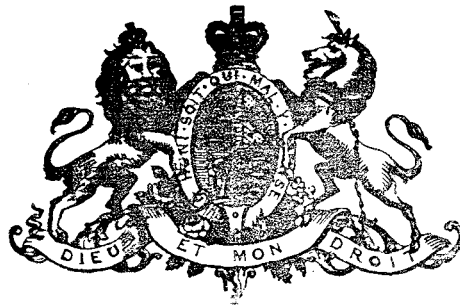

THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These Rules may be cited as "The Nairobi Township (Milk) Amendment Rules, 1917," and shall be read together with the Nairobi Township Rules of 1917 hereafter referred to as the Principal Rules.

2. Rule 513 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "deliver, cause to be delivered" after the words "shall sell."

3. Rule 514 of the Principal Rules is hereby amended by the insertion of the words "or delivering or causing to be delivered any milk" after the words "any person offering milk for sale."

GOVERNMENT NOTICE No. 390]

THE EAST AFRICA TOWNSHIPS ORDINANCE, 1903.

RULES.

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon him by the East Africa Townships Ordinance, 1903, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

1. These rules shall apply to the township of Nairobi and may be cited as "Nairobi Township (uncontrolled oxen) Rules, 1917"

2. These rules shall be read together with the Nairobi Township Rules of 1917.

3. If any vehicle be driven within the township accompanied by an ox not attached to such vehicle such ox shall be in charge of a person other than the person or persons in charge of such vehicle. The owner and driver of a vehicle driven in such circumstances as not to comply with this rule, and any person in charge of an ox as aforesaid who shall fail to keep it under proper control or to lead it in accordance with the rule of the road shall each severally be guilty of an offence.

4. Offences against Rule 3 hereof shall be cognisable by the Police.

THE DISEASES OF ANIMALS ORDINANCE, 1906.**RULES.**

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Governor by the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906, His Excellency the Acting Governor has been pleased to make the following Rules:—

- Short title. 1. These Rules may be cited as "The Diseases of Animals (Movement of Cattle from Suk and Turkhana) Rules, 1917."
- Movement of cattle prohibited from the Suk and Turkhana Districts. 2. No person shall, without the permission of the Chief Veterinary Officer, move any cattle from the Suk or Turkhana Districts into any other District and no Permit Issuer shall issue any permit for the movement of cattle from the Suk or Turkhana Districts into any other District.
- Interpretation 3. For the purposes of these Rules the term "cattle" shall have the like meaning as in the Diseases of Animals Ordinance, 1906.

UNDER MARTIAL LAW.

NOTICE.

Livestock Branch.—Dept. of Agriculture.

No Sales or purchases of cattle, sheep or goats are permitted save through or under permits from the Officer-in-Charge, Livestock Branch, Department of Agriculture, his representatives, or Officers of the Administration.

Such permits shall only be issued after due consideration of the military requirements.

All sheep or goats from Masailand or the Northern Frontier District shall be presented for inspection at the Government Livestock Depot, Naivasha.

All sheep or goats from Kamasia and Baringo shall be presented for inspection at the Government Livestock Depot, Nakuru.

After inspection all sheep or goats rejected as unsuitable for military requirements will be branded on the face with a circle brand and permission will be granted for their sale.

No livestock shall leave Masailand *via* the Ngong port of exit unless under special permit granted by the Officer-in-charge, Livestock Branch, Department of Agriculture or his representative.

Offences against this notice will be dealt with under Martial Law.

NOTICE OF AUCTION OF OFFENSIVE FACTORY SITES.

SUBJECT to the provisions of the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, the Crown Leases of a number of the above sites will be offered for sale under the following conditions:—

The number of plots which will be put up to auction will be regulated by the applications received under Condition No. 1 of the Conditions of Sale, and the number of plots when ascertained together with the place and date of the sale will be the subject of a subsequent notice.

