UNDER MARTIAL LAW.

REGULATIONS

HIS EXCELLENCY the Acting Governor has been pleased to issue the following Regulations Under Martial Law —

- (1) These regulations shall be read together with the regulations issued Under Martial Law and dated the 25th day of May, 1917
- (2) In addition to the maximum prices prescribed by regulation 4 of the aforesaid regulations of the 25th day of May, 1917, no person shall sell maize meal made from Hickory King maize in quantities less than 60 lbs. at a rate exceeding 20 lbs for one rupee and no person shall sell Maize meal made from Native maize in quantities less than 60 lbs. at a rate exceeding 25 lbs. for one rupee.
- (3) These regulations shall come into operation on the date of their promulgation in the Gazette
- (4) Any person contravening any of the provisions of these regulations shall be liable on conviction to the penalties prescribed by the aforesaid regulations of the 25th day of May 1917, for a breach thereof

CIRCULAR

MOTOR CYCLE ALLOWANCES

HIS EXCELLENCY has approved of a revision of the lates of motor cycle allowances, which will for the future be calculated on the following lines

- In cases in which efficiency would be so greatly increased thereby that it would be in the interests of the Government service to purchase a motor cycle (were it not that the system of allowances is preferable) the allowance is intended to cover running expenses and depreciation, up to a fixed maximum. In this category will be included cases in which the average monthly mileage is not less than 200 miles, and special cases of Senioi Officials whose time is of exceptional value, including District Commissioners who would use this means of transport for part of the year only, and of those who require motor bicycles for use in emergency.
- 3 In cases not included in the above category in which an official owns a motor cycle and will save Government time appleciably by using it, an allowance may be granted to cover running expenses only
- 4 The maximum monthly allowance granted will be, as a general rule, Rs 45 When the travelling is to be undertaken on exceptionally rough roads outside the neighbourhood of townships, that part of the allowance which is intended to cover running expenses will be higher than elsewhere, and the maximum monthly allowance may be extended to Rs 50
- 5 Attention is called to section 216a of the Code of Regulations, which is amended only in respect of the maximum monthly allowance. The rates are liable to revision at any time
- 6 Applications for the grant of these allowances should be made in duplicate in the form attached, through the Treasurer, both immediately in respect of all existing allowances in order that they may be revised, and in future in respect of any further applications which are recommended for consideration
