IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, I, Charles Calvert Bowring, a Companion of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Acting Governor of the East Africa Protectorate, do hereby declare the whole of the area set forth in the Schedule attached hereto to be an infected area for the purposes of the above Ordinance

Proclamation No 32 under the above Ordinance and dated the 12th day of April, 1917, is hereby repealed

### SCHEDULE

From Gilgil Station corner of the East Africa Syndicate Land, along the Western boundary to the junction of Mr Colville's road and the main Laikipia road, thence in a straight line running parallel at four hundred yards distance to the Gilgil River, thence in a straight line in a South Easterly direction to where the Turathi River intersects the boundary, thence in a straight line in a Westerly direction to Company's Bridge over the Melau River, thence in a straight line in a Westerly direction to the Uganda Railway Bridge over the Gilgil River, thence following the Northern side of the Railway to the corner of the Syndicate farm at Gilgil Station

## THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903

### RULES

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules —

1 These Rules shall apply to the Township of Nairobi and may be cited as "The Nairobi Township Cycle Amendment Rules, 1917"

2 Rule 2 of Township Rules dated 15th January, 1912, is hereby amended by substituting for the words "31st day of December" the words "15th day of January"

3 Rule 4 of Township Rules dated 15th January, 1912, is hereby amended by inserting after the word "visible" the following words —

"and kept in a clearly legible condition"

4 Rule 6 of Township Rules dated 15th January, 1912, is hereby amended by substitution of the words "two rupees for the figures and words "25 cents"

5 Rule 2 of the Nairobi Township Cycle Rules (No 2 of 1912) is hereby amended by deleting the words "Such licences shall be issued by the Town Clerk on payment of a fee of Re 1/- and each licence shall expire on the 31st December of the year in which it shall have been granted" and substituting therefor the following —

"Such licences shall be monthly licences and shall be issued by the Town Clerk on payment in advance of a fee of Rs 5/- per calendar month or part thereof"

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 150]

**MARTIAL LAW REGULATIONS.**

HIS EXCELLENCY the Acting Governor has been pleased to issue the following Regulations under Martial Law —

1 These Regulations shall apply to persons of European or Asiatic origin

2 No person who at the date of the promulgation of these Regulations is engaged or who may at any time thereafter be engaged in any employment as an employee shall leave such employment without the consent of his employer. Provided that in the event of an employer's consent being unreasonably withheld the employee may appeal to the District Committee appointed under the Compulsory Service Ordinance, 1915, of the District in which the trade, business or occupation in which he is employed is situated and such District Committee may give the employee permission to leave his employment and provided that in the event of the District Committee refusing such permission the employee may appeal from the decision of the District Committee to the War Council appointed under the aforesaid Ordinance whose decision shall be final

3 Nothing in these Regulations contained shall be deemed to limit or affect the power of the War Council at any time to select any male employee for military service in accordance with the provisions of Section 5 of the Compulsory Service Ordinance, 1915

4 (1) No person shall after the promulgation of these Regulations give employment to any person unless he holds a certificate from the employer by whom he was last employed or in accordance with these Regulations, holds a certificate from a District Committee or a District Commissioner that he is free to accept employment

(2) If any person complains to a District Committee that an employer has unreasonably refused or neglected to issue a certificate as aforesaid the District Committee may after inquiry into the case if it thinks fit itself issue such a certificate or order the issue of such a certificate by the employer

(3) A District Commissioner may issue a certificate as aforesaid to any person who has not heretofore been in employment in the Protectorate or to any person who is out of employment at the date of the promulgation of these Regulations

5 Where an employee is discharged or dismissed by his employer or the employee otherwise leaves his employment in accordance with these Regulations the employer shall forthwith give him a certificate as aforesaid

6 These Regulations shall be read together with the Martial Law Regulations of the 10th December, 1914, and any breach of these Regulations shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs 3,000/- or with imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding six months or with both

## NOTICE

**Prohibition of Import of Firearms into the United Kingdom.**

WITH reference to the prohibition on the importation into the United Kingdom of sporting guns, carbines and rifles, the Board of Trade has intimated that they offer no objection under the Prohibition of Import (No 8) Proclamation to the admission of Sporting Guns carried as *bona fide* passenger's luggage

