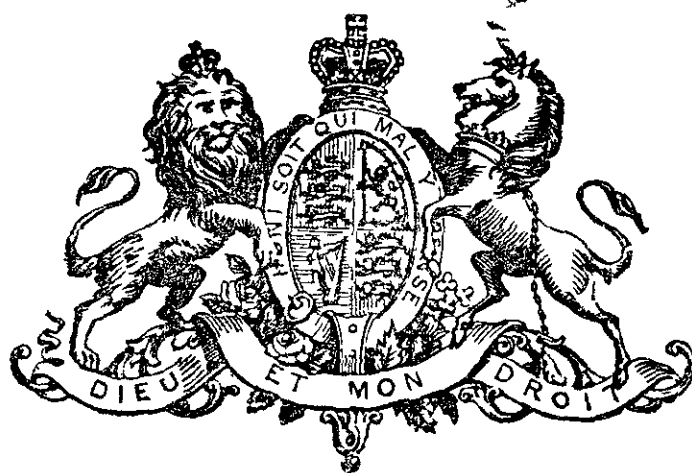

## THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1906.

### PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, I Henry Conway Belfield, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the East Africa Protectorate, do hereby declare the whole of the Masai Reserve as defined in a Proclamation dated 23rd day of July, 1912, under the Outlying Districts Ordinance, 1902, to be an infected area for the purposes of the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906

### PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon me by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, I, Henry Conway Belfield, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief of the East Africa Protectorate, hereby declare —

- (1) that until further notice the importation into the Protectorate of all animals, carcasses, hides, skins, hair or wool from the territory known as German East Africa without a permit from the Chief Veterinary Officer or any Officer authorised by him to issue such permits be prohibited
- (2) that the Proclamations and Notices set out in the Schedule hereto be revoked

1 THE Company shall supply and the Consumer shall pay for a supply of electric energy to the electric lamps shown in the Schedule below, which the Consumer hereby certifies to be a correct statement of the number and description of all electric lamps installed in his premises, until the termination of this Agreement at the rate of \_\_\_\_\_ cents per B O T Unit

2 THE Company shall supply and the Consumer shall pay for a supply of electric energy to the various devices, apparatus, etc, capable of consuming electric energy shown in the Schedule below, which the Consumer hereby certifies to be a correct statement of the number and description of all electric apparatus installed in his premises, until the termination of this Agreement at the rate of \_\_\_\_\_ cents per B O T Unit

3 THE Company shall supply and the Consumer shall pay for a supply of electric energy to the electric motors shown in the table below, which the Consumer hereby certifies to be a correct statement of the number and description of all electric motors installed in his premises, until the termination of this Agreement at the rate of \_\_\_\_\_ cents per B O T Unit

4 THE Company shall provide, and the Consumer shall pay rent for, an efficient meter to register the current supplied under this Agreement, at the rate of Rs \_\_\_\_\_ per calendar month or part of a month

5 THE Consumer shall hold himself responsible to the Company for any electricity supplied to or consumed upon his premises until notice in writing is received from him by the Company requiring the supply to be discontinued, whether or no he still occupies the premises

6 THE installation on the Consumer's premises not being the property of the Company shall be maintained at his expense to the reasonable satisfaction of the engineer of the Company. It will be tested and passed by the Company before connection is made. Should any defect be thereafter discovered, the Company may forthwith cut off and discontinue the supply of current until such defect is remedied to their reasonable satisfaction

7 THE Consumer shall take reasonable care of any meter cables insulators or other fittings or material being the property of the Company situated on the premises occupied by him and used for the purposes of this Agreement

8 THE Consumer shall not after the installation has been tested and passed by the Company make or allow to be made any alterations or any additional lights or wires or apparatus of any description to be connected thereto until notice of his intention has been given in writing to the Company and confirmation of the same has been received from them by him

AND he undertakes to make no use whatsoever of the supply except for the lights, motors and other devices specified in the Schedule below

9 THE Company shall supply electric energy continuously day and night, but the Company shall not be responsible for any necessary stoppage or deficiency of energy caused by the Company effecting maintenance or repairs or by testing by Inspectors appointed by Government or by force majeure, strikes, or other causes, but they shall restore the supply as soon as may be reasonably possible

10 THE Consumer shall settle his account for the electric energy supplied under this Agreement on or before the 15th day of each month after the first month of supply and failing payment within the time specified the Company may after giving one week's notice in writing to the Consumer cut off the supply and discontinue same and shall not reconnect same until a fee of Rs 10 for such reconnecting has been paid

11 THE Consumer shall allow of free access to the servants of the Company at all reasonable times to allow of them inspecting and testing the installation, and reading the meter and removing, replacing or repairing the same

2 Under the terms of their Concession from Government the Company have undertaken that they will upon being required to do so by the owner or occupier of any premises situate within the Township of Nairobi, and all other portions of the area comprised within a circle drawn at a radius of 15 miles from the present Municipal Offices, and also within such portions of the area between the before-mentioned area and the Ruiru Falls (which are situate at or near the point, about 18 miles from the Township, where the Ruiru River crosses the Fort Hall Road) as shall be situate within three miles of any part of the main land by the Contractor between the said area and the said Falls, supply such amount of electricity as such consumer may from time to time require for lighting or power purposes on such premises at a price which shall in the case of electricity supplied for lighting purposes not exceed 50 cents per English Board of Trade unit of such electricity, and will in the case of electricity supplied for power purposes not exceed 18 75 cents per like unit of such electricity

3 The Company may charge for electricity supplied by them under their Concession (i) by the actual amount of electricity so supplied, or (ii) by the electrical quantity contained in such supply, or (iii) by such other method as may be for the time being agreed upon between the Company and consumer and approved of by Government

4 The cost of so much of any electric line for the supply of electricity to any owner or occupier as may be laid upon the property of such owner or in the possession of such occupier, and of so much of any such electric lines as it may be necessary to lay to a greater distance in the Township than 60 yards, and in that part of the area of supply which is outside the confines of the Township than half a mile from any high tension main of the Company, although not on such property, shall if the Company so require be defrayed by such owner or occupier

5 Except as regards certain special provisions for the benefit of the Municipal Committee the Company cannot in making any agreements for the supply of electricity shew any undue preference to any company or person, but, save as aforesaid, the Company may make such charges for the supply of electricity to any consumer within the area of supply as may be agreed upon between the Company and such consumer and shall not exceed the price quoted above
