cape Verde Islands, Chile, Columbia, Costa Rica, Cuba, Danish West Indies, Dominion Republic, Equador, Greece, Guatemala, Honduras, Liberia, Madeira, Mexico, Morocco Muscat, Netherland East and West Indies, Nicaragua, Panama, Paraguay, Persia, Peru, Philippine Islands, Portuguese East and West Africa, San Salvador, Spain, Spanish West Africa, Uruguay and Venezuela

2 In the case of goods re-exported from the United Kingdom from countries from which Certificates of Origin and Interest or Certificates of Interest are required by this Notice a duplicate of the "Specification for Foreign and Colonial Merchandise (Form 30)" or the "Shipping Bill (Form 64)" signed and stamped by the Proper Officers of Customs in the United Kingdom will be required in lieu of such certificates

3 Any goods, wares or merchandise imported into the East Africa Protectorate and unaccompanied by the documents required by this Notice will be detained by the Chief of Customs until requisite documents are produced. The Chief of Customs, however, will in such cases and at his discretion allow delivery of the goods on the security of a deposit or of a bond to the amount of three times the value of the goods, with a view to the production of the necessary documents within a prescribed period, provided that he sees no reason for suspecting that the goods emanate from an Enemy country

4 The period of validity shown on Certificates of Interest and Certificates of Origin and Interest will in no case exceed two months. It is required that shipment shall have been effected from the country of origin within the period of validity stated on the certificate, and it is not necessary that the goods shall have arrived at their ultimate destination within that period. The onus of proving that the goods were shipped within the period required will, if necessary, rest in cases of doubt with the importer of the goods