The term of the lease shall be 99 years and the plots are offered for sale for the purpose of accommodating the industries named in the Schedule hereto or any other industry which in the opinion of Government may be termed offensive.

The right to withdraw any plot is reserved to Government.

AUCTION SALE OF OFFENSIVE FACTORY SITES, NAIROBI.**CONDITIONS OF SALE.**

1. Any person who wishes to purchase one or more of these plots shall give notice in writing of his intention to the Land Officer not later than December 15th, 1917. Such notice must state the number of plots the applicant is desirous of purchasing and the purpose to which it is intended to put such plots. The Land Officer will then issue a certificate stating the number of plots the applicant is entitled to purchase, and no person who is unable to produce such certificate at the auction shall be entitled to bid.

2. Only one plot at a time will be auctioned.

3. The highest bidder shall be the purchaser and, if any dispute arise as to any bidding the plot shall be put up again at the last undisputed bid. The amount of the advance shall be regulated by the auctioneer and no bidding shall be retracted.

4. A purchaser of a plot shall be entitled to acquire such additional plots as will make up the number stated on his certificate each at the same price as that paid for the plot purchased, provided that such additional plots shall adjoin the plot purchased and each other. The purchaser shall declare to the auctioneer his intention of taking up such additional plots immediately on the fall of the hammer.

5. No person shall be allowed to purchase a greater number of plots than that shewn on his certificate.

6. Each purchaser must pay to the auctioneer immediately on the fall of the hammer 25% of the purchase price of the plot or plots. In default of payment of such deposit the lease of the plot or plots may be re-offered for sale immediately and any subsequent bid made by the person who has made default may be ignored or refused.

7. The balance of the purchase money together with the rent due to the 31st December, next following, the prescribed survey fee and the fees payable for the preparation and registration of the lease and the stamp duty payable in respect of the lease shall be paid to the Land Officer at the Land Office within seven days from the date of the sale, and upon such payments being duly made the purchaser shall be subject to the provisions of this Ordinance and if the conditions of the sale have been complied with, be entitled to a lease of the plot or plots, which lease shall be presented to him for execution as soon as conveniently may be.

Provided that the balance of the purchase money shall not be payable within the time stated or thereafter unless and until the Land Officer can present to the purchaser the lease of the plot or plots duly executed.

8. The lease shall commence on the 1st day of the month next following that in which the sale is held and rent shall be payable from that date.

9. Subject to the proviso contained in section 22 (i) if the balance of the purchase money together with the rent fees and duty mentioned in the preceding section is not paid to the Land Officer within seven days from the date of the sale, the Land Officer may order that the deposit made by the purchaser be forfeited to the Government and that the purchaser shall have no further claim to a lease of the plot or plots.

10. Each purchaser shall erect upon his plot or plots, within two years of the commencement of the lease, buildings suitable to the purpose for which the same has been purchased, such buildings to be erected according to plans and specifications which must be approved in writing by the Land Officer or such other official as he may appoint for the purpose.

11. Each purchaser shall be responsible for the cost of construction of the sidings and road or roads adjoining his plot or plots, such cost to be leviable on the completion of such sidings and roads.

12. Each purchaser shall drain his plot or plots to the satisfaction of Government and shall connect such drainage with any main drainage system of the Township of Nairobi as may hereafter be constructed.

13. Each purchaser shall keep his plot or plots in a clean and sanitary condition to the satisfaction of Government.

14. No plot or plots shall without the consent of the Land Officer first obtained, be used at any time during the term of the lease for any purpose other than that for which they have been purchased.

15. No plot or plots shall at any time during the term of the lease be used as a place of residence by any person or persons whatsoever.

16. Purchasers of more than one plot in accordance with No. 4 of these conditions are hereby notified that plots so purchased will be treated in the lease as one plot which must not be subdivided without the consent of the Governor, but the rent payable in respect thereof will be the total rent of the number of plots purchased.
