

PROCLAMATION

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Trading with the Enemy Amendment Ordinance, 1916, Section 2 (2), I, William John Monson, Governor's Deputy, East Africa Protectorate, hereby declare that the Statutory List contained in the Trading with the Enemy (Statutory List) Proclamation, 1916 (Proclamation No 37), as amended by subsequent Proclamations be further amended by making therein the additions, variations and removals contained in the Schedule annexed hereto—

Proclamation No 87]

By THE KING

A PROCLAMATION

RELATING TO THE IMPORTATION OF CERTAIN ARTICLES INTO THE UNITED KINGDOM

GEORGE, RI

WHEREAS by Section forty-three of the Customs Consolidation Act, 1876, it is provided that the importation of arms, ammunition, gunpowder, or any other goods may be prohibited by Proclamation

And whereas by certain Proclamations entitled Prohibition of Import Proclamations the importation of certain goods has been prohibited accordingly

And whereas it is expedient that the importation into the United Kingdom of certain other goods should be prohibited

Now, therefore, We, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, in pursuance of the said Act and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf, do hereby proclaim, direct and ordain as follows —

As from and after the date hereof, subject as hereinafter provided, the importation into the United Kingdom of the following goods is hereby prohibited, viz —

Carbons for arc lamps
Carbons for searchlights
Cartridges of all kinds and parts thereof

Electric dry cells and carbons therefor

Provided always, and it is hereby declared, that this prohibition shall not apply to any such goods which are imported under licence given by or on behalf of the Board of Trade, and subject to the provisions and conditions of such licence

This Proclamation may be cited as the Prohibition of Import (No. 17) Proclamation, 1917

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this twenty-eighth day of *June*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and seventeen, and in the Eighth year of Our Reign

THE DISEASES OF PLANTS PREVENTION ORDINANCE, 1910

REGULATIONS

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Diseases of Plants Prevention Ordinance, 1910, the Governor's Deputy has been pleased to make the following Regulations —

1 These Regulations may be cited as "The Diseases of Plants Prevention Amendment Regulations, 1917," and shall be read together with the Diseases of Plants Prevention (Importation) Regulations, 1917

2 Regulation 2 of the Diseases of Plants Prevention (Importation) Regulations, 1917

(Government Notice No 236), is hereby revoked

3 No person shall import any Citius tiee of Citrus fruit into the Protectorate except

with the permission in writing of the Director of Agriculture previously obtained

4 The provisions of the Diseases of Plants Prevention (Importation) Regulations, 1917, as amended by these Regulations shall not apply to the importation of Citius fruit grown on the Islands of Zanzibar or Pemba

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No 308]

UNDER MARTIAL LAW.

REGULATIONS

The Governor's Deputy has been pleased to issue the following Regulations under Martial Law —

1 No importer of rice flour or sugar holding stocks of rice flour or sugar not already disposed of under a permit from the Food Controller shall refuse or fail to sell and deliver to any person the quantity of rice flour or sugar specified on a permit to purchase issued by the Food Controller and held by such person if such person at the time he produces his permit to purchase tenders cash in payment for the goods at the rate fixed by any authority having power to fix maximum prices for the sale of foodstuffs

The Food Controller may from time to time call for retuins in such form as he may prescribe of rice, flour, sugar or any other foodstuff held by any person for the purpose of sale whether by wholesale or retail. Any person who refuses to make any return when called for or who shall make an inaccurate or false return shall be guilty of an offence under

these Regulations

3 The Food Controlle, or any personauthoused by him may enter and search any godown, shop, dwelling house or other premises for the purpose of verifying any return or for the purpose of ascertaining whether any rice, flour, sugar or other foodstuff is concealed upon such premises

4 These Regulations shall be read together with the Martial Law Regulations of the 14th day of August, 1917, and any person committing a breach of these Regulations shall be liable on conviction to a fine of Rs 750/- or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding 6 months or to both

5 These Regulations may be administered by any Magistrate holding a Court of the first or second class