In addition, however, to the authority required under the Prohibition of Import Proclamations, it is necessary for the importers to obtain a permit for the importation of firearms under No 31 of the Defence of the Realm Regulations. Applications for such permits in the case of firearms brought over as luggage should be made to the Customs Officer at the port of landing

**PRIORITY OF INDENTS**

DOWNING STREET,  
5th February, 1917

Sir,

With reference to Mr Bonar Law's Circular despatch of 30th of August, 1915, I have the honour to transmit to you, for your information, copies of a public notice issued by the Board of Trade regarding the use of manifests and bills of lading during the War. This notice you will observe, supersedes the announcement enclosed in that despatch.

2 I have to add that a notice was published in the "Board of Trade Journal" of 18th January informing shippers and ship-owners trading with the Netherlands that, in the case of the shipment of goods consigned to the Netherlands Oversea Trust, the number of the corresponding Netherlands Oversea Trust permit should be inserted in the manifest against each item of cargo, and the bills of lading relating to such shipments should not be signed unless this permit number appears thereon.

NOTICE TO SHIPPERS AND SHIPOWNERS RESPECTING MANIFESTS  
AND BILLS OF LADING

The attention of Shippers and Ship-owners and the trading community generally is drawn to the fact that in time of war the practice of shipping goods with Bills of Lading made out "to order" (made illegal by section 4 of the Customs (War Powers) Act, 1915, in the case of goods shipped from the United Kingdom under licence) is very undesirable in respect of any goods exported from any part of the British Empire. Shippers of goods not requiring licences are therefore advised not to make out Bills of Lading "to order," but only —

- (a) to a named consignee, or
- (b) to a bank or financial house of high standing, with the remark in the margin of the Bill of Lading "Notify A B," "A B" being the name of the person or firm for whom the goods are ultimately destined.

Goods shipped to Holland should be consigned to the Netherlands Oversea Trust

It is essential during the war that, in the case of all goods, whether shipped under licence or not, British ships should have on board throughout the voyage a full manifest of cargo and all the Bills of Lading, or certified copies of the Bills of Lading.

Unless these requirements are complied with, there will be a risk that the ships will be stopped and diverted by H M Ships or the War Vessels of the Allied Nations, in order to permit of full examination of cargo, and ascertainment of its destination.

In the case of British Ships that will touch at ports in countries contiguous to enemy-territory, compliance with these requirements is of special importance and serious delay may result to ship and cargo in such cases if all ship's papers are not on board and in order.

This Notice supersedes the announcement made by the Board of Trade on August 19th, 1915, (see "Board of Trade Journal" of 26th August 1915, pp 594-5), but in no way affects the requirements of section 4 of the Customs (War Powers) Act, 1915, in regard to licensed goods.

CUSTOMS No 1 (CIVIL AREA)

WHEREAS by Proclamation dated the 8th day of September, 1916, all manufactured goods, raw materials, livestock and other things were declared to be dutiable save and except those set out in the second schedule to the said Proclamation, and the rates set out in the first schedule thereto were declared to be the duties payable on imported or exported dutiable goods

Now it is hereby declared that as and from the first day of April, 1917, Schedules I and II hereto shall be substituted for and read in lieu of the said Schedules I and II to the said Proclamation which is amended accordingly and is hereby applied to the area defined in the schedule to the Proclamation of the 22nd December, 1916

## SCHEDULE I

## IMPORT DUTIES

On distilled liquors (other than drugs and medicines imported for *bona fide* medical purposes) Eau de Cologne and lavender water, per gallon at 50 degrees of the Gaylussac alcoholometer at a temperature of 15 degrees centigrade—Rs 5/-, the duty to be augmented proportionately for each degree above 50 degrees and diminished proportionately for each degree below 50 degrees

On all other goods of every description not being specially exempted an *ad valorem* duty at the rate of ten per cent

For the purpose of calculating the above Import and Export duties the value of goods shall be deemed to be the cash price at which the goods are capable of being sold in the Custom House without profit or loss to the importer or exporter at the time or place of importation or exportation as the case may be without any deduction except in the case of goods imported the amount of duties payable on importation

