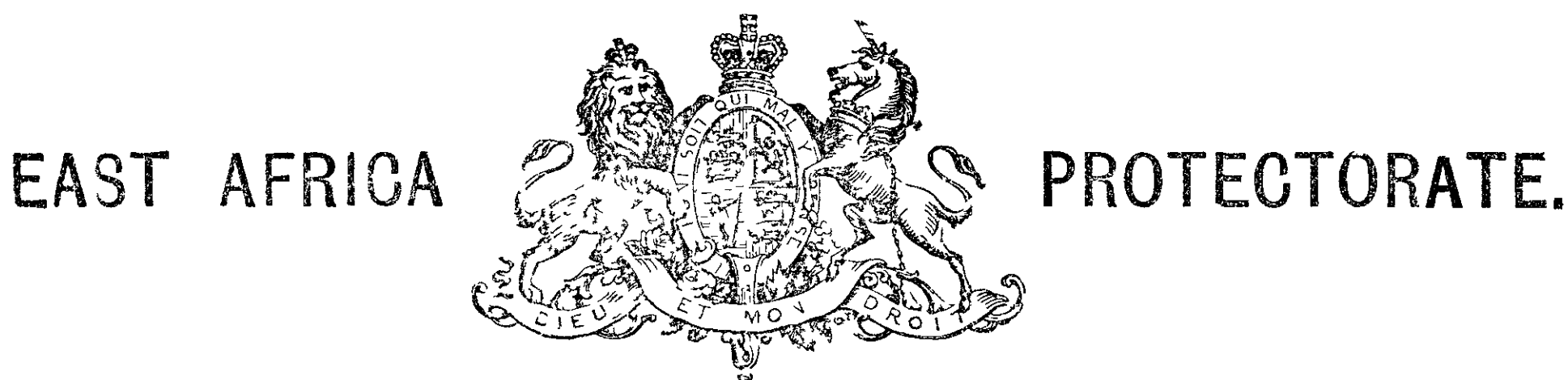

PROCLAMATION No 6]

## THE TRADING WITH THE ENEMY AMENDMENT ORDINANCE, 1916.

### PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Ordinance, 1916, Section 2 (2) I, Charles Calvert Bowring, a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor's Deputy, hereby declare that the Statutory List contained in the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916 (Proclamation No 37), as amended by subsequent Proclamations be further amended by making therein the additions, removals and variations contained in the Schedule to the Order dated the 24th day of November, 1916, made by the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council and published in the *Official Gazette* (Government Notice No 15 of 1917)

PROCLAMATION No 7]

BY THE KING

### A PROCLAMATION

FOR PROHIBITING THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM  
*GEORGE R I*

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain goods should be prohibited as hereinafter provided

NOW, THEREFORE, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows —

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz —

Jewellery and all manufactures of gold and silver other than watches and watch cases

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No 11) Proclamation, 1916

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Sixteenth day of *November*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and in the Seventh year of Our Reign

PROCLAMATION No 8]

BY THE KING

### A PROCLAMATION

MAKING CERTAIN ADDITIONS TO AND AMENDMENTS IN THE LIST OF ARTICLES TO BE TREATED  
AS CONTRABAND OF WAR

*GEORGE R I*

WHEREAS, on the 14th day of October, 1915, We did issue Our Royal Proclamation specifying the articles which it was Our intention to treat as contraband during the continuance of hostilities, or until We did give further public notice, and

Whereas, on the 27th day of January, 1916, the 12th day of April, 1916, the 27th day of June, 1916, and the 31st day of October, 1916, We did, by Our Royal Proclamations of those dates, make certain additions to and modifications in the said list of articles to be treated as contraband, and

Whereas it is expedient to make certain further additions to the said list

Now, therefore, We do hereby declare, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, that during the continuance of the war or until We do give further public notice, the following articles will be treated as absolute contraband, in addition to those set out in Our Royal Proclamations aforementioned —

Diamonds suitable for industrial purposes  
Silk in all forms and the manufactures thereof, silk cocoons  
Artificial silk and the manufactures thereof  
Quillaia bark  
Zincum, cerium, thorium, and all alloys and compounds thereof  
Zirconia and monazite sand

And We do hereby further declare that, as from this date, the following amendments shall be made in Schedule 1 of Our Royal Proclamation of the 14th day of October, 1915, aforementioned —

For item 4, “emery, corundum, natural and artificial (alundum), and carborundum in all forms,” there shall be substituted “emery, corundum, carborundum, and all other abrasive materials whether natural or artificial, and the manufactures thereof”

And We do hereby further declare that, as from this date, the following amendments shall be made in Our Royal Proclamation of the 12th day of April, 1916, aforementioned —

