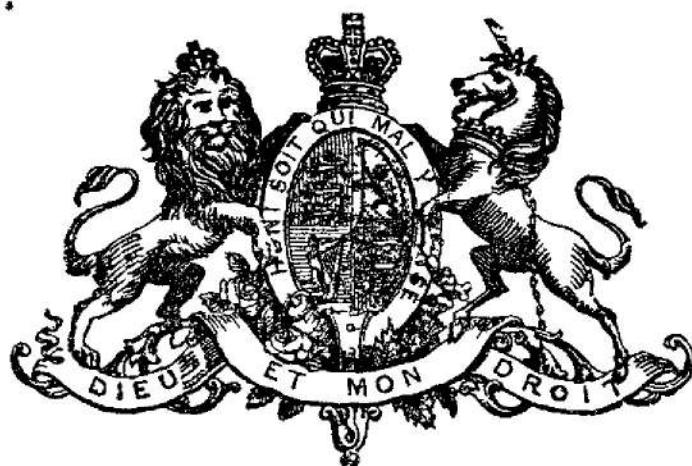

NOTICE

Issue of passports to women and children.

By order of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, the following regulations respecting the grant of passports to women and children are issued in supersession of all previous notices

A — BRITISH VESSELS

1 Passports for women and children to proceed through the danger zones will not be granted except in exceptionally urgent cases, such as for war work or exceptionally urgent domestic or health or business reasons. The decision as to whether or not a passport is to be granted in such cases is left to the discretion of the Governor or his Deputy. Such permission will very rarely be given, and leave to travel *via* the Mediterranean will not be given at all for the present.

2 Women and children who arrive at Colonial ports *en route* to their destination will be allowed to proceed but they will be warned of the risk to which they subject themselves.

B — NEUTRAL AND ALLIED VESSELS

Passports will be granted to women and children desirous of proceeding on neutral and allied vessels provided that they are prepared to face the risk. It is, however, necessary to warn the public that the journey through the Mediterranean is at the present time attended with considerable danger.

Applications for the grant of passports should be made to the Secretariat in writing, stating clearly the grounds on which such application is based. As much notice as possible should be given.