## SCHEDULE II

## GOODS EXEMPT FROM IMPORT DUTY

1 Personal baggage consisting of wearing apparel and other articles of personal use, as are in actual use at the time of importation, or have been actually in use previously and are the property of the person whose baggage is being passed or of any member of such person's family,

2 Bicycles, binoculars, photographic cameras, and sewing machines which have been used, and instruments intended for the professional use of passengers, forming part of passengers' baggage and not intended for trading purposes,



3 Goods when imported by, or purchased prior to clearing through the Customs by and for the use of His Britannic Majesty's Naval or Military Forces, or of the Civil Government of the occupied territory,

4 All horses and mules,

5 Other live stock imported for breeding purposes, provided that

(a) All live stock imported for breeding purposes for which exemption from Customs duty is claimed shall, except in cases where permission is given by a Veterinary Officer, be landed at such port or ports as may be hereafter notified

(b) All live stock shall in order to be admitted free of duty be of a class which in the opinion of the examining Veterinary Officer is likely to improve the existing stock in the country,

(c) Live stock for the purpose of this exemption means cattle, sheep, goats, donkeys, swine, ostriches and poultry,

6 Goods imported by or consigned direct to Officers and men on board vessels of His Majesty's Navy for their personal use or consumption,

If goods imported by a merchant are sold to His Majesty's Navy, such goods shall be treated as goods re-exported,

7 Ships and vessels imported entire or in sections,

8 Material for the construction and maintenance of Railways,

9 Trees, plants and seeds intended for cultivation,

10 Tombstones and cinaments for graves, memorial windows, tablets and brasses,

11 Coal,

12 Photographs, engravings, pictures and maps,

13 Gold bullion,

14 Coin admitted to circulation in the Protectorate,

15 Agricultural implements and machinery and all apparatus and plant usually and principally employed in farming operations,

16 Sheep and cattle medicines whether for internal or external application For the purpose of this exemption, medicines shall be deemed to include powder and other preparations for the composition of sheep and cattle dips and licks

17 Manures and insecticides,

18 Industrial machinery,

19 Printed matter, which term shall include newspapers, periodicals, literature, fashion plates, pamphlets, music trade catalogues, price lists, show cards, calendars, and all printed or lithographed matter used or intended to be used solely for advertising purposes

20 Officers' Uniforms, *viz*, the uniform of a Naval or Military Officer or Civil Servant including the necessary arms, badges and accoutrements thereto,

21 Regimental plate, furniture, and other Mess fittings, and band instruments the property of any Regimental Mess or the joint property of the Officers of any Regimental Mess,

22 Officers' camp furniture and fittings imported as a necessary part of their equipment

23 All articles necessary for maintaining telegraphic communication between occupied enemy territory and other parts of the world,

24 All coats of arms, flags, seals and official stationery and other goods as may from time to time be declared to be within the exemption in respect of any Consulate imported by a Consular Officer, on presentation by him at the Customs House of a certificate given by the Consulate for which they are destined, that the articles are for its exclusive use,

25 Cups, medals or other trophies imported for presentation or presented as prizes at examinations, exhibitions, shows or other public competitions, for excellence in art, bravery, good conduct, humanity, industry, invention, manufactures, learning, science, skill, or sport or honourable or meritorious public services, provided that such articles shall on importation or delivery free from the Customs bear engraved or otherwise indelibly marked on them the name of the presenter or presentee and the occasion or purpose for which presented

26 Wire and wire netting for fencing, droppers, gates, hurdles, posts, standards, strainers, staples, stiles, winders, and other materials or fastenings of metal ordinarily used for agriculture or railway fencing,

27 Empty bags (other than paper bags) and crates for flour, manure, produce, sugar, wool, coal, and minerals and bagging and sacking in the piece and binding twine,

28 Bands and belting of all kinds for driving machinery,

29 Motor vehicles suitable constructed for, and intended to be usually and principally employed in, the conveyance of goods, and spare parts of such motor vehicles,

30 Petrol,

31 Electric cable or wire, the posts for carrying the same and all other material required for the purposes of generating storing or distributing electric energy, whether for power or lighting, on satisfactory proof to the proper Officer of Customs that such articles and materials have been imported solely for such purposes

Such exemption shall not include lamps or their fittings or material, other than industrial machinery, required for the purpose of using electric energy