For “gold, silver, paper money, and all negotiable instruments and realisable securities,” there shall be substituted “gold, silver, paper money, securities, negotiable instruments, cheques, drafts, orders, warrants, coupons, letters of credit delegation or advice, credit and debit notes, or other documents, which in themselves or if completed, or if acted upon by the recipient, authorise, confirm, or give effect to the transfer of money, credit, or securities”

And We do hereby further declare that the following articles shall, as from this date, be treated as conditional contraband in addition to those set out in Our Royal Proclamations aforementioned —

Sponges, raw and prepared  
Glue, gelatine, and substances used in the manufacture thereof  
Empty barrels and casks of all kinds and their component parts

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this twenty-third day of *November*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and in the Seventh year of Our Reign

## PROCLAMATION No 9]

BY THE KING

### A PROCLAMATION

FOR PROHIBITING THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM

GEORGE R I

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain goods should be prohibited as hereinafter provided

Now, THEREFORE, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain, as follows —

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz —

Gold, manufactured or unmanufactured, including gold coin and articles consisting partly of or containing gold,  
All manufactures of silver other than silver watches and silver watch cases,  
Jewellery of any description

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to—

- (a) Any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence, or
- (b) Gold consigned for delivery at, and sale to, the Bank of England

The Prohibition of Import (No 11) Proclamation, 1916, is hereby revoked

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No 12) Proclamation, 1916

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Fifth day of *December*, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixteen, and in the Seventh year of Our Reign

## GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 10]

**THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903.****RULES**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, the Governor's Deputy has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules shall apply to the Township of Kisumu and may be cited as "Kisumu Township Dustbins Rules, 1917"

2 The occupier of any building or premises shall provide and maintain to the satisfaction of the Medical Officer of Health a receptacle for ashes and other non-liquid domestic refuse of a sufficient size, of a capacity not more in any case than 6 cubic feet, of an approved pattern and fitted with a good and efficient lid. Provided that in the case of any house occupied by more tenants than one, the owner shall be deemed to be the occupier for the purposes of these Rules

3 The occupier of any building or premises shall daily cause to be placed within the dustbin provided in terms of the foregoing Rule the domestic refuse from the said building or premises in so far as such dustbin shall be sufficient to contain the same, and shall cause such dustbin to be placed and kept upon an approved place on the plot or sub-plot upon which such building or premises stand and shall make and keep such dustbin accessible to the Municipal Sweepers during the whole period between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. on Saturdays and between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on other days. For the purposes of this Rule premises not occupied for human habitation shall not be deemed to be occupied on any day in which they are not actually occupied after the hour of 4 p.m.

4 If a nuisance shall exist upon or near any premises by reason of domestic or trade refuse produced thereon or proceeding therefrom, the Medical Officer of Health shall serve upon the occupier of such premises a notice in writing requiring him to remove the nuisance within such period as may be specified in the notice, and to prevent its recurrence and if after the expiry of notice as aforesaid such nuisance shall continue or shall by act default or sufferance of the person upon whom such notice shall have been served recur, such person unless he shall have ceased to be the occupier of the premises shall be guilty of an offence

5 Any person contravening or failing to comply with any of the provisions of these Rules shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding Rs 200/- and in default of payment thereof to a period of imprisonment not exceeding two months

6 Rule 67 of the Township Rules, 1904, is hereby cancelled in so far as it applies to Kisumu

## GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 13]

## ORDER OF THE LORDS IN COUNCIL

At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 6th day of *November*, 1916

PRESENT,

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty

LORD PRESIDENT

LORD STEWARD

EARL OF DESART

LORD COLEBPOOKE

WHEREAS by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, it is, amongst other things, provided that it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council by Order to direct that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall extend, with or without any exceptions, adaptations, or modifications, in the Order mentioned, to any foreign country in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction, and that thereupon the said Act shall, to the extent of that jurisdiction, operate as if that country were a British Possession, and as if His Majesty in Council were the Legislature of that Possession

And whereas by Treaty, grant, usage, sufferance, and other lawful means, His Majesty the King has power and jurisdiction in the East Africa Protectorate, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Northern Rhodesia, Southern Rhodesia, Swaziland, and Weihaiwei

And whereas His Majesty the King is satisfied that the Legislatures of the said Protectorates have made adequate provision for the recognition therein respectively of Probates and Letters of Administration granted by the Courts of the United Kingdom

And whereas it is expedient that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, should be extended to the said Protectorates —

Now therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Acts, 1890 and 1913, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows —

1 The Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall from the date of this Order apply to the East Africa Protectorate, the Bechuanaland Protectorate, Northern Rhodesia, Southern Rhodesia, Swaziland, and Weihaiwei, as though each of the said Protectorates were a British Possession within the meaning of the said Act

2 The Order of His late Majesty King Edward VII in Council, bearing date the 28th day of July, 1906, and declaring that the Colonial Probates Act, 1892, shall extend to authorize the sealing in the United Kingdom of Probates or Letters of Administration granted by the High Court of Southern Rhodesia, shall be and the same is hereby revoked, without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder

And the Right Honourable Andrew Bonar Law, His Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for the Colonies, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly

## GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 14]

## ORDER OF THE LORDS IN COUNCIL

At the Council Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 17th day of *November*, 1916

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council

WHEREAS it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation or Order in Council made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, as amended by the Act now in recital, may, whilst a state of war exists, be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas it is provided by Section 2 of the Customs (Exportation Restriction) Act, 1914, that any Proclamation made under Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, may whether the Proclamation was made before or after the passing of the Act now in recital, be varied or added to, whilst a state of war exists, by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of the Board of Trade

And whereas by a Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, and made under Section 8 of the Customs and Inland Revenue Act, 1879, and Section 1 of the Exportation of Arms Act, 1900, and Section 1 of the Customs (Exportation Prohibition) Act, 1914, the exportation from the United Kingdom of certain articles to certain or all destinations was prohibited

And whereas by subsequent Orders of Council the said Proclamation was amended and added to in certain particulars

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Board of Trade to the following effect —

That the Proclamation, dated the 10th day of May, 1916, as amended and added to by subsequent Orders of Council, should be further amended by making the following amendments in and additions to the Schedule to the same —



(1) That the following headings should be deleted —

- (c) Casein and preparations thereof,
- (B) Cocaine and its salts and preparations,

(B) Emery, corundum, natural or artificial (such as alundum) carborundum and cristolon and manufactures thereof,

Hemp and hemp manufactures, the following—

- (A) Italian, Russian and Manila hemp, Maguey fibre, and manufactures thereof,
- (c) Other hemp and manufactures thereof,
- (B) Mica, mica chimneys, mica splittings, micanite and micanite cloth,
- (c) Varnishes, spirit, containing gum

(2) That the following headings should be added —

- (A) Barometers,
- (B) Casein and preparations thereof,
- (A) Cocaine and its salts and preparations,
- (c) Electrical apparatus and plant for the generation, distribution and utilisation of electric power, not otherwise prohibited,
- (B) Linery and corundum and manufactures thereof, carborundum, alundum, cristolon and all other artificial abrasives and manufactures thereof,

Hemp and hemp manufactures, the following,

- (A) Hemp ropes, old,

(A) Hemp waste,

(A) Italian Russian and Manila hemp, Maguey fibre, and manufactures thereof, except Tagal braid,

(c) Other hemp and manufactures thereof, not otherwise specifically prohibited,

(c) Tagal braid

Insulating materials, the following

(c) Compounds intended for the purpose of electrical insulation,

(c) Lead, oxides of,

(c) Zinc-barium pigments made from zinc salts and barium sulphate,

(B) Mica, mica splittings, mica powder, micanite, articles made from them, and insulating materials containing them,

(c) Oils, essential (except turpentine oil),

(A) Thermometers (except clinical thermometers),

(c) Varnishes not otherwise prohibited,

(c) Waterproof wearing apparel, not otherwise specifically prohibited,

(c) Wearing apparel, manufactured wholly, or partly of wool or hair, not otherwise specifically prohibited,

(c) Wool, or hair, all manufactures, mixtures and products of, not otherwise specifically prohibited

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved

Whereof the Commissioners of His Majesty's Customs and Excise, the Director of the War Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly

## GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 15]

### ORDER OF THE LORDS IN COUNCIL

#### TRADING WITH THE ENEMY (NEUTRAL COUNTRIES) ORDER (No 21), 1916.

At the Council Chamber, *Whitehall*, the 24th day of *November*, 1916

By the Lords of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council

Whereas His Majesty has been pleased, in exercise of the power in that behalf conferred on Him by Section one, sub-section one, of the Trading with the Enemy (Extension of Powers) Act, 1915, by divers Proclamations, and in particular by a Proclamation dated the 23rd day of May, 1916, entitled "The Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916, No 3," to prohibit all persons or bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, resident, carrying on business, or being in the United Kingdom from trading with any of the persons or bodies of persons mentioned in the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation

And whereas by Section one, sub-section two, of the said Act, it is provided that any List of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated with whom such trading is prohibited by a Proclamation under the said Act may be varied or added to by an Order made by the Lords of the Council on the recommendation of a Secretary of State, such List as so varied or added to being in the last mentioned Proclamation referred to as the "Statutory List"

And whereas the List contained in the last mentioned Proclamation has been varied and added to by subsequent Orders of Council

And whereas there was this day read at the Board a recommendation from the Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs to the following effect —

That the "Statutory List" of persons and bodies of persons, incorporated or unincorporated, with whom trading is prohibited, should be further amended by the variation and addition of the names set forth in the Schedule hereto

Now, therefore, Their Lordships, having taken the said recommendation into consideration, are pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the same be approved

Whereof the Right Honourable Viscount Grey, K G one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, the Controller of the Foreign Trade Department, and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly

When the applicant wishes this done by telegraph he must undertake to pay the cost of the telegraphic correspondence. A considerable amount of information is, however, already available at the Foreign Trade Department, and it is hoped that it may be possible in many cases to suggest the names of satisfactory substitutes in response to inquiries, without the necessity of referring the matter abroad. It would greatly facilitate the work of this Department if applicants in making inquiries would specify the particular trade, or trades, for which substitutes are required

With reference to the notification which was published in the London Gazette of May 30 last a translation is appended of the Portuguese Decree No 2565 of August 14 1916, relating to procedure in the Portuguese Prize Courts —

(TRANSLATION)

*Decree No 2565 (August 14, 1916)*

Article 1 —The form of procedure in the Prize Courts shall be the summary form laid down in Decree No 3 of the 29th of May, 1907, with the modifications set forth in the following Articles —

Article 2 —In the Statement of Claim the Plaintiff shall ask that the Defendant be served with notice to produce, at the Registrar's Office, within the fixed period of five days, a Statement of Defence, setting forth his whole defence

Sub-Clause 1 —With regard to Article 36 of the Decree No 2350 of the 20th of April, 1916, the Action shall be laid against the Depository-Administrator, or the Advocate, and, at the same time, his appointment and a summons for him to appear shall be applied for

Sub-Clause 2 —When it is necessary to do so, the Judge shall at once proceed to make such appointment, and, in the same Order, shall order the summons to be issued. Service of this summons must be effected within forty-eight hours

Article 3 —If the hearing of witnesses shall have been applied for, then during the three days following the filing of the Statement of Defence, or such further period as may be granted for the purpose, not more than three witnesses put forward by each party shall be heard, no interlocutory proceeding or other delay being admitted, and, on the day next following, the Judge shall deliver Provisional Judgment. Notice of this Judgment shall be served within twenty-four hours, or it may be made public at a sitting of the Court, and thenceforth shall be of full effect and validity

Article 4 —Upon the termination of the above mentioned proceedings the case shall be allotted according to its class to a Registrar of the Court. The Plaintiff may then reply to the Statement of Defence already filed. This reply must be filed and the other proceedings set forth in the 5th and following Articles of Decree No 3 of the 29th of May, 1907, shall be completed within 5 days of service of notice on publication of the Provisional Judgment

Sole Sub-Clause —Should there have been no Statement of Defence, or if it is declared to be of no avail, the Provisional Judgment shall become final

Article 5 —From the final Judgment, delivered in Prize Proceedings, an Appeal will always lie direct to the Supremo Tribunal de Justiça (the Supreme Court of Justice), where cognisance will be taken of the nullities alleged, and of Interlocutory Appeals which may be pending, no other Appeal being allowed

Article 6 —The Surveys of vessels, made by the Technical Committees, which are treated of in Article 29\* of Decree No 2350, are sufficient proof both for the Provisional and the Final Judgments

Article 7 —Judgments upholding a capture, whether provisional or final, shall be communicated direct by the Judges delivering them to the Ministry for Foreign Affairs in view of the possible bearing thereon of Article 2 of the 12th Hague Convention of October, 1907, approved by the Decree of February 24, 1911

Article 8 —The Legal Representative of the State shall always intervene as the principal party in Prize Proceedings, without prejudice to any other legitimately interested person being a co-Plaintiff therein

Article 9 —There shall be no Vacation Terms in the proceedings treated of by this Decree

Article 10 —This Decree shall come into force immediately, and all provisions which are antagonistic are revoked

The Ministers of all the Departments will thus take cognisance of it, and cause it to be carried out

UNDER MARTIAL LAW

REGULATION No 10 (h)

"No person shall import into German East Africa, or any portion of German East Africa occupied or administered by His Britannic Majesty's Forces, save under due authority, any German currency. In addition to any penalty authorised by Regulation No 24 of April 1st, 1916, any person arrested under this clause shall be liable to suffer forfeiture of any such currency so imported or found in his possession."

REGULATION No 10 (i)

"Whereas the Imperial German Administration of German East Africa has, for the purpose of prosecuting war against His Britannic Majesty, issued or caused to be issued certain paper currency called "Interims Bank Note". Now it is hereby declared that such post war currency or any other post war currency issued by Enemy administration or Banks, shall not be legal tender nor in any way recognised as currency. Any person making or attempting to make payments in such post war paper currency, or circulating same, shall be deemed to have committed an offence under Martial Law, and will be proceeded against accordingly."
